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## Part - 1 : The Organization



### **1.1. The University**

Rajiv Gandhi University (formerly Arunachal University) is the premier institution for higher education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh and has completed over twenty five years of its existence. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation stone of the university on 4<sup>th</sup> February 1984 at Rono Hills, where the present campus is located. Ever since its inception, the university has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfill the objectives as envisaged in the University Act. Rajiv Gandhi University (then Arunachal University) has carved a niche for itself in the educational scenario of the country following its selection as a University with potential for excellence by a high level expert committee of University Grants Commission from among universities in India. The University was converted into a Central University with effect from 9<sup>th</sup> April 2007 as per notification of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The University is located atop Rono Hills on a picturesque tableland of 302 acres overlooking the river Dikrong. It is 25 km away from Itanagar, the State capital. The teaching and research programmes of the University are designed with a view to play a positive role in the socio-economic and cultural development of the State. The University offers Under Graduate, Post-Graduate, M. Phil and Ph.D. programmes. The University has been extending educational facilities to the students from the neighbouring states located across the region. The faculty members have been actively engaged in research activities with financial support from UGC and other funding agencies. Since inception, a number of proposals on research projects have been sanctioned by various funding agencies to the University. The Departments have organized many Seminars, Workshops and Conferences. Many faculty members have participated in national and international conferences and seminars held within the country and



abroad. Eminent scholars and distinguished personalities have visited the University and delivered lectures on various disciplines. VSAT facility installed by the ERNET India, New Delhi under UGC-Infonet program, provides internet access to the university. In spite of infrastructural constraints, the University has been maintaining its academic excellence. The University has strictly adhered to the academic calendar, conducted the examinations and declared the results in time. The students from the University have found placements not only in State and Central Government Services, but also in various institutions, industries and organizations. Many students come out successful in the National Eligibility Test (NET) each year. In all these years, the University has made significant progress in teaching, research, innovations in curriculum development and developing infrastructure.

### **1.2. Career Counselling Cell**

The Career Counseling Cell (CCC) started on 21<sup>st</sup> August 2012 with an objective to set up an educational counseling services offered for the post-graduate students of Rajiv Gandhi University with the aim to help the students redefine their passion in their career, develop essential employability skills and strategies and to understand different competitive examination related to job opportunities in current market scenario. Career Counseling Cell has organized 9 Skill-based training programme under the expert professionals and resource persons invited from the state as well as national level. In the last 7 years the Cell has emerged as a prominent service provider in Vocational training and Skill development sector more than 6000 students have been benefitted from the programme and placement of more than 2000 students in various Private and Government sectors of Arunachal Pradesh. Keeping in view the aspirations of students and parents of Arunachal Pradesh, the University has taken a strong



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initiative for organizing various programmes time to time in the university and as a result of which university does ensure high quality education with better job avenues for the better products of our university students after completion of their formal degrees.

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The CCC is continuously striving in pursuit of excellence by enhancing the capacity of young minds through trainings for improving their employability. Engaging experts from different areas CCC is trying to fulfill the dreams of youth for the better future. With this vision, CCC has progressed a lot in a short span of time and emerged as a prominent cell of the University. 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**2.8 Workshop Training on Aptitude, Soft Skills and Career Counselling was organized by CCC from 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2018**

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Three (3) Day Workshop Training on Aptitude, Soft Skills and Career Counselling Under Career Counselling Cell, RGU was organized in Collaboration with Career Launcher, New Delhi in the department of Education from 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> May, 2018. Prof. Tomo Riba, Registrar, RGU was the Chief Patron of the Programme. Mr. Karthik Raja from Tamil Nadu was the Resource Person for the programme. Dr. Boa Reena Tok was the Programme Coordinator. The Main objective of the workshop was to train the Post-graduate students of Rajiv Gandhi University to face various competitive examinations, confident building in interviews in various companies and government sectors. There were 10 skill based practical sessions. Around 50 participants (Annexure 2.1) from various departments attended such important programme. Modules handouts materials were based on Soft Skills quantitative Aptitude and Reasoning Ability for campus recruitment such as (a) Reading comprehensive and critical reasoning, (c) Grammar and Vocabulary building, and (d) Data arrangements and logical reasoning.



## **2.9 Employability Skills and Career Counseling**

A Two-Day Workshop 29-30 April, 2019 on Employability Skills and Career Counselling organized by Career Counselling Cell (RGU) in collaboration with Career Launcher, New Delhi began today in the department of Education at RGU. The Programme was graced by Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice Chancellor, R.G.U. as the Chief Patron of the Programme, Prof. Tomo Riba, Registrar, R.G.U., Professor Kesang Degi, Dean, DSW, RGU, Amit Dhar as the Resource Person, Career Launcher, New Delhi, Rahul Kumar Basak, Career Launcher, New Delhi, Prof. Tasi Kaye, In charge, Placement Cell, RGU., Dr. Boa Reena Tok, Coordinator,



Career Counselling Cell, RGU, Faculty members, Research Scholars and Students of the University.

The session began with a welcome speech delivered by Dr. Boa Reena Tok, Coordinator of



the Career Counseling Cell, RGU. She highlighted the objectives and significance of the Workshop. Prof. Tasi Kaye has reflected the importance of the Programme in his speech and stated that, "The programme would mould the minds of the youths towards proper selection of career." Prof. Tomo Riba, Registrar thanked the Vice Chancellor of the University for keeping space for such programmes and displayed gratitude to the organizing team. He added in his speech that "Getting a Job is an art which requires Skills and Training" and therefore it is important to attend such programmes. Besides, he remarked that, "Success is the indicator of Hard work and thereby, perfect perception of the work is

required along with hard work.”

The Chief Patron of the Programme, Prof. Kushwaha has highlighted the techniques of



achieving a particular career. He stated that, “Commoners will never get a job; one has to put the self above minimum.” He thereby suggested the participants to add degrees of different fields to their educational qualification chart. One who seeks for job has to have a strategic plan for the particular job, knowledge about the job, vibrant the self and change the work ethics and attitude for the best. He finally ended the address with a poem line by Maithili Sharan Gupta which says, “Nar ho na Nirash karo man ko kuch kaam karo kuch kaam karo.” The inaugural session of the programme was closed with a vote of thanks offered by Dr. Siva Shankar, Assist. Prof, Dept. of Education, RGU.

Main objective of the workshop was to help students redefine their passion for their career; to develop essential employability skills and strategies; and to understand different examination related job opportunities in current market scenario. There were total 7 skill based practical sessions. More than one hundred fifty (150) participants participated

(Annexure 2.2) in the programme from different departments. Modules handouts were also provided to the participants.

### **3.0 Career Opportunities as Geologists**

A one day workshop on Career Opportunities as Geologist was held in the Department of Geology, Rajiv Gandhi University on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2019. The workshop was aimed to the under graduate students of geology to encourage them to choose a career in Geology. The workshop was attended by twenty four under graduate students of the department. Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice-Chancellor of Rajiv Gandhi University attended the programme as Chief Guest. Resource persons for the workshop were from Geological Survey of India, the premiere geosciences organisation of India. Dr. P. K. Singh, Director, Geological Survey of



India, Arunachal Pradesh State Unit delivered a lecture on the topic „Geologist: Career, Role and Responsibilities“. In his lecture Dr. Singh discussed in detail about the scope of the subject in Mineral and oil exploration, Environmental protection, Resource management,



Disaster management etc. In his lecture he highlighted the opportunities of geology in academic and research institutes; oil exploration companies such as ONGC, GAIL, Petronet LNG, Oil India Limited, Reliance Petroleum, Schlumberger etc.; Coal India Limited; mineral exploration companies such as National Mineral Development Corporation, Hindustan Zinc Limited, Vedanta, Hindalco, NALCO, Hindustan Copper, Bharat Aluminium Company etc. He also discussed about the opportunities in Govt. of India where major recruiters are Geological Survey of India (GSI), Central Ground Water Board (CGWB), Mineral Exploration Co. Ltd. (MECL), Atomic Mineral Division (AMD) besides Directorate of Geology and Mining in all state governments. He discussed in detail about different posts and entry level positions in GSI, recruitment procedure, packages for geologists and role of Geological survey of India. Dr. Singh suggested the participants to complete at least a master's degree in geology since the basic requirement for most of the entry level positions for geologists is master's degree in geology. He also showed a few photographs of field and laboratory facilities available with GSI which the participants liked a lot. Mr Hiruj Saikia, Sr. Geologist, Geological Survey of India, Arunachal Pradesh State Unit delivered a technical lecture on „Geology of Arunachal Pradesh“. In his talk he discussed about the tectono-geologic domain of north-east India and the geological domains of Arunachal Pradesh. He also discussed about evolution of Himalaya, more specifically the eastern Himalayan and Indo-Myanmar mobile belt. Both the lectures were followed by interaction session. The resource persons explained elaborately about various queries of the students up to their satisfaction.

RONO HILLS, Apr 29: A two-day workshop on 'Employability skills and career counselling', organized by the career counselling cell of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) in collaboration with New Delhi-based Career Launcher, began on Monday in the university's education department here.
