

NSS Unit of RGU Celebrated World Environment Day

The RGU NSS Unit marked the World Environment Day by organizing a Vanmahotsava with the plantation of altogether 376 saplings in the campus. Prof.Amitav Mitra Finance Officer, Shri.Gomar Basar NSS programme officer, Prof.H.N Sarma Coordinator, Centre with Potential for Excellence in Biodiversity also participated in the programme along with NSS volunteers and Research Scholars.

The tree plantation programme was followed by a special lecture delivered by Prof.H.N.Sarma on the topic; Environment, Climate & Biodiversity of Eastern Himalaya: Arunachal Pradesh. The lecture was primarily focused on the rich biodiversity of Arunachal Pradesh and its varying climatic zones and consequent variation in its fauna and flora.
