1. Introduction -

Portable bamboo dustbins were installed by first and third semester students of Social Work from where the wastes can be easily removed and disposed in the main dumping zone of the University campus.




REUSE OF WASTE MATERIALS (PLASTIC BOTTLES AND OLD TYRES)

4. Major Outcome
