



PhD FELLOWSHIPS: NATURE-CULTURE TRANSITIONS IN ARUNACHAL PRADESH

Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) and Nature Conservation Foundation (NCF) jointly invite applications for **three** fully funded PhD fellowships (UGC JRF scale) for **interdisciplinary** research on changing **nature-culture relations** in Arunachal Pradesh.

These positions are open only to APST candidates.

The aim of this fellowship is to build interdisciplinary academic excellence in Arunachal Pradesh. Selected candidates will have the option of taking courses at NCF by prominent Indian and international academics, and participating in international conferences.

Conditions:

1. Candidates with Master's degree in **any relevant discipline** with proven interest and experience in fields such as zoology, environmental science, tribal studies, or anthropology.
2. All selected candidates will be supervised by an interdisciplinary Doctoral Advisory Committee with faculty members from RGU, NCF and their international partners.

Eligibility:

1. Minimum of 55% marks in aggregate or equivalent at the master's level.
2. Keen interest in ethno-cultural and natural heritage of Arunachal Pradesh, and ability to conduct long-term fieldwork in remote rural locations.
