RGU Vice Chancellor Prof Saket Kushwaha informed that the university would be completing the green audit of the campus within a year. He said waste management in the university would be "innovatively taken up," with focus on minimizing the use of plastics. In order to minimize the use of disposable mineral water bottles, several drinking water facilities are being set up in the university. The HCC is an annual

event held in May, in conjunction to the theme 'Our mountains deserve better', with the objective of focusing attention on the problem of waste in the mountains, specifically single-use plastic waste.
