M.PHIL COURSE STRUCTURE

The M.Phil Programme of the Department of Political Science will have two components.

- Course work of one semester along with a dissertation to be completed in the three semesters as per Universities rules and regulations.
- The course work will have four papers two of which
 - 1) Research Methodology
 - 2) Issues and processes in politics of North East India will be compulsory for all students. The Third & Fourth paper will be chosen from the optional papers offered by the department from time to time.

- 5. Presentation of the Report Content, Format, Rules for footnotes, Tables, Abstract land bibliography preparation.
