Executive Summary :

Institute of Distance Education, Rajiv Gandhi University in collaboration with Department of Political Science, Rajiv Gandhi University organized a one day national online seminar on 'Changing Dynamics of Socio-Political Scenario in North East India', on 27th July, 2020. More than three hundred (300) participants applied for the registration across the country. However, only one hundred fifty (150) participants have been registered in compliance to the laid down procedure of the seminar.

The online platform started with the welcome speech from Dr. Tabang Mibang, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, RGU cum Subject Coordinator of the Programme, to all the participants attending the webinar and resource persons.

Moving forward Prof. P.K.Panigrahi, Head, Department of Political Science, RGU in his remarks, while welcoming all the participants, threw light on the major issues and challenges concerning North East India which needs to be understood before discussing about the changing dynamics. He states that the prominent scholars and resource persons will be able to address the socio- political problems concerning North East India through this webinar.

The first technical session started at 10.40 am with a lecture by Prof Rajen Singh Laishram, Department of Political Science, Manipur University. In his speech, he threw light on the strategic importance of North East India. He stressed on the strategic importance of North east India during colonial days and also in present context. He also spoke on the issues like, Citizenship Amendment Act, 2020, Refugee Issue, Ethnicity and Insurgency, problem and prospects of Socio Political changes in North East India.

The second technical session started at 11.40 am with a speech by Prof. J. DOUNGEL, Professor in Department of Political Science, Mizoram University on '**Status of the Chakmas in the North East India with special reference to the emergence of Chakma Autonomous District Council (CADC) in Mizoram**'. In his speech he portrays general lay out on the history of Sixth Schedule to the Indian Constitution, its application and relevance in North East India. Further he gives deep insight on the status Chakmas in North East India and the emergence of Chakma Autonomous District Council in Mizoram.

The third technical commence with the speech on 'Working of Panchayati Raj in North East with special reference to Arunachal Pradesh' by Professor P.K Panigrahi, Head, Department of Political Science, Rajiv Gandhi University at 12.40 pm. He gives an overview on the background of Panchayati Raj in India in general and Arunachal in Particular. His speech was focused on traditional self-governing institution and modern political processes. While citing the basic objectives of Panchayati Raj Institution, he also put forward certain suggestion to attain those objectives.

Part 2: Preface

1.1. ABOUT THE INSTITUTIONS

1.3. Background Study

The North-Eastern Region (NER) of India comprises of eight States namely, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. These states account for around 8 per cent of the total geographical area and 3.76 per cent of the total population of the country. The entire region is highly diverse in terms of topography, climatic conditions and tradition and culture of indigenous people. As the region consists of different ethnic groups, the tribal communities have achieved their heterogeneous character. As they remained in isolation for several centuries, all of them developed their separate and independent cultural identities. A traditional self-governance system, which is still prevalent among various tribal communities, has been responsible for managing day to day affairs of the Common masses.

However, with the advent of modern political arrangements like Panchayati Raj, Sixth Schedule, Elections etc., the North Eastern Region has witnessed paradigm shift in socio political and cultural life. Boundary disputes, ethnicity, insurgency, leadership pattern, status of women etc. are the new emerging issues with diverse challenges in the scheme of things in this region.

Part 2: Session wise Deliberations

2.1. Inaugural Session

The online platform started with the welcome speech from **Dr. Tabang Mibang, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, RGU cum Subject Coordinator of the Programme**, where he welcomes all the participants attending the webinar. He also welcomes to all the resource person of the technical sessions. He expresses that this webinar will give an opportunity for exchange ideas and views among the participants.

Moving forward **Prof. P.K.Panigrahi, Head, Department of Political Science, RGU** in his remarks, while welcoming all the participants, gave some insight into some of the major issues concerning North East India which needs to be understood before discussing about the changing dynamics. At first, he welcomes all the participants and gives a few descriptions about North East India. In his address, he identified the challenges faced by North East India, such as infrastructural development, transportation and telecommunication, issues of women empowerment, youth unemployment, refugee issues, and political dynamics with the emergence of various regional political parties and continuing trend of political defections in North East India. He concluded by stating that, the prominent scholars and resource persons will be able to address the problems in some manner through this webinar.

2.3. Technical Sessions

The first technical session started at **10.40 am** with a lecture by **Prof. Rajen Singh Laishram**, Department of Political Science, Manipur University on **‘Strategic Importance of India’s North East’**. At outset, he threw light on the strategic importance of North East India. How North East is looked by its neighboring countries with strategic importance. He mentioned that almost 98% to 99% of North East India’s area shares border internationally. The interest in the North East by the outsiders has been present since the colonial days. He mentioned about Burma- China – India Route in Second World War, which is an example of how North East holds strategic importance during that time as well. He also mentioned about the India-Myanmar- Thailand trilateral Highway which has to be completed in 2022, which will create lots of opportunities to North East region especially in the field of education and medical tourism. Because of lower population density in this region, it has become a living space for the migrants. He also talks about Citizenship Amendment Act, 2019. He stated about Japan taking interest in North East India for investment in various sectors. He expresses his views on India and Myanmar potential for people to people collaboration and trades. In the meantime, he also expresses his concerns about problems faced by North East region.

1. North East People are not fully equipped with the developmental processes;
2. Lack of capital;
3. Lack of infrastructural development.

The reasons for all these problems according him are the lack of trust among the decision makers and sometimes it is the fault of the system of democracy. He put a question in front of us, saying, do the mainland people trust us? To that question, he gives an example of the current Covid 19 situation in the mainland India. How people from North East has to face such racial discriminations in Mainland India.

“Insurgency today has the potential of turning into terroristic with the onset of globalization and today is the right time to intervene’ he stated while giving some glance on the insurgency issues in North East India. He believes that academicians, researchers should come together to

address the issues of insurgency in the region. 'The issue cannot be solved politically alone but has to be address in social terms also' he added.

The second technical session started at **11.40 am** with a speech by **Prof. J. Doungel**, Professor in Department of Political Science, Mizoram University on '**Status of the Chakmas in the North East India with special reference to the emergence of Chakma Autonomous District Council (CADC) in Mizoram**'. In his speech he portrays general lay out on the history of Sixth Schedule to the Indian Constitution, its application and relevance in North East India. Further he gives deep insight on the status Chakmas in North East India and the emergence of Chakma Autonomous District Council in Mizoram.

The third technical commence with the speech on '**Working of Panchayati Raj in North East with special reference to Arunachal Pradesh**' by **Professor P.K Panigrahi**, Head, Department of Political Science, Rajiv Gandhi University at **12.40 pm**. He discusses about the background of Panchayati Raj in India in general and Arunachal in Particular. He expounds local self-government in light of **Kautilya's Arthasastra**, and talks about the importance of decentralization in India. He also talks about the presence indigenous self-governing institution of Arunachal Pradesh since time immemorial with different types and practices. He focused on the gradual erosion of power and functions of village councils with the emergence of Panchayati Raj Institution. He concluded by citing the main objective of the Panchayati Raj system i.e. devolution of power to provide opportunities at the grassroots levels and put forwarded certain suggestion to attain the basic objectives.

1. Elections of the Panchayats need to be conducted in regular intervals;
2. Complete devolution of power
3. Financial autonomy
4. Trained manpower
5. Active participation of elected members
6. Regular social audit for better implementation of projects.
