AC: 16:04: To recognize Dr. Hiren Gogoi, Assistant Professor in the Dept. of Zoology, RGU as PhD Supervisor who will be completing three years of PG teaching on 9th July 2016.

The AC noted that the 28th Research Board meeting held on 09/03/2016, had recommended for granting approval for recognition of Dr. Hiren Gogoi, Assistant Professor in the Dept. Of Zoology, RGU as a PhD Supervisor with prospective effect from 09th July, 2016.

The AC did not approve the proposal and observed that one should apply fo supervisorship on completion of three years PG teaching as per ordinance.

He has published six (06) paper and attended several conferences and workshops. He has completed his PhD from the Department of Geography, RGU in May 2004.

AC: 16:09: To recognize Dr. M.K. Bharali as PhD Co-Supervisor to guide Mr. Luk Bdr. Chetry, PhD research scholar in the Department of Zoology.

AC: 16:10: To consider issuance of NOC to Galaxy College of Teacher Education

The Managing Director, Galaxy College of Teacher Education Nirjuli has submitted representation for issuance of NOC for starting teacher education programme, whereas NCTE Eastern Regional Committee had earlier served a show cause notice to Galaxy Coll of Teacher Education on 14.01.2016 on three grounds. One of the reasons was that the Gal

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College of Teacher Education did not submitted NOC from affiliating body. Reply dated 03.02.2016 submitted by the institution was not found satisfactory as the compliance of the deficiencies was also not submitted. In view of the above the committee refused recognition for running B.Ed course under section 14(3)(b) of NCTE Act 1993.

The members deliberated on it and did not approve the same.

AC: 16:11: To consider establishment of Centre for National Security Studies in RGU

In response to UGC letter D.O. No. F.10-2/2015 (SR-III) dated 29th June 2015, the University sent a proposal for establishing Centre for National Security Studies in Rajiv Gandhi University vide letter No. RGU/VCS/UGC/15 dated September 10, 2015. UGC has now in principle approved to extend fund support for setting up Department of National Security principle approved to extend fund support for setting up Department of National Security Studies Centre vide letter D.O. No. F.10-2/2015 (SR-III) dated 10th February 2016 to the Studies Centre vide letter D.O. No. F.10-2/2015 (SR-III) dated 10th February 2016 to the University is planning to setup an independent tune of Rs. 63.50 lakhs. In this regard University is planning to setup an independent Centre/Department with the nomenclature Centre for National Security Studies (CNSS) Rajiv Gandhi University from the coming academic session 2016-17. Approval letter of UGC is placed at Annexure-IV

The members deliberated on it and approved the establishment of Centre for National Security Studies in RGU.

AC: 16:12: To consider approval of courses and manpower for strengthening of School of Education

UGC vide letter No. F.15-5/2012(CU) dated 23rd March 2016 approved for creation of 12 teaching positions to fill up the gap for B.Ed. and M.Ed. programme as per new norm prescribed in NCTE regulations, 2014 for strengthening of School of Education/Faculty of Education as per details below:-

AC: 16:13: To ratify the decision taken by University authority in granting approval for Skill base course in Undergraduate programmes for various subjects viz. Economics and Anthropology



Under BA semester system Course, Skill based papers in all subjects are being offered in 4th Semester, which started from (Jan to April 2016). The syllabi were lately submitted by Dept. of Economics and Anthropology; perhaps due to change in heads of the t Departments; thus the courses were approved administratively for implementation in colleges.

The AC ratified the action taken by University authority in granting approval for S. based course in Undergraduate programmes for various subjects viz. Economics a. Anthropology

AC: 16:14: To ratify the decision taken by University authority in granting approval for mir modification in the M.Tech. in Electronic and Communication Engineering syllabus.

The University authority has granted approval for carrying out minor modification in M.Tech. (ECE) syllabus of a paper i.e. ECE-575 of M.Tech in Electronics & Communicati Engineering to be made at par with the requirement pattern in connection with Examinati perspective.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC: 16:15: To consider the approval of new syllabus for BA Mass Communication a Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS).

The AC noted that the following syllabuses were placed for acceptance and approval;

- A) Dr. Kh. Kabi, Head, Department of Mass Communication has submitted the new syllabi: BA in Mass Communication.
- B) Prof. (Mrs.) Jharna Chakraborty, Chairperson, BUGS (Homoeopathy) has submitted t BHMS syllabus as prescribed for the course by the Central Council of Homoeopathy.

The AC approved the new syllabuses for BA (Mass Communication) and Homoeopath Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) programmes. The AC further noted that the BHMS syllawere prepared as prescribed by the Central Council of Homoeopathy.

AC: 16:17: To consider the agenda items from IDE:

A: Opening of PG Study and Examination Centres of IDE at DPGC, Kamki: GCB, Bomdiland IGGC, Tezu

The AC noted that a committee was constituted to examine the feasibility of opening PG Study and examination centres at 3 study centres at Donyi Polo Govt. College, Kamki: Govt. College Bomdila and Indira Gandhi College, Tezu. The report of the committee was placed before the XXIII Board of Management (BoM) meeting of the IDE. The BoM examined the report and recommended the same to the Academic Council for consideration.

The members deliberated on the proposal for opening of PG Study and Examination Centres of IDE at DPGC, Kamki: GCB, Bomdila and IGGC, Tezu and decided to start PG Study centres as proposed. The AC authorized the University Authority to decide on opening examination centres administratively.

B: Opening of UG Study Centres of IDE at Government College, Daporijo and Mahabodl

Requests from Government College, Daporijo; Government College, Basar; Kasturba Gandh, Institute of Higher Education, Roing; Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai and Mude Tamo Memorial College, Ziro were received for establishing Study Centres at the respective Colleges.

The AC noted the recommendation of the Board of management for opening of UG Studenters of IDE at Government College, Daporijo and Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai and approved the proposal.

AC: 16:18: Agenda items from Examination Branch:

A: Ratification of Action Taken by the University Administration regarding distribution of Marks on Paper MATH-232 and MATH-3624 (Skill Based Paper)

The Head, Dept. of Mathematics informed that as per course structure there is no provision of Internal Assessment marks on Skill Based paper MATH-232 of III semester, 50 marks have been allotted to the Practical. He recommended to split the practical marks into two components i.e. 30 marks for Practical and 20 marks for Internal Assessment.

Head, Dept. of Mathematics also recommended to split the 100 marks on paper MATH-362 of VI Semester into three components i.e. Theory-60 marks, Practical-20 marks and International Assessment-20 marks.

The Council ratified the action taken by the University authority.



B: Ratification of Action Taken by the University Administration regarding conduct Special Examination for two students of B A I semester who represented the state of A at a National Level event.

The Honorary Secretary of Arunachal State Badminton Association, Itanagar informed the Vice-Chancellor that Miss Pinki Karki, B A I semester and Miss Laa Yajum, B A I semester of D N College Itanagar were qualified to represent Arunachal Pradesh at the national lever championship at Jaipur from 30th November to 6th December 2015 and requested to conduspecial examination for them. In this connection he referred the notification of MHRD (Deport Youth Affairs and Sports) vide No. F.18-1/87, Sports IV, Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Youth Affairs and Sports) dtd. 9th March, 198′

Accordingly, University administration approved participation of the students in the National Level Badminton Championship at Jaipur and conducted special examination at a later date.

The Council ratified the action taken by the University authority.

C: Extension of 1 (one) additional chance beyond extended period of two years

Examination ordinances of this University for both UG and PG level are prepared in such way that each student gets minimum three chances to clear a particular semester. But as pe UGC order vide No. F.12-1/2015(CPP-II) dated 15th October 2015 in exceptions circumstances and on the merit of each case university may allow one more year for completion of the programme.

The members of the AC deliberated extensively and decided to follow the UGC directives a prescribed.

D: Reviewing of the Rechecking result of B. Sc and B. Com. Semester Examinations held i December 2015

The AC noted that a representation has been received from the students of B. Sc/B. Com. c J.N. College, Pasighat & D.N.G. College, Itanagar and Principal of J.N. College, Pasighat t review the results of semester examination held in December 2015 and subsequent recheckin result for those who have been placed under "No More Chance" justifying that they hav completed up to V semester in almost 3 years but due to failure to clear back paper in semester, they have to discontinue further study. Hence, they appealed to review the results.

The members of the AC deliberated on rechecking result of B. Sc and B. Com. Semeste Examinations held in December 2015 and decided to provide last and final chance to cleat the examination as per UGC directive.

E: Conduct of Supplementary Examination for candidates with Backlog paper an Improvement

The AC noted that, as per provisions under existing examination ordinances both UG and Procurses, odd semester examinations are held in December and even semester examinations are held in May. It is observed that those who get back paper in odd semester needs to wait or academic year and they can appear back paper examination in next December only. Similar

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the procedure in case of Even semesters also. Further, those who get back paper in the V semester of UG and III semester PG losses one academic year to appear their back paper examinations in the next concerned semester examination.

Hence, to save loss of one academic year of the students it is proposed to conduct Supplementary Examination for the back paper and improvement candidates (if otherwise eligible) of both UG and PG courses within 30 (thirty) days from the date of result notification.

The members of the AC deliberated and decided to allow conduct of Supplementary Examinations for final terminal semester examinations only for both UG and PG categories.

AC: 16:19: Agenda items from previous AC meetings which were deferred to next AC meeting.

A: Maintenance of the Rajiv Gandhi University Museum of Fishes (RGUMF) and support Services from the Department

The agenda item in AC:12:33 dated 28th April,2014 (to approve the proposal for recognition of RGUMF as the Departmental fish repository). In AC meeting the matter was discussed at length and the Chairman emphasized special mention on the RGUMF for its globally acclaimed reputation. However, AC reverted back the matter to the Department for routing the proposal through DBS as per University norms. Therefore, on the back drop of ATR of 13th AC dated 31st October, 2014 (AC 13:01), the HoD looked for attention of DBS members on this long pending agenda of the department.

The DBS members resolved to recommend the proposal with a special request to the authority to approve necessary support services for its proper maintenance and management. The members clearly expressed their strong view that a lump sum allocation of annual maintenance costs along with the services of an Asstt. Curator and a Museum attendant are highly required at this developing stage of the Museum. Members unanimously expressed that the Zoology Dept being a part of 'Centre with potential for Excellence in Biodiversity' requires spontaneous support services for the sustenance of such valuable attempts of their researchers.

The Council authorized the university authority to examine the case and decide administratively.

B: Implementation of NSS as elective subject in the University regarding

A letter was received from Secretary UGC requesting for implementation of NSS as elective subject in University. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, as part of the discussion in the 62nd meeting of the Central advisory Board of Education (CABE) held on 10.10.2013, has decided to consider making NSS as an elective subject in higher education. The Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Government of India has designed a template of NSS curriculum for introduction of NSS as credit based elective subject in the Higher Education System.

The AC members discussed the matter and accepted the proposal for implementation of NSS as elective subject in principle. For further course of actions, a committee shall be constituted



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under the chairpersonship of Head, Department of Social work and NSS Programme Officers as its members.

AC: 16:20: To consider issuance of NOC for appearing entrance test for PhD & M.Phil Programme in respect of Non-teaching employees of RGU.

The AC noted that, one Ms. Millo Sumpa, working as UDC in this University has applied for issuance of NOC to appear entrance test for PhD & MPhil programme. The matter was processed in file with all details. The authority after going through the matter has not permitted to issue NOC.

The members of the AC deliberated on the matter and did not approve the same.

AC: 16:21: To consider the approval of regulation and mechanism for introduction of the "Online Admission System" in the University.

The AC noted the report submitted by Prof. Utpal Bhattacharjee, Chairman in-charge of the Advisory committee to draft the regulation and mechanism for introduction of the "Online Admission System" in the University.

The members of the AC deliberated and approved the same to be introduced from the Academic session 2016-17.

AC: 16:22: To consider the modalities for conducting a single entrance test for admission t both M.Phil/PhD.

The AC noted the committee report as submitted by Prof. (Mrs.) Jharna Chakravorty Chairperson of the committee for MPET RGU Single Entrance Test (a committee formed t work out the modalities for conducting a single entrance test for admission to RGU M.Phil. & PhD as per last AC decision) has submitted the report for consideration.

The members of the AC deliberated and approved the conduct of "Single Entrance Test for admission to both M.Phil and Ph.D. programmes from the Academic session 2016-17.

AC: 16:23: To consider the revised fee structure for various courses.

The AC noted the report submitted by a committee headed by Prof. A. Mitra, Finance Offic i/c as Chairman, which is to be introduced from the Academic Session 2016-17.

The members of the AC approved the fee structure with minor corrections.

AC: 16:24: To approve the new syllabus of MSW under the Department of Social Work

The AC noted the new syllabi of MSW submitted by Ms. Chaphiak Lowang, Head i Department of Social work and approved the same.



AC: 16:25: To approve the modified syllabus of M.Tech. in Electronics and Communication Engineering.

The AC noted the new syllabi of M.Tech. in Electronics and Communication Engineering submitted by Mr. Jagdeep Rahul, Head i/c Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering and approved the same.

AC: 16:26: To approve the introduction of 1(one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy

The AC noted the proposal submitted by Dr. Anil Mili, Head i/c, Department of Physical Education for introduction of 1(one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy Education in RGU from the academic session 2016-17.

The AC approved the introduction of I(one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy Education in RGU from the academic session 2016-17.

AC: 16:27: To approve the syllabus for 1(one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy Education.

The AC noted the syllabi submitted by Dr. Anil Mili, Head i/c, Department of Physical Education for introduction of 1(one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy Education in RGU from the academic session 2016-17.

The AC approved the syllabus for I (one) Year PG Diploma Course in Yoga Therapy Education.

AC: 16:28: Any other items with due permission of the Chair:

A) Inclusion of Wi-Fi charges in the hostel fees from the Academic Session 2016-17.

The AC noted the proposal submitted by Mr. Tseiring D. Megeji, Sr. System Analyst to introduce levying of Wi-Fi charges @ Rs.500/- only per semester from boarders of such hostels where Wi-Fi facilities are installed. RGU has got two of its hostels viz. Subansiri Halls of Residence (Men) and Kameng Halls of Residence (Women) with Wi-Fi connections providing high speed internet and other network services.

The AC did not approve for this time as installation works are still going on for other hostels.

B) The Head, Department of Education Prof. T. Lhungdim has submitted the syllabi of two year Special B.Ed. (Creditised) course duly prepared by the BPGS (Education) in tune with the standard syllabi prescribed by Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), for consideration. It may be noted that the BPGS (Education) was directed by the AC in its last meeting held of 14th September to prepare the syllabi.

The council noted and approved the syllabi.



C) The Head, Department of History, Prof. Tana Showren proposed for up gradation of M.Phil. Course duration from three semesters to four semesters in History. The same was placed in the last Academic Council under item No. AC:15:24, wherein it was decided to continue with the existing system.

The members of AC deliberated on it and approved for up gradation of M. Phil. Course duration from three semesters to four semesters in all the departments from the academic session 2016-17. The existing M. Phil. syllabi shall be improved/modified wherever necessary by the concerned Board of Studies for administrative approval subject to ratification by next AC. Further, it was decided that no extension will be given to candidates for submission of dissertation beyond the stipulated four semester duration.

D) Prof. P.K. Panigrahi, Chairman, BUGS (Law), has submitted duly prepared revised syllabi for Law (LLB 3 years course) 1st & 2nd semester and 5 year integrated LLB course, and were placed before the AC for consideration.

The AC noted and approved the syllabi.

E) To consider for the Sabbatical leave regarding.

The AC noted the report of the committee on sabbatical leave and decided to circulate the report among the Deans/Head of Department for inputs which are to be submitted within 15 days for further consideration.

F) To consider the recommendations / modification submitted by Ordinance Review Committee.

The AC noted the report of the Ordinance Review Committee and approved in principle ancirculation of the report among the AC members for inputs within 15 days.

As there were no other items for discussion, the meeting ended with vote of thanks from th Registrar, the Ex-Officio Secretary of the AC.

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The members of AC deliberated on it and approved for up gradation of M. Phil. Course duration from three semesters to four semesters in all the departments from the academic session 2016-17. The existing M. Phil. syllabi shall be improved/modified wherever necessary by the concerned Board of Studies for administrative approval subject to ratification by next AC. Further, it was decided that no extension will be given to candidates for submission of dissertation beyond the stipulated four semester duration.

The AC perused the report and approved the great of permission to start 8.00 in Education subject at Mahabadhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai from the next Academic Session 2017-18.

Permission to intro use 8.A Course from the current session 2016-17, at Siang Royal Academy, Pasignat

The Council noted that the College Management of Siang Royal Academy, Pasighat is proposing for the start of offering BA conventional courses with six subjects to be offered under the NCTE's composite college structure. The management has also obtained NOC from the State Government.

Accordingly, a screening committee was constituted under the Chairpersonship of Prof. (Mrs.) E. Hangsing with three other members. The appointed committee had a sitting on 23rd May 2016 and scomitted their report, which was placed before the AC.

The AC perused the report and decided to constitute an inspection Committee to inspect the college and the report of the committee shall be placed before the next AC for consideration to grant permission to start B.A programme at Siang Royal Academy, Pacignat from next Academic Session 2017-13.

AC: 17:07:

To approve the renewed of Temporary Affiliation to Govt. College Nyapin, Kurung Kumey district.

The Council noted that the Principal of Govt. College, Nyapin has applied for renewal of temporary affiliation to their college. Consequently a three member inspection committee was formed with Prof. Nani Bath as Chairman. The inspection committee inspected the college on 30th May, 2016 and recommended for renewal of the temporary affiliation to the College and placed report of the Committee before the AC.

The AC perused the report and approved the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to the college subject to finishment of observations of the committee. The University shall communicate the same to the Director of Higher Education, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh for necessary action.

AC: 17:08:

To approve the renewal of temporary affiliation to Govt. Model College, Geku, Upper Siang district.

The Council noted that the Principal i/c of Govt. Model College, Geku has applied for renewal of temporary affiliation to their college. Consequently a three member inspection committee was formed with Prof. Sudhir Kr. Singh, Dean of Social Science as chairman. The inspection committee inspected the college on 3rd Oct., 2016 and recommended for renewal of the temporary affiliation to the College. The report of the committee was placed before the AC.

The AC perused the report and seriously observed that the report was not properly prepared and furnished by the committee, as it was expected from a duly constituted Committee by the University Authority. However, the AC decided to approve and grant the renewal of Temporary Affiliation in principle subject to submission of a full-length report by the committee.

AC: 17:09: To approve the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Kasturba Gandhi Institute of Higher Education (B.Ed.) College, Roing.

The Council noted that the Secretary, Kasturke Gandhi Institute of Higher Education (B.Ed.) College, Roing, Lower Dipang Valley district has applied for renewal of Temporary Affiliation to their college. Consequently a three member inspection committee was formed with Prof. Sushanta Kr. Nayak as chairman. The inspection committee inspected the college on 7th Oct., 2016 and recommended for renewal of the temporary of illiation to the College.

The AC perused the report and approved renewal of Temporary Affiliation for one year to Kasturba Gandhi Institute of Higher Education (LiEst.) College, Roing.

AC: 17:10: For grant of Temporary affiliation to Govt. Modelly agree College, Jemi-Notko, Roing

The Council noted that the Principal, I/c, Govt. Model Degree College, Jemi-Notko, Roing in Lower Dibang Valley district has submitted an application for the grant of Temporary Affiliation to start a Govt. Model Degree College at Jemi-Notko, Roing. Lower Dibang Valley district, Arunachal Pradesh offering BA programme. Accordingly, a Screening committee to screen the application was constituted under Prof. Sudhir Kr. Singh, Dean, Faculty of Social Science as the chairman and a inspection committee for Physical Inspection under the chairmanship of Prof. Sushama Kr. Navak. The committee visited the college on 7th Oct., 2016, for inspection toward the grant of temporary affiliation to the College from the current academic session and the committee submitted its report with recommendation for the grant of Temporary Affiliation to the College from the current Academic session 2016-17. The inspection committee report was placed before the AC.

The Academic Council deliberated on the report and decided to accord Temporary Affiliation for one year to Govt. Model Degree Colline, Jemi-Notko, Roing.

AC: 17:11: To consider the representation submitted by Acceptable Pradesh College Teachers' Association (APCTA) regarding restoration of summer vacation from 33 days to 47 days.

The Council noted that the APCTA in its representation to the university Authority has requested the University Authority to restore the total duration of summer vacation for 47 days instead of 33 days (reduced down in the current academic colendar 2016-17), with a plea that the working hours in Govt, colleges have increased by an hour keeping in view of the introduction of semester system in US lavel. The representation was placed before the Council.

The calendar was prepared and passed in the last AC keeping in view the workload in a semester system and also to cover examinations and evaluation processes.

The AC deliberated on the matter and decide to constitute a three-member committee to examine the matter.

AC: 17:12:

To consider recognition of the 19+2 level pass certificates issued by the B.H.S.E., Delhi for admissions to the programmes in the University and affiliated colleges.

The Council noted that a letter has been received from the Joint Secretary, Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi requesting for recognition of their 10+2 level pass certificates issued by them for being considered during admissions in Rajiv Gandhi University and its affiliated colleges.

The AC had threadbase discussion on it and authorized the University authority to examine the case and report to the next meeting of the Academic Council.

AC:17:13:

To ratify the decision taken on age restriction for admissions to law courses in line with the decision of the Bar Council of India following the Honorable Supreme Court's verdict.

The Council noted that the Bar Council of India, New Delhi through a letter dated 17th September, 2016 has communicated the review of age restriction for admissions to LLB 3 year's course and integrated courses following the Honorable Supreme Court's verdict.

Accordingly, in pursuance to the verdict of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the University Authority issued a Notification taking cognizance of the same approving the restriction of age as per the relevant clause; i.e., clause 28 of Legal Education Rules, 2008, which restricts the age limit as under:

BA/BSc/BCom LLB (integrated):

- a) Limited to 20 years for General candidates
- b) 22 years for SC,ST and OBC candidates

II. LLB:

- a) Limited to 30 years for General candidates
- b) 35 years for SC,ST or OBC candidates

The Council ratified the action taken by the University Authority.

AC:17:14:

To ratify the decision taken by University authority for enforcing provisions of relaxations to Women candidates and persons with disability(s) in pursuing MPhil and PhiD as laid down in the UGC's (Minimum standards and procedure for award of MPhil/PhD degrees) regulations.

The Council noted that in pursuance with the UGC notification No.F.1-2/2009 (EC/PS) V(I) Vol.II, dated 5th May, 2016, the University authority enforced the provisions of relaxations laid down in the UGC's (Minimum standards and procedure for award of MPhil/PhD degrees) regulations, 2016 under clause 4.4 in respect of the Women candidates and persons with disabilities in pursuing PhD/MPhil programme, as under:

- i. The women candidates and persons with disability (s) (more than 40% disability) shall be allowed a relaxation of 1 (one) year for MPhil and 2 (two) years for PhD in addition to the maximum duration.
- ii. The Women candidates shall be provided maternity leave/ child care leave once in the entire duration of M.Phil/PhD for upto a maximum of 240 days.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC:17:15:

To recognize Or. Lijum Nochi, Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics, BGU as a PhD Supervisor who has requisite research and three years teaching experience after obtaining his PhD.

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council:

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Dr. Up in Nochi, Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics. RGU as PhD Supervisor.

AC:17:16:

To recognize Dr. Safish Kumar Kalhotra, Associate Professor in the Department of Education, RGU as a PhD Supervisor.

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council.

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Or. Satish Kumar Kalhotra. Associate Professor in the Department of Education, RGU or Phil Supervisor.

AC:17:17:

To recognize Dr. Harniwas Pandey, Associate Professor in the Department of Hindly, AN College Pasighat, as a PhD Co-Supervisor

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council.

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Dr. Harmiwas Panday, Associate Professor in the Department of Hindi, J.N College Pasighat as this Co-Supervisor.

AC:17:18:

To recognize Dr. Ram Krishna Mandai, Associate Professor in the Department of Economics, DNG College Banagar, as a PhD Co-Supervisor of Mr. Kumer Tak.

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council.

In view of the above, the AC may like to consider and decide on the proposal to recognize Dr. Ram Krishna Mandai. Associate Professor in the Department of Economics, DNG College Itanagar, to act as a PhD Co-Supervisor of Mr. Kumar Tok, a PhD scholar in the Department of Commerce, RGU.

The AC after a threadbare discussion noted that Dr. Mandal had already been approved as a Co-Supervisor in the Department of Economics, RGU. However, the Council authorized the University Authority to exen the the matter administratively.

AC:1.7:3.9;

To recognize Dr. J.C Borah, Principal Scientist and Head, Scientist-in-Charge of CSIR-NEIST, Arunachal Pradesh Branch as PhD Cr-Supervisor in the Department of Chemistry. The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council.

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Dr. J.C Borah, as PhD Co-Supervisor in the Espartment of Chemican.

AC:17:20;

To recognize Dr. C. Suz Sankar, Assistant Professor in the Department of Education, RGU, as a PhD Co-Sug arvisor of Wrs. Sonali Gogoi Konwar

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 has recommended for approval of the proposal of recognition by the Academic Council.

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Dr. C. Siva Sankar, Assistant Professor in the Department of Education, RGU, as PhD Co-Supervisor for Mrs. Sonali Gogol Konwar as a special case keeping in view the situation that the supervisor of Mrs. Sonali, Prof. LC. Soni is attaining experannuation in the month of November 2016.

AC:17:22:

To recognize Dr. Hire: Gogol, Assistant Professor in the Dept. of Zoology, RGU as a PhD Supervisor who has completed three years of PG teaching on 9th July 2016.

The Council noted that this case was deferred by the 16th AC held on 22nd April, 2016, as by that time Dr. Gogoi did not had the requisite PG teaching experience of three years post PhD degree, although the 28th Research Board meeting held on 09/03/2016, had recommended for granting approval for recognition of Dr. Hiren Gogoi, Assistant Professor in the Dept. of Zoology, RGU as a PHD Supervisor with prospective effect from 09th July 2016.

The AC approved the proposal to recognize Dr. Hiren Gogol, Assistant Professor in the Dept. of Zoology, RGU as Ph.D Supervisor with retrospective effect from 09th July 2016.

AC:17:22:

To ratify the decision of recognizing Dr. K.C. Mishra, Associate Professor in the Department of English, RGU as supervisor for guiding PhD scholars in RGU.

The Council noted that 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 approved the proposal of recognizing Dr. K.C. Mishra, Associate Professor in the Department of English, RGU as supervisor for guiding Ph.D scholars in the Dept. of English, RGU, subject to ratification by the Academic Council.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC:17:23:

To ratify the decision of recognizing Prof. Pradip Kr. Kalita, Professor in the Department of Physics, RGU as supervisor for guiding PhD scholars in RGU.

The Council noted that the 29th Research Board meeting held on 14/09/2016 approved the proposal of recognizing Prof. Pradip Kr. Kalita, Professor in the Department of Physics, RGU as supervisor for guiding PhD scholars in RGU subject to ratification by the Academic Council.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC: 17:24:

To consider the Committee Report for conducting Common Entrance Test for admission to all the programmes of RGU.

The Council noted that a five-member committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Sushanta Kr. Nayak, was constituted for working out the modalities for conducting Common Entrance Test for admission to all the programmes of RGU (a committee formed to work out the modalities for conducting a Common Entrance Test for admission to all the programmes of RGU as per a decision of the AC in its 15th meeting held on 14th Sept., 2015). The Chairman of the committee submitted the report or 26th May, 2016, with recommendations for consideration. The report was placed to the Council.

The Council approved the report of the cover inten in principle and decirled to constitute a three-member committee to work on the detail regulation/ordinance in regard to Common Entrance Test (CET). The report of the committee shall be placed in the next meeting of the AC.

However, the AC also noted that introduction of ET may not be practicable to some departments in stipulated time due to some technical reasons.

AC: 17:25:

To consider fixation of seat limit for the Open Elective Papers being offered in various departments under Choice Based Credit System in the University.

It has been observed that managing classes in some of the departments have become a problem for the Open Elective papers because of huga number of student enrollment for the paper. It has even led to conduct of classes in university's main and mini auditoriums to facilitate class room teaching atmosphere. It is therefore, proposed that a ceiling limit of seats be kept in each department as per the intake capacities of the concerned departments.

The item was deferred to next meeting of the Academic Council.

. AC: 17:26:

To consider establishment of Centre for Youth and Leadership Studies in RGU

The Council noted that a proposal has been received from Mr. Gomer Basar, Assistant Registrar (Academic) cum NSS Programme Officer for setting up of "Centre for Youth and Leadership Studies" for a systematic and dedicated research on youth and leadership development in the State in particular and North East region in general. The proposal being a follow up initiative of the recently held 3 days ToT programme organized by RGU in collaboration with NYKS, wherein the officials advocated for setting up of the same in RGU. The Centre will have a focused approach on understanding the youth dynamics of the region; so as to facilitate the efforts in channelizing the demographic dividend of high youth population in the country to a productive work force for national development.

The Council approved the proposal to establish Centre for Youth and Leadership Studies in RGU and authorized the authority to our cirtuits a three-member committee to work out the details of the Centre and report the same to next meeting of the AQ

AC:17:27: Agenda items from institute of Distance Education (IDE), RGU.

As per recommendations of the Board of Management, Institute of Distance Education, Rajiv Gandhi University, the following agenda items are being placed before the AC:

Item No. 1: Revision of the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to MA as per DEC guidelines and IGNOU norms, i.e. 'Bachelor's Degree or a higher degree from a recognized University'.

The Council noted that as per the DEC guidelines, the ODL mode is to be flexible. The eligibility for admission to MA in IGNOU is 'Bachelor's degree'. There is no minimum eligibility criterion other than the same.

In IDE, it is as per RGU regular mode, i.e., minimum 40%. In the current year, many a students have applied for MA with under 40%. The students are both from regular and distance mode. Though many applicants are degree holder from IDE, RGU, they have submitted application to allow them admission.

The AC deliberated on the matter and did not approve the proposal for revision of minimum eligibility criteria for admission to IVIA in IDE keeping in view the non-availability of such previsions in the existing ordinance.

Item No. 2: Re-Structuring of IDE Marks Distribution for B. A. and M. A. for 'Assignment' and Term End Examination' marks.

The Council noted that, the existing marking pattern ratio for the annual assessment to internal assessment is as follows:

It was proposed that the same may be re-structured as 70: 30 for annual assessment and internal assessment as was the pattern followed in IDE in its initial period. The revised pattern is proposed to be, as under:

The IDE's Board of Management had approved the matter and recommended the same to be placed in the next meeting of the Academic Council for ratification.

The AC after a thorough perusal ratified the action taken by the University Authority.

Item No. 3: Adaptation of RGU Examination Ordinance OE 05:15 (Compartmental) into the IDE Examination pattern.

The clause states that 'if a student fails to complete his degree in the requisite time with a compartmental paper, he/she may be allowed to appear once to clear that paper as 'special compartment'. It was placed before the IDE's Board of Management that the

same is adapted for IDE and the Board approved the matter and recommended it to be placed in the next meeting of the Academic Council for ratification.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University outhority.

AC: 17:28: Agenda items from the Examination Branch

Item No. 1: Discontinuation of Inter College Migration

The Council noted that as per provision under the use 29 of the Examination Codinance, there is a provision of inter college migration. Though it was tenable under annual system of examination but with the introduction of semester system at UG level it has become very difficult to prepare final results searching the semester wise result in different centres. Hence, it was proposed to discontinue the provision of inter college migration from the current academic year.

The AC deferred the Item to next Academic Cours. The CoE was requested to submit a report on it to the University Authority.

Item No. 2: Retention of 80% Examination Fee by Affillated Colleges

The Council noted that a resolution was adopted vide Item No. 13:34(e) of the 13th meeting of the Academic Council held on 31st October, 2014 that colleges will retain 30% of the collected Examination Fee to meet the centre excenses for conducting both theory and practical examinations. The University Authority has recently proposed to review the decision for private colleges.

The AC decided to continue the existing system till the review of the examination fee structure by the University. The matter thereafter shall be placed to the next of for consideration.

Rem No. 3 To conduct an online Viva-Voce for admission into L., Phil/Ph. D. Programme.

The Council noted that after declaration of the result of written examination for admission into M. Phil/Ph. D. 2016 (RGUMPET), a representation was received from Prof. J. Chakravorty. Dean, Faculty of Life Science to consider conducting online Viva-Voce of one candidate Ms. Jena Gollo. But the appeal could not be considered as there is no such provision in the existing ordinance for conducting or line Viva-Voce and decided to refer the case to Academic Council for deliberation.

i) . The Council had a lengthy discussion on it and decided not to consider the request for online viva-voce for admission into Ph.D programme (REUMPET) by the candidate.

ii) The AC further turned down the request of the Cara, Faculty of Life Sciences and the candidate for extending validation of the AGUMPET-1016 written Test Result for a year.

frem No. 4 Ratification of Action taken by the University Authority on Declaring the Results of DCA

As per resolution adopted vide Item No. AC:14:05 of the 14th meeting of Academic Council held on 27th April, 2015, examinations of postgraduate level and Diploma/Certificate courses were all made credit based from the session 2015-15. Accordingly, all semester examinations of PG and Diploma courses were conducted on credit basis with minimum pass marks of 45%. On the other hand, as per USC guidelines

for Diploma in Computerized Accounting (DCA) under the Scheme of Community Colleges, performance of the students should be scaled in grades. But the evaluators scaled the performance of students in marks with 40% as minimum pass marks. To avoid delay in declaring the results, University Authority approved 40% minimum pass marks subject to ratification by the Academic Council.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University Authority.

Item No. 5

Promotion of BALLB : / semester (Part-I) students with backlog paper to V semester (Part-II)

The Council noted that as per provision under Clause 3 of the ordinance relating to BALLB (5 year course), which is comprised of two parts viz. Part-I deals and describe about the two year core programme of pre-law study and Part-II covering the three year programme aspects for professional training in law. Further, as per provision under Clause 14.4 of the said ordinance, a student shall not be admitted into Fifth semester classes (Part-II) unless he/she clears all the previous semesters of Part-I.

The AC further noted that, in this connection, the Principal of Arunachal Law Academy (ALA), Naharlagun (the ione law college affiliated to RGU), had collected ordinances of few neighboring universities, such as, (1) Gauhati University, Guwahati (2) National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam and (3) Swami Shukdevanand Law College, Shahjahanpur. Interestingly, there are provisions in the ordinances of the said Universities to promote the students to Fifth semester with back paper in lower semester of Part-i, and banking on these precedents has proposed for considering promotions of BALLB students to Part-II.

The AC decided to allow the students to move to Part-II and suggested that the provisions of the existing ordinance be amended accordingly.

AC: 17:29:

Request for deferment of taking admission to PhD programme in the Department of Hindi in favour of one Wis. Yangkee Taggu while extending the validity of RGUIVIPET-2016 results.

The Council noted that one Ms. Yangkee Taggu, who is presently pursuing M.Phil in NEHU Shillong has passed the RGUMPET-2016 and got admitted in PhD programme in the month of August this year in the department of Hindi through open quota. But subsequently on being found that her M.Phil dissertation is still yet to be submitted in NEHU, her candidature was turned down on technical reason by the departmental admission committee. Ms. Taggu has requested the university authority through the Head, Department of Hindi to consider her a deferment of two semesters and enabling her to take admission in the next session while validating her RGUMPET-2016 results.

The AC noted and did not approve the request of the candidate.

AC: 17:30:

To discuss on the adoption of the UGC Notification regarding UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic staff in Universities and Colleges and Messures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) (4th Amendment), Regulations, 2016.

The Council noted that a Gazette Notification wide No. F.1-2/2016(PS/Amendment), dated 11th July, 2016 is in receipt from the UGC. New Delhi, The matter is pertaining to a regulations notified by the UGC regarding one UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higer Education) (4th Amendment), Regulations, 2016. The amended version of the same was placed before the Council for perusal and to accord approval of its adoption by the University.

The AC noted the same and recommended the number to the Executive Council.

AC: 17:31:

Setting up of three (3) new Departments, vir. I spantment of Geology, Fine Aria & Music and Psychology under XII Flan period from 1 in academic Session -- 2017-11.

The Council noted that UGC vide Letter F. No. 1-1/2013 (CU) Vol.III dated 9th Time 2016 approved setting up of three (S) new Departments 112. Department of Geology, Fine Arts & Music and Psychology under XII Plan period from the Academic Session – 2017-18 with following teaching positions:

2) Yo consider the proposal for starting B.Sc. (Geology) course:

The AC noted that, a conglomeration of five Departments viz. Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and English are contemplating to jointly start the B.Sc. (Geology) from 2017-18 academic session in the line of the BCA course module.

The Council deferred the item to next meeting of the Academic Council.

2) To consider the proposal for starting B.A. (Anthropology) course:

The St. Francis de Sales College, Aalo has proposed to start BA Anthropology from the academic session 2017-18, and a three member committee was constituted to screen the application under the chairmanship of Prof. S.K. Nayak. The committee has recommended the proposal.

The Council approved the proposal to start B.A. Anthropology at SFS College, Aalo from the academic session 2017-18.

4) Bems received via small from JAWAHARLAL NEHRU COLLEGE, PASIGHAT: Under the item, the following points were discussed and resolved:

1. The Subject of the Skill Based Paper offered by the students should be mentioned in the Mark Sheets of the B.A. IV Semester and B.Sc III and IV Semesters.

The CoE was requested to undertake the matter.

The AC felt that, various Boards of Under-Graduate Studies should be requested to look into the matter and a comprehensive report prepared by the CoE be placed to the next meeting of the Examination Committee for deliberation.

5. Results of Students absent in one or more paper/subject in examinations may be declared instead of the Remark "Withheld", so that the students can know their performances in the paper/subject that they have appeared.
Approved. The office of the CoE was requested to undertains the matter.

6. The AC was apprised that the expenditure for conducting practical examinations is very high which includes payment to externals and other lab costs. Therefore, permission was sought that the concerned colleges may be allowed to retain the "practical fees" to meet the escalating expenses.

The matter was deferred to next meeting of the AC.

7. On the proposal to enhance the invigilation remuneration to Rs. 200/- per shift.

The AC authorized the Examination Committee to review the matter in due course.

As there was no any other item for discussion, the meeting came to an end with proposal of vote of thanks from the Ex-Officio-Secretary of the Academic Council.

Subsequently an inspection committee under the Chairmanship Prof. J. Sahoo inspected the college. The reports of the screening and inspection committee were placed to the AC.

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The AC perused and approved the introduction B.A in Sociology *subject* at Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai from the academic session 2017-18 subject to fulfilment of all requirements as observed by the inspection committee.

AC:18:27 Permission to introduce B.Ed course from the current session 2017-18, at Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai

The AC noted that a screening committee was formed under the chairmanship of Prof. J. Sahoo, Dean Faculty of Education to scrutinize the relevant documents in connection with introduction of B.Ed course from the current session 2017-18 at Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai, Arunachal Pradesh. Subsequently an inspection committee under the Chairmanship Prof. J. Sahoo inspected the college and submitted the report. The reports of the screening and inspection committee were placed to the AC.

The AC perused and approved the introduction of B.Ed. course at Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai from the academic session 2017-18 as per the recognition granted by the NCTE, Bhubhaneshwar, subject to fulfilment of all other requirements as observed by the inspection committee.

AC:18:28 Permission to start a new science College in the name and style of Galaxy Science College, Nirjuli,
Arunachal Pradesh from the session 2017-18.

The AC noted that a three-member screening committee under the Chairpersonship of Prof. J. Chakraborty, Dean, Faculty of Life Sciences was constituted to scrutinize the application along with relevant documents which was submitted by the Director, New Galaxy Science College, Nirjuli.

The screening committee accordingly verified the application on 31st March 2017 and submitted the report and the same screening committee was entrusted for physical verification of the college. The physical verification committee visited the college on 18th April 2017 and submitted the report. The reports of the screening and inspection committee were placed to the AC.

The AC after a threadbare discussion decided not to grant affiliation and communicate to the Director of New Galaxy Science College, Nirjuli that they have not fulfilled the basic requirements as observed by the inspection committee pertaining to possession of requisite area of land prescribed by UGC.

AC:18:29 To consider the affiliation of Tomo Riba Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Naharlagun.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Prof. Utpal Bhattacharjee, Dean, Faculty of Basic Science & Information Technology and five other members to inspect/conduct physical verification covering all requirements as per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation in connection with grant of Temporary affiliation to a new Government Medical College, namely, Tomo Riba Institute of Health & Medical Sciences (TRIHMS), Naharlagun. The inspection report was placed to the AC.

The AC approved the issuance of Consent Letter in line of the requirement of the Medical Council of India for subsequent grant of Temporary Affiliation, however with the condition that the Institute authority obtain recognition of the Medical Council of India (MCI) first. A letter of consent shall be issued with a remark to the Institute Authority to expedite obtaining the recognition of MCI, New Delhi.



AC:18:30 To ratify the action taken by the University authority to approve the academic calendar for the year 2016-17 session for North East Homoeopathic Medical College, Itanagar.

The AC noted that the Principal of the North East Homoeopathic Medical College, Itanagar submitted the academic calendar for the year 2016-17 which was administratively approved.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC:18:31 To ratify the MoUs signed with various Institutes:

- 1) MoU signed between Department of Management with Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IEE), Guwahati on the 27th of February, 2017.
- 2) MoU signed between NSS Unit RGU with National Council for Rural Institutes (NCRI), Hyderabad on the 3rd of February, 2017.
- 3) MoU signed between Department of Commerce with Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI), Guwahati on the 15th of December, 2016.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

AC:18:32 Agenda items from Examination Branch:

Discontinuation of special and supplementary examination at both UG and PG level

The AC noted that the conduct of special and supplementary examination within a period of one month from the date of declaration of examination result (May and December) at both UG and PG level is difficult to be managed by the examination branch. Within a period of one month there is a need to appoint paper setters for setting up of the question papers of PG and UG, collect the question papers, moderate the question papers, send them to the press for printing, conduct the examinations, evaluate the answer scripts and then declare the results. Practically, it is very much difficult to complete the whole process within the short period of time. Special and supplementary examinations have also affected the conduct of regular semester examination held during the month of May and December including the examination of Distance Education and Law Course. Further, there is no such provision of special and supplementary Exam in the neighbouring university especially at UG level.

Therefore it was proposed to discontinue the special and supplementary Examination. The exam of "No More chance" for which there is need to conduct special exam, shall be conducted with regular examination in the month of May and December.

The AC decided that a 3-Member committee shall be constituted to examine the problem and the committee shall submit its report within a month.

Soft copy of the Ph.D Thesis and Report

The AC noted that as per examination ordinance, the exam branch is required to send the hard copy of the thesis for evaluation. This is not so convenient in case of examiner who is from the foreign countries. The process of sending of thesis by post and collect the report by post is time consuming in nature. Some time such examiner is refuse to accept hard copy of Ph.D. thesis. Therefore it is proposed that in case of engagement of examiner from foreign countries, the examination branch may be allowed to send the soft copy of the thesis and also to accept the soft copy of the report.

The AC approved the same only for foreign or overseas examiners.

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C Declaration of UG result on time

The AC noted that for smooth functioning of Examination Branch and declaration of results in time, there is a proposal that number of central evaluation centre (UG) may be increased. Presently, there is four number of evaluation centres. It was also proposed that college should directly submit the answer script to the respective evaluation centre instead of sending the same directly to the university. The record of such answer script should also be sent to the examination branch by the college. The central evaluation centre shall do the needful to evaluate the answer scripts and send the mark to the examination branch for preparation of results.

The AC approved the proposal to increase the number of Evaluation Centres and decided to continue with the existing system.

D Abolition of three chances to clear the back paper

The AC noted that as per present system, three chances are given to the students to clear their back paper(s). If he or she cannot clear the back paper(s) by availing three chances then he/she is out of the system. Therefore it was proposed that without considering three chances to clear the back paper(s), students may be promoted continuously to the higher semesters. However, he/she has to complete the degree/qualify in all papers of the course within the tenure as prescribed in the Examination ordinance of the university.

The AC deliberated on it and decided to constitute a three Member committee to examine the matter. The Committee shall submit its report within a period of 3 months.

E Enhancement of Remuneration .

The AC noted that the existing rate of remuneration for the examination work has been fixed in the year 2008. Therefore, there is a need to enhance the rate of remuneration for the examination works and accordingly it was proposed as under:

The AC approved the proposed hike in remuneration for the Examination related work as shown above. However, the said hike shall be effective from the Academic session 2017-18 after being routed through the Finance Committee in its next meeting.

F Conducting Supplementary Examination for BSc Programme

The AC noted that the students of B.Sc VI semester have requested the Authority to conduct the Supplementary/Special examinations for those students who have back paper in III and V semesters. Those who have back paper cannot clear their examinations after passing VI semester.

The members deliberated on it and did not approve the proposal.

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Disposal of used Answer Scripts

The AC noted that presently the used/old answer scripts are disposed off after every two (2) academic years following all codal formalities. It is found in many Universities that such scripts are disposed after alternate semester examinations i.e. after 6 (six) months to 1 (one) year period. Moreover, as there is considerable constraint of space, non-disclosure of answer scripts to RTI applicant(s), discontinuation of re-evaluation system under semester mode further justifies the disposal of used answer scripts within six months.

The AC decided to continue with the existing system.

AC:18:33 Any other item:

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Provision for Inter-Disciplinary Research

The AC noted that a representation has been received from Prof. Jayadev Sahoo, Dean, Faculty of Education wherein he has proposed for introducing inter-disciplinary research at PhD programme. He has put an argument that many genuine professionals with expertise are deprived of availing research opportunities in our University. He also argued that this lead to deprivation of induced knowledge creation. Therefore, he has personally suggested for creation of scope for allowing genuine professionals for admission into likely faculty for pursuing PhD under interested supervisors. He has suggested for considering 5(five) member board to be set up for considering the proposals. This according to him would safe guard the mandate of UGC.

The AC deliberated on the matter and did not approve the proposal.

To approve the Renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Prof. A.K. Das, Director, CDC to conduct physical verification of Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai for granting renewal of Temporary Affiliation. The report of the committee was placed to the AC.

The AC approved the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Mahabodhi Lord Buddha College, Namsai effectively for a period of one year.

To approve the Renewal of Temporary affiliation to Denning College of Teacher Education, Tezu, Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was formed under the chairmanship of Prof. J. Sahoo, Dean, Faculty of Education to conduct physical verification for granting renewal of temporary affiliation to Denning College of Teacher Education Tezu, Arunachal Pradesh. The report of the committee was placed to the AC.

The AC approved the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Denning College of Teacher Education, Tezu effectively for a period of one year.

To approve the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Siang Royal Academy, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was formed under the chairmanship of Prof. J. Sahoo, Dean, Faculty of Education to conduct physical verification for granting renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Siang Royal Academy, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh. The report of the committee was placed to the AC.

The AC approved the renewal of Temporary Affiliation to Siang Royal Academy, Pasighat effectively for a period of one year.

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E On the School Internship Programme for 2 year B.Ed. Course

The AC noted that as a special case, the B.Ed Internship programme for the 4th Semester trainees in the current academic session 2016-17 has been reduced to 2 months. It was decided that affiliated B.Ed colleges(s) should complete the internship programme on or before July 31, 2017.

The AC perused and approved the adoption of the Govt. of India Gazette notification related to 5% bench mark for disabilities in admission to Higher Educational Institutions. It also felt that it should be reflected in the University Prospectus.

- Visit of Five AITS faculties to USF, USA for a period of two weeks during January 2018 in order to formulate the curriculum. The cost of the trip will be borne by USF.
- Conducting a workshop in a suitable place during mid 2018 in which selected RGU and USF students and faculties will take part.

THIRD YEAR:

- Conducting a field research on public health in Roing along with USF and RIWATCH
- The formality of obtaining VISA for AITS faculties is under progress.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

To ratify the MoU signed between the Dept. of Botany, RGU and Dept. of Forestry, NERIST, Nirjuli.

The AC noted that the Dept. of Botany, RGU and Dept. of Forestry, NERIST have entered into a MOU signed by the RGU and NERIST on 10th October, 2017.

The MOU is aimed at closed linkage and functional coordination between RGU and NERIS towards considering the qualified teachers for collaborative research and to obtain funding for research by submitting joint project proposals for research, development, training and consultancy in India and abroad.

The AC ratified the action taken by the University.

AC:19:08

To approve the setting up of Communication Resources Centre in the Department of Mass Communication, RGU

The AC noted that the Department of Mass Communication is proposing to set up a Communication Resources Centre in the Department of Mass Communication with the backdrop of RGU's unique socio-economic location as a key contributor to the development of Arunachal Pradesh. The proposed centre aims for it to grow as a communication resource hub providing to its students, faculty as well as to the State government and civil society access to the best in action research, capacity building and consultancy services in communication.

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The AC also noted that it is projected that with the support to be made available to the University for establishing a Communication Resources Centre, it will be able to remedy the acute lapses in communication services that confront the State and the University and to provide adequate opportunities to a larger target community, even outside of the campus.

The broad objective of the proposed Centre is to develop a critical mass in professional communication services and impart training to build skills in use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) in education and in the development process. In doing so, the Centre would also contribute to the University's expanding base of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. The centre will mobilize for funds through UGC and other funding agencies. The concept note prepared by the Department was placed before the AC.

The AC discussed the matter and approved the proposal to set up Communication Resources Centre in the Department of Mass Communication.


To decide on the Eligibility criteria for PhD Supervisorship as per UGC (Minimum standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D Degree) Regulation, 2016

The AC noted that Research Board in its 30th meeting held on 19th December, 2016 vide item No. 4. RB: 30: D: noted that a representation was received from Dr. Lakhinath Saikia, Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry; requesting the University Authority to consider revisiting the existing guidelines for PhD guideship in RGU and to evaluate the eligibility on the basis of new set of eligibility criteria as published in The Gazette of India on 5th July, 2016. The Board further noted that the Dean, faculty of Basic Science, IT & ET also submitted a similar representation and informed about receiving applications from the faculty members of Basic Science and Engineering & Technology departments, and that they are eligible for supervisorship under the new criteria as issued by UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of M.Phil/PhD Degrees) Regulation, 2016, which says that, "Any regular Professor of the University/Institution deemed to be a University/College with at least five research publications in referred journals and any regular Associate/Assistant professor of the University/Institution deemed to be a University/College with a PhD degree and at least two research publications in refereed journals may be recognized as Research Supervisor".

The RB also noted that, the RGU Ordinance [US 32 (1) RGU Act, 2006, Section 10 (10.2)] says, "An Assistant Professor with PhD degree and three years of PG teaching (after PhD) and research experience at the University level with three research papers published in referred research Journals may guide PhD scholars".

The RB after a threadbare recommended the matter to the Academic Council for consideration.

The AC deliberated the matter. It was decided that an Assistant Professor with 2 years teaching experience and required publications in RGU is approved as research supervisor.

AC:19:16

To approve adoption and implementation of MOOC Regulations under SWAYAM.

The AC noted that the University is actively pursuing for the implementation of the Digital Initiatives for Higher Education and SWAYAM by the Govt. of India. The MHRD has issued directives to all the universities to take up various digital initiatives for furthering higher education. Some of the thrust areas being Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC), National Academic Depository (NAD), National Digital Library (NDL) etc.

The MOOC Regulations as made available in the MHRD's website was placed for perusal by the AC for being adopted and implemented in totality by the University.

The AC deliberated the matter and MOOC Regulations were approved in principle. However, it was decided to place the item in the next AC for detailed discussion on the syllabus to introduce the same in the University.

AC:19:17

To approve the draft 15 years' Vision Document of the University.

The AC noted that as per UGC directives, there should be a clear-cut vision document for the university for the next 15 years and thus a draft vision has been prepared covering 15 years' action plan of RGU involving all the academic parameters. The establishment of constituent colleges, dissemination of courses and programmes through online mode, CIC, Animal Science & Food Technology departments, etc. were to be given priority and to be kept as major thrust areas for the next 15 years.

The AC after deliberation approved the 15 years' Vision Document of RGU in principle: However, it was decided that all Deans, HoDs/Directors shall submit their inputs/comments on the Vision Document within a period of two weeks.

AC:19:18

To review the duration of vacation for the affiliated colleges.

The AC noted that the University through its constituted committee has prepared the Academic Calendar following the UGC Regulation, 2010 and kept sufficient Vacation period when days of both Summer and Winter recess is taken together. If the days in both are taken together a total of 56 days was given i.e equal to 8 weeks. The UGC guideline is very clear that the working days are to be counted on day basis and not on hourly basis. And since, the govt. run colleges are now falling under 5 days a week pattern the present arrangement has been made with a view to give a balanced durations for both odd and even semester in an academic calendar year. With the total

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shifting of the university courses to semester system, the present balancing is justified. Meanwhile, it is pertinent to mention that the Summer Vacation Period for the current summers i.e. 5th June -7th July 2017 was passed in the 16th AC meeting held on 22nd April, 2016. Of course, there was resentment expressed by APCTA on it but it was placed in AC and with the direction of the AC a committee was constituted, which further nullified the request on the ground that as per UGC guidelines the Academic Calendar need further improvement and the request of APCTA held no water. The APCTA again expressed its resentment and demanded the university authority to review the vacation period. They even resorted to non-cooperation movements and even boycotted RGU examinations and evaluation works, despite the assurance from the Vice. Chancellor during his interaction with APCTA representatives that the issue of vacation period in respect of affiliated colleges shall be reviewed in the next Academic Council Meeting and till then status quo be maintained, while justifying the fact that a decision arrived at a statutory body' meeting cannot be diverted or modified by a Vice-Chancellor in his personal official capacity and thereby needs to be placed again for deliberation and decision in the statutory meeting itself.

The AC discussed the matter threadbare and it was resolved that a broad-based 5-Member Committee, consisting of two principals of government colleges will be constituted to work out the details of ways and means with regard to Summer Vacation and Winter Recess for both Colleges and the University. The Committee shall submit its report within a period of two months.

AC:19:19 To consider the grant of temporary affiliation to Govt. Model College, Tawang, Tawang District Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that Govt. Model College, Tawang has started functioning without affiliation from RGU. The college authority has however, applied through proper channel and thus a screening committee was constituted. The committee is yet to furnish its report. On a positive report from the screening committee an inspection committee is likely to conduct physical verification covering all requirements as per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation in connection with grant of Temporary affiliation.

Since, the college has started functioning and hundreds of students already enrolled it was proposed that the University Authority may consider giving temporary affiliation subject to completion of all official formalities like screening and physical inspection of the college.

The AC resolved to screen the application within a period of 3 days. It was decided to constitute a 3-Member Inspection Committee and authorized University authority to decide it administratively subject to ratification by next AC.

AC:19:20 To consider the grant of temporary affiliation to Govt. Law College, Jote, Itanagar, Arunacha, Pradesh.

The AC noted that the University had recently issued NOC for onward submission to the BCI, New

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Delhi. The NOC could not suffice to the requirements as the BCI is asking for Temporary Affiliation Certificate from the affiliating body. And therefore, now the Govt. agency (DH&TE) is requesting the University for grant of affiliation to the college for furthering the BCI recognition processes. The college authority has applied through proper channel and thus a screening committee was constituted. The committee is yet to furnish its report. On a positive report from the screening committee an inspection committee is likely to conduct physical verification covering all requirements as per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation in connection with grant of Temporary affiliation.

Since, the college is a Govt. run one and professional in nature, it was proposed that the University Authority may consider giving temporary affiliation subject to completion of all official formalities like screening and physical inspection of the college.

The AC resolved to screen the application within a period of 3 days. It was decided to constitute a 3-Member Inspection Committee and authorized University authority to decide it administratively subject to ratification by next AC.

AC:19:21 To consider the renewal of temporary affiliation to Tadar Taniang Govt. College, Nyapin, Kurung Kumey District, Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Prof. H.K. Sharma, Dean, faculty of Languages for conducting physical verification covering all requirements as per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation in connection with renewal of Temporary affiliation to Tadar Taniang Govt. College, Nyapin, Kurung Kumey District, Arunachal Pradesh. The committee visited the college on 17th May, 2017.

The AC perused and approved renewal of temporary affiliation to Tadar Taniang Govt. College, Nyapin, Kurung Kumey District, Arunachal Pradesh.

AC:19:22 Permission to introduce BA-BEd & BSc-BEd. Integrated 4 years course from the session 2018-19 at Donyi Polo B.Ed College, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that on request the college was issued NOC by the University for furthering their recognition with NCTE and accordingly the NCTE has given approval for running of the two integrated courses from the session 2017-18. As per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation the college could be permitted to run the courses only after a physical inspection by the affiliating university. The physical inspection committee has not been constituted so far as the competent authority desired that such matters need prior discussion in the statutory bodies first.

The AC perused and approved the introduction of course(s) subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:

- i) To appoint required number of qualified teachers as per NCTE Regulations with adequate infrastructure facility.
- ii) The College should start any one of the two, i.e. either B.A B.Ed. or B.Sc B.Ed course at a time.

AC:19:27 Agenda items from Examination Branch

1 Discontinuation of Special and Supplementary Examination at both UG and PG Level

The AC noted that as recommended by the Academic Council in its 18th Meeting held on 27th April 2017 vide item No. AC:18:32(A), a three member committee was constituted to examine the proposal to discontinue the Special and Supplementary Examination at both UG and PG Level under the Chairmanship of Prof. Utpal Bhattacharjee.

The committee held its meeting on 6th October 2017 and submitted its recommendation (ANNEXURE-A). The committee has clearly stated that no neighboring Universities conduct supplementary examination and conducting such examinations in middle of a semester has more negative impact than its positive outcomes.

However, the committee recommended conducting supplementary examinations of odd semester back papers of both UG and PG with the even semester examinations and even semester back papers with the odd semester examination.

On one hand the committee stated that no neighboring universities conduct supplementary examinations and conducting such examination in the middle of a semester has more negative impacts and on the other hand the committee recommended to conduct supplementary examinations of odd semester back papers of both UG and PG with the even semester examinations and even semester back papers with the odd semester examination which will have more negative impact on the IV semester appearing students of PG and VI semester appearing students of UG.

However, the implementation of recommendation given by the committee may create problem to conduct the examination in proper way. Because as per recommendation of one committee if we are going to abolish three chances than there is no need to conduct special examination of different semester with the examination of odd semester as well as even semester. Therefore it is proposed that only one option should be extended to the students i.e. abolition of three chances and give fixed tenure to complete the degree or maximum three chances with special examination of different semester with examination of odd semester and even semesters. To avoid more complicacy, it is proposed to discontinue conducting supplementary examinations with immediate effect.

The AC deferred the item to next Academic Council.

Abolition of Three Chances to Clear Back Paper

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The AC noted that as recommended by the Academic Council in its 18th Meeting held on 27th April 2017 vide item No. AC:18:32(D), a committee was constituted to examine the maximum 3(three) chanced to clear a particular semester under the Chairmanship of Prof. R. C. Parida.

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The committee held its meeting on 19th July 2017 and recommended to abolish the provision of 3(three) chances to clear back paper. The candidate(s) at UG level may be allowed to clear back paper(s) within 6 years (ANNEXURE-B). The committee also recommended that this shall not be applicable to PG and existing system shall be continued.

The AC also noted that the period to complete all the paper/ degree should not be more than five years. This procedure is followed by the Dibrugarh University. In case of Gauhati University one has to clear all back paper before taking the admission in 5th semester. This should be applicable to the PG, UG, and LLB etc. The tenure should be normal time period with additional two years in all cases.

The AC discussed the matter at length and approved to abolish three chances to clear back papers and allow to clear the course within a period of six (6) years.

Proposal to do away with the countersignature of HoD on PhD Thesis:

The AC noted that the existing system of obtaining countersignature of the Head of the Department in the Ph.D. thesis needs to be deleted abolished from the Ph.D. Regulations. There are no such guidelines from UGC. Many universities do not follow this system.

The AC decided to continue with the existing system.

4 On delay in declaration of PG results in time:

The AC noted that there is representation of PG students that there is always delay in declaration PG results. It has been observed that delay is basically due to non-submission of evaluated scripts by the faculty members in time. Therefore, it is proposed that the examiners/evaluators should evaluate the scripts within 10 days from the date of receipt of the script and submit the same to the examination branch so that results of PG can be declared in time.

The AC discussed the matter and decided that the evaluation of answer scripts by the examiners should be completed within a period of 15 days after the receipt of answer scripts by the examiners. The CoE should obtain receipt from the concerned teacher(s) and the results will declared within a period of 45 days after the last date of examination.

5 Evaluation of UG script in different Evaluation Centres:

The AC noted that though there are four evaluation centres for evaluation of UG answer scripts except St. Claret College centre other three evaluation centres did not extended their co-operation for evaluation of the answer script in the months of May-June 2017 and for which the examination branch had to face lot of problem for declaration of results in time. The same thing also happened in the year 2013. Therefore, now the question arises whether such centres should be allowed to continue for evaluating the UG answer scripts or some other techniques should be adopted for the same. In this regard identification of experienced teachers in respective colleges and evaluation of the scripts with such teachers may be one of the solutions under the direct control of the Controlled of Examinations, RGU.

The AC decided to continue the existing four Zonal Evaluation Centres and more evaluation centres shall be set up in due course administratively. All the teachers should co-operate in the

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evaluation process to facilitate the University to declare the results in time. The Council also noted that evaluation of answer scripts is mandatory for all the college teachers and deviation from this by way of boycotting/strike shall amount to jeopardizing the career of their own students.

AC:19:28 Any other item

Agenda items from the Department of History: 1.

To bring PhD programme under Semester Mode:

The AC noted that in view of the problem arising out of Registered Ph.D. candidates not submitting progress report while some not registering after admission, it has been agreed that the Ph.D. programme must be semester based. This would help eliminate non-serious students. In such a case modalities have to be updated on the procedure required from part time scholars.

It was resolved to continue the present system.

To make PhD programme an integrated one: ii)

The AC noted that in accordance to the UGC (Minimum standard and procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degree) Regulation 2016, 3.2. Ph.D. should be made into an integrated programme in the same institution, while retaining provision for JRF/SLET and in-Service teachers. Lateral entry may be totally discouraged.

The AC noted the same.

To review on exemption of entrance for M.Phil degree holders from other states:

The AC noted that in the interview for Ph.D. admissions, it was discovered in the Department of History that many of the in-service candidates from other states had been exempted from appearing in the entrance on the basis of their M.Phil degree. A majority of the degree were in distance mode without certificate for course work. The application form needs to be updated for filling in the details to avoid such discrepancy. It is also pertinent to point out that our University has a regulation which is clear about eligible in-service candidates to be from affiliating colleges.

The AC decided that M.Phil degrees from other states obtained through Distance Education mode without course work certificate shall not be admitted for PhD (Direct entry). A Notification in this regard should be issued immediately.

Agenda items from the Department of Anthropology: 2.

Regarding eligibility for admission to MA in Anthropology.

The AC noted that as per RGU Prospectus 2017-18, page No. 17, clause 5.5, wherein it is mentioned that for admission to MA in Anthropology 'candidate with a graduation either in Science or Social Sciences shall be eligible to apply'. Such statement has made many candidates who are from non-allied disciplines such as engineering, computer, commerce, agricultural science etc. which are not at all relevant to Anthropology are eligible to apply, as a result the. quality teaching in Anthropology cannot be fulfilled. So, this may be modified to 'candidates with a graduation in allied disciplines shall be eligible to apply.'

In regard to allied disciplines for admission to MA course in Anthropology, the AC decided that

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disciplines will be identified by the concerned Department for admission to Anthropology programmes.

Regarding question pattern of common entrance test for admission to MA in Anthropology.

The AC noted that as per RGU Prospectus 2017-18, page No. 13, clause 3 & 4 of RGU Prospectus 2017-2018, it is mentioned that all the 100 multiple choice questions (MCQs) will examine language ability, reasoning, general awareness, mathematical aptitude/data interpretation and analytical skills. With a view to elevate the quality teaching of Anthropology in master's level, the Dept. of Anthropology is proposing to change it as "100 MCQs of which 25 MCQs shall examine language ability, reasoning, general awareness, mathematical aptitude/data interpretation and analytical skills and 75 MCQs from the domain subject."

The AC decided that the existing system will continue.

RGUCET-2018 (for Faculty of Engineering & Technology)

The Department of CSE, RGU proposes to conduct RGUCET Examination for Department of CSE during April 2018. Also the final year students of relevant disciplines may be permitted to appear in RGUCET-2018 since it is the norm across all engineering examinations in India. The proposal was placed to AC for perusal and consideration.

The AC perused and approved the same.

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As there was no any other item for discussion, the meeting came to an end with proposal of vote of thanks by the Secretary (Ex-officio) of the Academic Council the Registrar i/c.

> The AC perused and approved modified syllabus of Paper 204: E-filing in 2nd Semester of the Diploma in Computerized Accounting.

> Permission to introduce BA-BEd & BSc-BEd. Integrated 4 years course from the session 2018-20 at Mudo Tamo Memorial B.Ed College, Ziro, Arunachal Pradesh.

The AC noted that an inspection committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Prof. J. sahoo, Dean, FE, for conducting physical verification covering all requirements as per UGC (affiliation of College's by University) Regulation in connection with granting of permission to Mudo Tamo Memorial B.Ed College, Ziro, Arunachal Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh for introducing BA-BEd & BSc-BEd. Integrated 4 years course. The committee visited the college on 9th Feb., 2018. The report of the inspection committee was placed to AC.

The AC perused and decided that the approval already given to Donyi-Polo B.Ed College, Itanagar to start 4 years integrated BA-B.Ed course from the Academic Session 2018-19 shall be kept in abeyance till the modalities are worked out by the University. It was also decided that the proposal to introduce 4 years BA-B.Ed & B.Sc-BEd. Course from the session 2018-19 at Mudo Tamo Memorial B.Ed College, Ziro shall also be kept in abeyance and this may be communicated to Principals of the concerned colleges. In this context, a workshop is scheduled on 9th March, 2018 and the Principals of both the colleges should be invited to attend the workshop.

AC:20:15 To grant permission to start LLM course at Arunachal Law Academy, Naharlagun.

> The AC noted that the Principal of Arunachal Law Academy, Lekhi, Naharlagun has submitted an application for the introduction of LLM course in their college from the academic session 2018-19. The application of the College was screened by a Screening committee under the chairmanship of Prof. PK Panigrahi on 16th Oct., 2017. On the positive recommendation of the committee, a four member Inspection committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. S.K. Singh, Dean, faculty of Social Sciences was constituted for physical inspection of the college. The team visited the college on 21st Dec., 2017.

> The AC deferred the item to the next Academic Council. It was decided to collect analogy from other states related to introduction of LLM course in private Law colleges affiliated to Central Universities.

Intimation regarding approval of additional teaching positions for strengthening the faculty of Education. AC:20:16 The AC noted that the UGC vide letter No. F.15-5/2012(CU) Vol.IV, dated 30th January, 2018 approved to f up the gap to meet the requirement of additional teaching positions to run B.P.Ed. course with 2 years duration as per new norms prescribed in NCTE regulations, 2014 for strengthening of Faculty of Education

(Dept. of Phy. Edu.) as per details below:-

The AC perused and approved creation of 03 additional teaching positions to run BPEd course with a view to strengthen the Faculty of Education.

To discuss on the preparation of syllabuses under Digital Initiatives for Higher Education and SWAYAM as AC:20:17 per MOOC Regulations to be introduced in the University.

> The AC noted that the Academic Council in its last meeting held on 12th Oct., 2017 has noted that the University is actively pursuing for the implementation of the Digital Initiatives for Higher Education and SWAYAM by the Govt. of India. The MHRD has issued directives to all the universities to take up various digital initiatives for furthering higher education. Some of the thrust areas being Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC), National Academic Depository (NAD), National Digital Library (NDL) etc.

> The MOOC Regulations as made available in the MHRD's website was placed for perusal by the AC for bein adopted and implemented in totality by the University.

> The AC deliberated the matter and MOOC Regulations were approved in principle. And, it was decided to place the item in the next AC for detailed discussion on the syllabus to introduce the same in the University.

The AC deliberated on the matter and it was decided that 12 University Departments shall opt for one Open Elective Paper in 3rd Semester under MOOC Course. They are; i) CSE, ii) Geography, iii) Chemistry, iv Commerce, v) Zoology, vi) Mathematics, vii) Physics, viii) ECE, ix) Mass Communication, x) Anthropology, xi) Sociology and xii) Botany. The members appealed other departments to opt Open Elective Pape under MOOC.

AC:20:18 To review the duration of vacation for the University departments and affiliated colleges.

> The AC noted that the Academic Council in its last meeting held on 12th Oct., 2017 has noted that the University through its constituted committee has prepared the Academic Calendar following the UGC Regulation, 2010 and kept sufficient Vacation period when days of both Summer and Winter recess is taken together. If the days in both are taken together a total of 56 days was given i.e equal to 8 weeks. The UGC guideline is very clear that the working days are to be counted on day basis and not on hourly basis. And since, the govt. run colleges are now falling under 5 days a week pattern the present arrangement has been made with a view to give a balanced durations for both odd and even semester in an academic calendar year. With the total shifting of the university courses to semester system, the present balancing is justified.

> Meanwhile, it may be pertinent to mention that the Summer Vacation Period for the summers i.e. 5th June -7th July 2017 was passed in the 16th AC meeting held on 22nd April, 2016. However, there was resentment expressed by APCTA on it but it was placed in AC and with the direction of the AC a committee was constituted, which further nullified the request on the ground that as per UGC guidelines the Academic Calendar need further improvement and the request of APCTA held no water. The APCTA again expressed



its resentment and demanded the university authority to review the vacation period. They even resorted to non-cooperation movements and even boycotted RGU examinations and evaluation works, despite the assurance from the Vice-Chancellor during his interaction with APCTA representatives that the issue of vacation period in respect of affiliated colleges shall be reviewed in the next Academic Council Meeting and till then status quo be maintained, while justifying the fact that a decision arrived at a statutory body's meeting cannot be diverted or modified by a Vice-Chancellor in his personal official capacity and thereby needs to be placed again for deliberation and decision in the statutory meeting itself.

The AC discussed the matter threadbare and it was resolved that a broad-based 5-Member Committee, consisting of two principals of government colleges will be constituted to work out the details of ways and means with regard to Summer Vacation and Winter Recess for both Colleges and the University. The Committee shall submit its report within a period of two months.

Subsequently, the broad-based 5-Member Committee comprising of Prof. Tasi Kaye, Dean, Commerce & Management, RGU as Chairman, Prof. U. Bhattacharjee, Dean, FBS&IT, RGU, Dr. N.T. Rikam, Principal, DNGC, Itanagar, and Dr. Milorai Modi, Principal, JNC, Pasighat as members and Dr. David Pertin, Joint Registrar (Academic & Conference), RGU as convenor held the meeting on 18th December, 2017 and submitted its report, with recommendations and suggestions.

The AC deliberated on the matter and approved total vacation period (inclusive of summer vacation and winter recess) of 68 days for both affiliated colleges and university from the next Academic Year 2018-19.

AC:20:19 Discontinuation of Special and Supplementary Examination at both UG and PG Level.

The AC noted that Academic Council in its 19th meeting held on 12th Oct., 2017 vide item no. AC:19:27 (1), has noted the 18th Meeting recommendations of the Academic Council held on 27th April 2017 vide item No. AC:18:32(A), that a three member committee was constituted to examine the proposal to discontinue the Special and Supplementary Examination at both UG and PG Level under the Chairmanship of Prof. Utpal Bhattacharjee.

The committee held its meeting on 6th October 2017 and submitted its recommendation. The committee has clearly stated that no neighboring Universities conduct supplementary examination and conducting such examinations in middle of a semester has more negative impact than its positive outcomes.

However, the committee recommended conducting supplementary examinations of odd semester back papers of both UG and PG with the even semester examinations and even semester back papers with the odd semester examination.

On one hand the committee stated that no neighboring universities conduct supplementary examinations and conducting such examination in the middle of a semester has more negative impacts and on the other hand the committee recommended to conduct supplementary examinations of odd semester back papers of both UG and PG with the even semester examinations and even semester back papers with the odd semester examination which will have more negative impact on the IV semester appearing students of PG and VI semester appearing students of UG.

However, the implementation of recommendation given by the committee may create problem to conduct the examination in proper way. Because as per recommendation of one committee if we are going to abolish three chances than there is no need to conduct special examination of different semester with the



examination of odd semester as well as even semester. Therefore, it is proposed that only one option should be extended to the students, i.e. abolition of three chances and give fixed tenure to complete the degree or maximum three chances with special examination of different semester with examination of odd semester and even semesters. To avoid more complicacy, it was proposed to discontinue conducting supplementary examinations with immediate effect. However, the item was deferred by the AC to the next Academic Council meeting for further deliberations.

The AC discussed the matter and decided to continue with the Supplementary Examination as per earlier resolution of the AC. The Council did not approve the proposal of conducting Special Examination at bot UG and PG level henceforth.

AC:20:20 On the introduction of ABO Blood group certificate and RH Blood and reflection of blood group on the Identity Cards of the students of RGU.

The AC noted that the proposal to introduce ABO Blood group certificate and RH Blood and its reflection in the Identity Cards of the students of Rajiv Gandhi University. In this regard, a letter has been received from Prof. H. Vokendro S, Head, Department of Anthropology, wherein he requested the University authority to permit the Department of Anthropology to issue such certificate to the students of Rajiv Gandhi University and making it as a mandatory component in the ID card and also to make it reflected in the University Prospectus.

The AC approved the proposal and also to collect Rs. 50/- only as Blood Testing Fee.

AC:20:21 To consider the revised fee structure for various courses.

The AC noted that a 4 member Fee Structure Revision Committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Prof. Sumpam Tangjang, Dept. of Botany for the revision of various fee structures that are to be introduced from the Academic Session 2018-19. The Fee Structure Review Committee comprised of (1) Prof. Sumpam Tangjang, Dept. of Botany, as Chairman, (2) Prof. S.K. Jena, Dept. of Commerce and (3) Dr. Nani Jose, JR (Exams. & Regn.) as Members, (4) Mr. T. Nath, SO (Exams) and (5) Mr. S. Paul, SO (Academic) as Co-opted Members and (6) Dr. David Pertin, JR (Acad. & Conf.) as Convenor had two sittings on 19th and 21 Feb., 2018, and reviewed the fees in line of the following:

- 1. To review the current fee structure of RGU.
- 2. To increase/decrease the item wise fee.
- 3. To identify new fee items.

After thorough review and deliberations on the current fee structure of various courses, hostel, examination, Registration, affiliation, etc. related fees of RGU and need for generation of revenue as well as considering fee structure of neighboring universities the committee suggested the following;

- To increase the fees of various courses, hostel rent and examination, affiliation related matters. The proposed fee structure was attached as an Annexure.
