GUIDELINES RELATING TO MASTER OF ARTS, MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY, DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY AND DOCTOR OF LITERATURE PROGRAMMES OF WRITING REPORT, DISSERTATION AND THESIS UNDER THE FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES, RAJIV GANDHI UNIVERSITY, RONO HILLS, ARUNACHAL PRADESH.

This Guidelines may be called the Guidelines(Stylesheet) **The Preamble.**
Relating to Master of Arts, Master of Philosophy, Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Literature Programme to disseminate and incorporate the rules of standard to provide, plan, organise and prepare the matters connected therewith report, dissertation and thesis pertaining to research works under the Faculty of Social Sciences, Rajiv, Gandhi University, Rono Hills, Arunachal Pradesh. Be it enacted by the Statutory Bodies of the Rajiv Gandhi University as follows:

1. The writing of report, dissertation and thesis shall be presented in number of chapters. The first chapter shall start with 'introduction' which shall end with the last chapter 'summary and conclusion' of the research work. Each chapter shall have a specific title reflecting the content of the chapter of the dissertation and thesis. A chapter may be divided into heading, subheading and sub-subheading so as to discuss the critical issue involved in writing the research work and findings. **Organising the Report, Dissertation and Thesis.**
- (1) **All dissertation and thesis**, the title of chapter I shall start with; introduction, statement of problems, objectives of the study, Area of the study or/ universe of the study, review of literature, research methodology, hypothesis(if any), outline of chapterization plan and bibliography shall be clearly stated.
- (2) **In the body of the report, dissertation and thesis**, the introduction chapter shall be followed by one or more theoretical chapters with appropriate titles. This is the substance of the research work inclusive of all heading, subheading, table, figure, etcetera. The analytical framework and interpretation analysis may be included herein:
- (i) In this section of the dissertation and thesis, the research questions shall be outlined and justify clearly with grounded theoretical framework. The critical interpretation and finding of research work shall be maintained herein section; and
- (ii) Figure and table shall be written immediately following their first mentioned in the dissertation and thesis.
- (3) **Summary and conclusion** shall be the last chapter of the report, dissertation and thesis of the research work. The chapter shall be consist of brief explanation of the research work that has been carried out and the main finding shall be briefly summarised. Conclusion derived from the critical interpretation and analysis of the foregoing chapters shall be written clearly. Herein also highlight the contribution of the research work to the existing available literature with the sound methodological or substantive

limitation. Scope for future research on the concerned dissertation and thesis shall be mentioned herewith in the conclusion chapter.

- (4) **Bibliography Reference** style shall be consistent throughout the report, dissertation and thesis writing. The list of bibliography or reference shall distinctly appear as the consolidated list in universal author alphabetically order. If any work is consulted but not specifically cited in the report, dissertation and thesis such works shall be listed as bibliography or reference. Spacing and font size shall be consistent as written inside a single reference and there shall be double spacing between the two different work.

Layout of the Dissertation and Thesis.

2. Writing dissertation and thesis is a serious academic exercise to document and to present it in a formal format. Layout of the dissertation and thesis with page layout and formatting shall be:

- (1) In the matter of typesetting, text processing and printing, the LaserJet or Inkjet printer shall be used for printing the text after due processing of editing and vetting by using standard text processor. The quality of text paper shall be of A4 executive bond paper of 90 or 100 gsm thickness. The black colour ink shall be used for printing the text otherwise the certain picture, photograph or figure(chart) may be printed in colour of A4 size glossy or mat paper.
- (i) The font size for the main text of the dissertation and thesis shall be '12' points and Times New Roman or/Times or/ Book Antiqua font style shall be used for text writing. The caption shall be bold and non-English words shall be italicised; and
- (ii) In terms of spacing the text of the dissertation and thesis shall be 1.5 line spaced while the quotation of more than one line shall be single spacing. Footnote, endnote, caption, bibliography and reference shall be single line spacing in the text.
- (2) Page layout of the dissertation and thesis pages shall have the following margin style:
- (i) Top margin : 1.8cm;
- (ii) Bottom margin : 2.2cm;
- (iii) Left margin : 3.2cm; and
- (iv) Right margin : 3.2cm

The spacing around the edge of the typical page is to ensure the adequate as determined by the default page margins on the computer. The text shall be **printed in both side of the paper.**


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- (3) The dissertation and thesis preliminary page shall be numbered using lower case Roman numerals(example; i,ii,iii...). The text of the dissertation and thesis introduction chapter onwards shall be numbered using Arabic numerals(Example; 1,2,3...). The page number on first page of the chapters shall not appear in print. For example , page number '1' for the first page of the introduction chapter shall not appear while the second page shall bear the '2' and shall appear in print. Care shall be taken to keep required blank page and all new chapters shall begin on a new page in the dissertation and thesis.

**Chapter Heading 3.
and Subheading.**

The chapter shall always begin on a new page with number and title shall appear on the top of the page in centre justified style. The chapter number shall be in Arabic numeral and shall be bold size in '14' points font depending upon the get up format. The chapter title shall be in bold and in '16' points font size depending upon justified spacing.

- (1) Each chapter of the dissertation and thesis shall have the heading and subheading so as to present different concept or arguments separately. The heading shall be numbered using decimal point for example; 1:2, for chapter 1 heading 2. All subheadings shall be numbered in 1:2:1 for chapter 1 heading 2 and subheading 1. The heading and subheading shall be in bold and shall be reflected in the contents while subheading need to be included in the contents.

- (2) Names of individual and organisation shall be fully identified by first and last names when they are first mentioned in the dissertation and thesis. Names of authors mentioned in the dissertation and thesis shall usually correspond exactly to their names as given in footnote. The use of title such as Prof., Dr., Gen., Col., Rev., Mrs., Mr., and Miss is discouraged.

Abbreviations (such as AIOHA, CPWD, NGO) shall not be used to identify organizations until the organizational name has first been provided in full and the acronym indicated, for example; All India Oral History Association(AIOHA) and Anthropological Survey of India(ASI). List of abbreviations used shall be reflected after the content(after the list of map, table and figure).

- (3) Heading shall limit the level of heading within a chapter not exceeding three or four heading. Lengthy headings shall be avoided.

**Use of quotation 4.
Mark.**

Quotation shall correspond exactly with the original in wording, spelling, interior capitalization, and interior punctuation. Use single quotation mark, reserving double quotation mark for quoted words within a quotation. Spelling of words in quotation shall not be changed. No quotation mark are required for longer passages (that is exceeding more than 20 words or more); these must be indented and separated from the text. *Sic* is used to indicate errors or idiosyncrasies present in the original source.

Distinction shall be maintained between 3-point and 4-point ellipses. Indicate omissions within a quoted sentence by three spaced periods. When the omitted passage includes the end of a sentence, indicate the ellipsis by four period with no space before

the first. Ellipsis points are seldom necessary at the beginning or end of a quoted passage, since the reader usually assumes that something precedes and follows any quotation.

Interpolations of the scholar's own comments or explanations into quoted matter shall be enclosed in square bracket, not parentheses. Such interpolations shall be kept to a minimum.

5. Table, figure and map in the dissertation and thesis shall be presented in the portrait style as far as possible; and shall be identified by both a number and a descriptive title. Table and figure shall be numbered chapter wise in the dissertation and thesis. For instance; table 1 of chapter 3 shall bear the number table:3:1; while table, figure and map number shall appear above the table and figure.

Table, Figure and Map Format.

Each table, figure and map shall have the clear indication of source and scholar shall insert the table in the text in an appropriate order. Figure (illustration) shall be numbered separately from table and they shall be identified by descriptive caption (including the date). The source for each figure shall be given appropriately in the dissertation and thesis. For example; if the source is empirical field study data carried out by a researcher, the source is to be disclosed: the informant name, place, date, time and year of interview. There shall be a list of table, figure and map with page number after the list of contents of the report, dissertation and thesis. Whereas, map shall cite the original source or if redrawn shall be shown as 'Based on[source].'

6. *Ibid.*, refers to the item preceding and takes the place of as much of the succeeding material as identical. If more than one work is cited in a note, *ibid.*, shall not be used for the first citation of the following note:

Use of Scholarly Abbreviations.

Op.cit., *loc.cit.*, *idem*, and 'hereafter cited as' may not be used. Instead, for second references to books and articles, use the author's last name, the short title, and pages. Specific page shall be cited whenever possible; otherwise the whole book or article shall be cited.

Et al., is used if a book or an article has more than three authors. Note that it is not italicized or underlined and that 'et' is not an abbreviation and second reference shall also include et al.

Footnote and Endnote.

7. Footnote and endnote shall be consecutively numbered in the report, dissertation and thesis works invariably. Footnote shall be presented at the foot of each page while endnote shall be presented at the end of the chapter. In a sentence of the text only one note shall be preferred.

Use of Language and Spelling.

8. The British spellings shall be followed rather than American spelling (example, 'programme' not 'program' 'honour' not 'honor'). Where alternative forms exist, there is freedom to choose either 'is' or 'iz' spellings (for example, organise or organize, recognise or recognize, civilise or civilize). However, please look out for exceptions such as comprise, supervise and incise, where the 's' is not an ending but part of the root. Whichever form is chosen shall be retained throughout the draft consistently while researcher are not allowed to alternate between the two forms.

Use of excessive italicization for emphasis shall be avoided but use them for the title of a book and foreign words, unless terms occur so frequently that they are better in upright(Roman) type. Proper noun in a foreign language shall always be in Roman. We shall also prefer to set common terms such as 'status quo', 'ex post facto', in Roman; *Ibid.*, shall be in italics.

- (1) There shall be no alternation to hyphenation of words, for example; between 'macroeconomic' and 'macro-economic', 'decision making' and 'decision-making', in writing the report, dissertation and thesis.
- (2) Number shall be written in figure (rather than words) for exact measurement and series of quantities, including percentage. In more general description, number below 100 shall be spelt out in words. In text use 'per cent', in table the symbol '%'. Write '0.6' rather than '.6', except for level of probability. Use lower-case italics for *p* (probability) and *n* (number). Use fuller form for number and date for example; 1690-95, and pp.66-68.
- (3) Date shall be given specific in the form March 21, 2017. Decade shall be referred to as either 'the nineties' or 'the 1990s' and shall spell out the 'twentieth century'.

While writing a report, dissertation and thesis it is very important to select or use appropriate terminology which treats all genders equally, and does not make assumptions about one gender as opposed to the other. The scholar shall avoid any terminology which does unfairly distinguish the gender and encourage stereotype.

Bibliography and Reference. 9.

All the sources referred to in the report, dissertation and thesis shall be cited distinctly. Further for the bibliography and reference heading shall be presented after the summary and conclusion chapter of the dissertation and thesis. All the manuscript of the dissertation and thesis shall be cited as follows:

- (1) Name of author, full title, name of collection, name of library or/archive, press mark, folio number(s), for instance; Herodotus, *Histories*, National Library Kolkata, MS Or.12, f.60a (or ff.60a-62b). Whereas, researchers' specialization in modern Indian history shall put the title of the manuscript in single inverted commas and not italicize it;
- (2) Citation of edited sources shall bear the name of author, full title, number of volume, name of editor, name of series(if any), place of publication, year of publication, page number; e.g.,

March Bloch, *The Annales Histories*, 2 Vols., ed. Lucien Febvre, Penguin, London, 1990, p.77(if more than one editor put, eds.)

If a work does not have a single author, the citation shall begin with the title. e.g., An Administrative Report of the Provincial Government in North East India (1826-1851), 12 Vols. (each volume titled by the year it covers), ed. Edward Gait, Oxford University Press, London, 1935-46.

- (3) Citation of translated source shall bear the name of author, full title, number of volume, name of translator, name of editor(if any), name of series(if any), place of publication, year of publication, e.g.,

Leopold Ranke, *The Theory and Practices of History*, 2 Vols., tr. David Tait, 2nd ed. Berlin, 1940.

If the source is edited and translated by the same person it shall be cited as follows:

Ramaswamy, *Vamsanucharita*, ed. and tr. A.S. Altaker, Allahabad, 2002.

- (4) Citation to book source in the dissertation and thesis shall bear the name of author or editor as it appears on the title page (except in bibliography where the surname of the author comes first) as under:

- (i) Full title and subtitle exactly as they appear on the title page;
- (ii) Total number of volume for any multivolume work;
- (iii) Place of publication;
- (iv) Year of publication; and
- (v) Edition (if any).
Name of books shall be italicized.

- (5) Citation to article in the dissertation and thesis shall maintain the following format:

- (i) Name of author as it appears on the first page of the article;
- (ii) The full title and subtitle as they appear on the first page of the article;
- (iii) Full publishing information for the journal or book in which the article appears; and
- (iv) Title of the article shall be put in single quotation marks and the source (book, journal, newspaper in which the article appears) in italics, for example:

Reinhold Niebuhr, 'The Moral Man and Immoral Society', *The Journal of Interdisciplinary History*, Vol.12, No.2. 1980, The MIT Press, pp.227-252.

- (6) Citation to newspaper article in the dissertation and thesis shall be:

'The New India Revolution', *The Times of India*, March 20, 2017, Vol., XIX, P.5.

- (7) Citation to government documents in the dissertation and thesis shall be:

- (i) When an Order by a Government Official:

Governor General in Council, dated the December 6, 1912, the Government of India, Calcutta, Political Department, Part-II, File No. or Vol. No. National Archives of India, New Delhi;

(ii) When Citing Correspondence:

Captain Thomas Welsh Commanding Officer in Expedition 1792, Foreign and Political Department, External B, November 6, 1792, File No. 16, National Archives of India(hereinafter, NAI); and

(iii) When Citing Case Law:

Robbhu Pacha v. Nyikum Nyiya (1994) corresponding to I.L.R.40 Assam. 221 Nyima Nyiya v. Nyima Thama (1997) I.L.R.44 Assam. 551 at p.442.

(8) Citation to private paper/or collected work in the dissertation and thesis shall be:

David Scott Writing and Speeches, Vol.2(2002) compiled by Verrier Elwin.

(9) Citation to online electronic sources in the dissertation and thesis shall be:

(i) Citation of online electronic sources of books or/ e-books, journal articles, periodicals and other sources published online shall include, name of author or editor, the title of the article with single quotation marks, and name of journal with volume number, total page number as shown in the text, year of publication, the name of publishers, website (stable URL), the date when the source was accessed shall be included in parentheses. For example, in case of online articles, periodical, etc.:

V. Gordon Childe, 'The Urban Revolution of Ancient World', *The Town Planning Review* Vol.21. No.1, pp.3-17, 1950, Liverpool University Press, Stable URL:<http://www.jstor.org/stable/40102108>, (25/09/2012 05:54), p.12.

(ii) In Case of Books or/ E-Book:

Louis O. Mink, *Historical Understanding*, Cornell University Press, Ithaca and London, 1987, Stable URL:<http://www.e-books.com>, (21/03/2017 09:10), p.33.

Oral Traditions Testimonies and Interview Sources. 10.

The presentation of interview data by ethnomethodological research translation is distinctly different from normal quotation font size and single spacing. For the transcription, the smaller font size shall be used rather than the same font size of the text of the report, dissertation and thesis; and shall not be italicised. For example:

When I was a minor boy I heard about the legends of Tei Bidha who said to have lived somewhere in early medieval period in Arunachal Pradesh. He was an orphan and lived in abject poverty which made him to live in obscure social life in the village-city state.

(1) The scholar shall use the standard **Consent Form** or/ **Prior Informed Consent** to obtain the information from the informants or/ respondents while doing field work on oral traditions. Along with Consent Form, the scholar shall also use **Biographical Information Form** for oral traditions

data. If, however, the respondents or/ informants refuse to give name for the details information then the anonymous(fictional) name shall be used with date and place.

- (2) Use of oral traditions informant or/ respondent in footnote and the case of repeat citation in the report, dissertation and thesis shall be:

Aabhu Thanyi, aged about 60 years is a permanent resident of Rono Village under Doimukh Administrative Circle, Papum Pare District, Arunachal Pradesh, held scheduled interview on January 20,2017 at 10:00am.

If repeat citation, then a scholar shall develop scholarly abbreviation. For example:

Aabhu Thanyi, aged about 60 years is a permanent resident of Rono Village under Doimukh Administrative Circle, Papum Pare District, Arunachal Pradesh, held scheduled interview on January 20,2017 at 10:00am (**hereinafter cited or referred to as ATI**)(*Aabhu Thanyi Interview*).

11. The first footnote are always full of the surname of the author with complete publication details written last whereas in bibliography or reference the surname of the author is written first in the text of the report, dissertation and thesis: **Repeat Citation.**

12. The copy of sample dissertation and thesis pre-submission presentation shall be in soft boundwhile the final Ph.D., thesis, D.Litt., thesis, M.Phil., and M.A., dissertation shall be in hard bound. In case of M.A., field study report shall be spiral bound or soft bound as decided by the respective Department, Centre and Institute. The following shall be themandatory cover colour of the dissertation and thesis: **Colour and Binding Format of Dissertation and Thesis.**

- (i) **Sky Blue** colour for the Master of Arts (M.A.) dissertation;
- (ii) **Dark Black** colour for the Master of Philosophy(M.Phil.) dissertation;
- (iii) **Dark Brown** colour for the Doctor of Philosophy(Ph.D.); and
- (iv) **Light Green** colour for the Doctor of Literature(D.Litt.).

Cover Page of Dissertation and Thesis.

13. The front cover page of the dissertation and thesis shall mandatorily maintain the following sequence order of get up and as shown at **Appendix 1:**

- (i) Full title of the dissertation and thesis shall be in the justified centre in the top;
- (ii) After the title of the dissertation and thesis shall be the submission statement with these lines:

A Dissertation or/ Thesis submitted in partial fulfilment of the requirements for the award of the Degree of Master of Arts, or/ Master of Philosophy or/ Doctor of Philosophy or/ Doctor of Literature in History or/ Political Science under Faculty of Social Sciences, Rajiv Gandhi University.

- (iii) The statement of submission shall be followed by full

- name of the candidate centred at the middle of the page;
- (iv) A4cm replica of the Rajiv Gandhi University logo (insignia) shall be placed; and
- (v) Name of the Department/or Institute/or Centre with the name of the University and the year of submission shall be placed in the centre at bottom of the cover page.
- (vi) The degree, name of the candidate and the year of submission shall also be **embossed on the bound side** of the dissertation and thesis;
- (vii) In the dissertation and thesis a blank page shall be put at the beginning and the end;
- Title Page of Dissertation and Thesis.** 14. The title page shall be the first printed page of the dissertation and thesis, which shall be similar to the front cover page as shown at **Appendix 2**.
15. To establish the academic authenticity and credibility of the research work, the dissertation and thesis shall bear the signed certificate of the Supervisor, Co-Supervisor (if any) and Head or/Director of the Department or/ Institute as mandatory format as shown at **Appendix 3**. **Certificate of Supervisor, Head and Director of Department and Institute.**
16. The plagiarism certificate shall be mandatory for the report, dissertation and thesis which shall mention the name of the software used, document upload number with date URL bearing and percentage of plagiarism. The certificate shall be signed jointly by the Head or/Director of the Department or/ Institute and also the Supervisor and Co-Supervisor (if any) as shown at **Appendix 4**; and shall include with the printed out original emailed generated copy of the plagiarism certificate. **Plagiarism Certificate.**
17. The declaration certificate of the candidate shall be mandatory in the report, dissertation and thesis to declare the academic honesty and integrity of the research work as shown at **Annexure 5**. **Declaration Certificate by the Candidate.**
18. In all the field study to collect the empirical data the scholar shall use either the **Consent Form** or/ **Prior Informed Consent Form**, and **Biographical Information Form** as per the requirement of the research protocol of the concerned Department or/ Institute as shown at **Appendix 6, 7 and 8**. **Consent Form, Prior Informed Consent Form and Biographical Information Form.**
- Preface and Acknowledgment.** 19. The preface or/ acknowledgement page shall be just after the contents page of the report, dissertation and thesis.
- Contents of Dissertation and Thesis.** 20. The contents page of the dissertation and thesis shall enlist all the chapter with section and page number against the chapter in the right margin of page. Auxiliary page shall be numbered by using Roman numeral in lower case and chapter shall be numbered by using Arabic numeral.
- List of Table, Plate, Figure and Map.** 21. Table, plate, figure and map in the dissertation and thesis shall be listed in separate page with their number and corresponding page number against them shall be after the contents.
- Word Limit in Dissertation and Thesis.** 22. There shall be word limit to maintain the standard and quality of writing the dissertation and thesis under the Faculty of

Social Sciences. The Master of Arts dissertation words limit shall be between 15,000 to 20,000 words, the Master of Philosophy dissertation word limit shall be between 30,000 to 50,000 words; and Doctor of Philosophy or/ Doctor of Literature thesis word limit shall be between 80,000 to 100,000 words.

The word limit includes appendix and the contents page but excludes the certificate, declaration certificate, plagiarism certificate, preface, acknowledgment, footnote, referenceon transliteration, bibliography, abbreviations and glossary. The contents page shall be included in the words limit. Statistical table, graph, plate, photograph, figure, map, illustration and other pictorial images shall be counted as '0' words. However, if graph are used as an illustration of statistical data that is also presented elsewhere within the dissertation and thesis, then such illustration graphs shall be counted as '0' words.

Only under exceptional circumstances the permission shall be granted to **lessen or exceed** these words limit. Application for permission shall be made to the Department Board of Studies or/ Institute Board of Studies at least four months before the final dissertation and thesis is printed and bound.

23. A complete and comprehensive list of all the abbreviation, notation and nomenclature in the dissertation and thesis shall be presented after the list of table, plate, figure and map. **Abbreviation Notation and Nomenclature.**

24. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Guidelines arise any difficulty in giving effect to the provisions and which is not covered under the above provisions for any other methods and requirement for writing report, dissertation and thesis, then an appropriate measure may be so employed by the Departmental Board of Studies or/ Institutional Board of Studies subject to prior consultation with the Supervisor or/Mentor concerned of a research work may make such provisions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Guidelines; and thereto in turn approved by the Academic Council for removing the difficulties. **Power to Remove Difficulties.**




