Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences, Dean, Faculty of Basic Sciences, Dean, Faculty of Life Sciences, and Dean Faculty of Physical Education could not attend the meeting due to their prior engagements.

The Chairman welcomed all members and briefed them on the meeting's agenda. After a comprehensive discussion, the committee members unanimously resolved the following with regard to each of the following Six (06) agenda issues:

Resolution(s)

Common Passing Percentage for Courses in UG and PG Programmes of Rajiv Gandhi University:

1.1 It was unanimously resolved after listening opinions from every member that common pass percentage will be 35% in all the courses of both UG and PG Programmes, essentially excluding courses/programmes governed by specific regulatory agencies viz. ICAR, Bar Council, Medical Council of India, AICTE etc.

1.2 The above schema, it was resolved unanimously that will be applicable from current academic session i.e. 2024-25 for the PG programme.

1.3 It was also resolved that Letter Grades and Grade Points Table as reflected in current marksheet need revision especially in terms of removing % of marks in the stated table.

II

Criteria for Promotion to Next Semester in UG and PG Level:

2.1 It was resolved that a candidate will be promoted to next semester provided:

2.1.1 (s)he passes at least 50% of the Major and Minor Papers taken together,

AND

2.1.2 Earned a minimum of 45% of the total credits required for the semester.

2.2: Absence or Failure in Practical Component

2.2.1. An eligible student absent from the examination of a specific course (paper) shall be deemed to have failed that course (paper).

2.2.2. A student who fails the practical component of a course (paper) is deemed to have failed the entire course (paper) and is required to reappear for both the practical and theory components in the subsequent examination.

2.2.3. However, such students shall be eligible for promotion to the next semester, subject to the fulfillment of all other requirements specified in clause (2.1).

III

Lateral Entry for 2nd, 3rd and 4th Year of UG Programmes:

3.1 The number of available seats for lateral entry to be determined dynamically based on the following factors:

3.1.1 The initial intake capacity of the batch, as defined during admission to the first semester,

3.1.2 The number of students promoted from the previous semester,

3.1.3 The number of year-loss students who have expressed their willingness to continue by submitting a formal request.

3.2 If the batch size is not full, an advertisement for lateral entry will be issued to invite applications for admission to fill the vacant seats.

IV

Eligibility Criteria for Lateral Entry to 2nd, 3rd and 4th Year of UG Programmes:

4.1 Application and Shortlisting:

4.1.1 Students applying for admissions to 3rd and 5th Semesters will be shortlisted based on their cumulative CGPA till the previous semester (i.e. 2nd and 4th Semesters, as applicable).

4.1.2 Common Entrance Test will be conducted for **all** the students willing to take lateral entry in 4th Year (7th Semester) of Four Year UG Programme.

4.2 Eligibility Criteria:

4.2.1 Students must have passed all papers to be eligible to apply for admission.

4.2.2 Requirement of UG Certificate, Diploma and Degree Certificates, as applicable for students from other universities than RGU.

4.2.3 For students coming from other institutions than RGU or its affiliated colleges, concurrence of Curriculum, Credit Framework, and Course Contents of UG Certificate, Diploma and Degree (as applicable) be decided by an **Equivalence Committee** set up at university level for different programmes.

4.2.4 It will also be mandatory that credits of all claimed courses including mandatory internship (before every exit) be reflected in respective ABC/ APAAR ID of the respective applicant.

V

Admission to 2nd Year of PG Programmes:

5.1 Entrance for 100% seats for PG II Year be conducted for all the programmes.

5.2 Eligible students who have completed 4-year UG or 1st Year of PG with no back paper (both RGU and other institutions) must apply and participate in a Common Entrance Test as decided by University.

VI

Choice of Multi-Disciplinary Course in affiliated colleges:

6.1 It was highlighted by one of the members that criterion for Multi-Disciplinary Course for UG Programmes under NEP-2020 being a learner having not studied a course during Class XII level, in few affiliated colleges 'Education' is being offered as Multi-Disciplinary Course. It is resulting in Education being deprived as a Major Course.

6.2 It was resolved that all affiliated colleges by communicated by university to not easy pick one or the other course as Multi-Disciplinary or Value Added, in the greater and long-term interest of the discipline and the learners. It is also in true spirit of NEP-2020 that learners should be offered a variety of courses under each category for their holistic development as envisaged in NEP-2020.
