

The EC noted that the minutes of the 22nd Executive Council meeting held on 29th November, 2018 were circulated amongst the members and no comments were received from any of the members so far.

The EC confirmed the Minutes of the 22^{nd} Meeting of the Executive Council held on 29^{th} November, 2018.

EC 24:02: To consider the Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decision of the 22nd Executive Council meeting held on 29th November, 2018.

The EC noted that in pursuance of the decisions taken in 22nd Executive Council meeting, the University Authority has implemented and executed the decisions of the Council, wherever applicable.

The EC accepted the Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decisions of the 22nd Executive Council meeting held on 29th November, 2018.

EC 24:03: To confirm the Minutes of the 23rd Meeting of the Executive Council (Special) held on 8 March, 2019.

The EC noted that the Special Meeting of the Executive Council was held to provide an extended panel for consideration of appointment of Chancellor of RGU. The panel prepared in the EC meeting was communicated to the MHRD for further necessary action from their end. The EC also noted that the minutes of the meeting was read out and sealed

The EC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

EC:24:05: Constitution of a Roster Committee

The EC noted that the matter was discussed in the 23rd Meeting of the Academic Council held on 14th March, 2019, wherein, the Chairman apprised the members that the University is going to float advertisement for 17 vacant teaching positions sanctioned by the UGC for which a Roster Committee will be constituted soon.

The University is also going to float advertisement for 47 teaching positions sanctioned by UGC including the positions of Dept. of Security Studies.

The EC after thorough deliberation on the matter decided that the aforementioned sanctioned teaching positions will be governed by the Roster System on the basis of MHRD Roster points. The EC felt that for vacant positions already sanctioned earlier shall be governed by old roster and new positions shall be governed by new roster.

EC:24:06: On the introduction of Leave Pass Book in RGU

The EC noted that in the 23rd Meeting of the Academic Council held on 14 March, 2019, wherein, it was decided that Leave Passport format shall be issued to all the HoDs for recording and maintaining leave records of regular faculty members of the University. The same shall be applicable for the academic administrators and non-teaching staff of the University.

The EC perused and radified the action taken by the university authority.

A say man narana sarah Regisheri EC:24:07: On the introduction of Health Diary system in RGU

The EC noted that in the 23rd Meeting of the Academic Council held on 14 March, 2019, wherein, it was decided that the University will introduce Health Diary for all its regular employees and students so as to enable them to keep and maintain their health records intact.

The EC perused and ratified the action taken by the university authority.

EC:24:08: Withdrawal of Executive Council Resolution No.EC:5:05 on the award of construction work orders

The EC noted that the Executive Council in its 5th Meeting vide Resolution No. EC 5:05 had ratified the decision of the University for the award of Minor Work Order (Construction). In fact, it was the Rajiv Gandh University Contractors Welfare Association, which demanded that all construction works should be given to them as done in the past under erstwhile Arunachal University. However, the office bearers have been informed that in view of the directive from the MHRD, New Delhi, all big projects be handed over to the Central Govt. Agencies like, NBCC, CPWD, BRO, etc. In such a situation, the 6th Building/Construction Committee decided that minor works of smaller amounts shall be given to the members of the Association on Work Order basis. The upper limit of such work orders shall be 25.00 lakhs only. All such works need to be ratified by the EC and FC of the University. The EC resolution read as under;

The Executive Council deliberated on the matter and ratified the decision taken in the 6th Building/Construction Committee Meeting of the University regarding the minor works of smaller amounts to be given on Work Order basis. The upper limit of such Work Orders shall be Rs.25.00 lakhs only".

The Competent Authority of the University proposes withdrawal of the said Executive Council resolution and endorses that the University must follow the GFR-2017 Guidelines in toto.

The Executive Council perused and approved the proposal. Further, it was decided by the EC that;

- i) The University must follow the GFR 2017 guidelines in toto.
- ii) Priority emphasis should be on e-tendering.
- iii) Regulation of UGC (Drast) regarding construction should be taken in to account.
- iv) Empanelment of contractors/vendors shall be decided after thorough evaluation.

EC:24:09: To ratify the grant of Permanent affiliation to Govt. College, Yachuli, Lower Subansiri District, Arunachal Pradesh.

The EC noted that Academic Council in its 21st Meeting held on 13th June, 2018, vide resolution No. AC:21:28 has granted permanent affiliation status to Govt. College, Yachuli, subject to ratification by the Executive Council, based on Screening Committee's report

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and subsequently on recommendation of an Inspection Committee as the college fulfills all the basic criteria.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority.

EC:24:10: To ratify the decisions taken by the University Authority on the following issues as under:

The EC noted that;

(i) Dr. Daniel Mize, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Zoology has been granted the Study Leave for 3 (three) months w.e.f. 10.04.2019 to 12.09.2019 for his training on Technology of Movement Ecology at Institute of Avian Research (IAR) at Wilhelmshaven, Germany under the DBT Overseas Associate ship 2017-18 scheme.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority.

(ii) Dr. Ravi Ranjan Kumar, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Social Work of this University has been granted EOL for a period of 1 (one) year w.e.f 01.01.2019 (F/N) to enable him to join as Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), Bihar Police Service, Government of Bihar.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority on the items (i) and (ii) mentioned above;

The EC also noted that those teachers, who are going on leave during the examination period should give the name of the teacher, who will do examination work in his/her behalf.

EC:24:11: Proposal to change the nomenclature of Guest Assistant Professor to Guest Faculty

The EC noted that the university has received a letter from the Secretary, UGC, New Delhi, bearing No.F.25-1/2018(PS/MISC.), dated 28 January, 2019 regarding enhancement of the rate of honorarium for Guest Faculty.

Further, it is to mention that this University has designated Guest Faculty as Guest Assistant Professor since many years. It is also to inform that some subject/technical experts were engaged as Guest Faculty with the remuneration @ Rs. 500/- per lecture who are engaged on demand of concerned HoD without any interview or selection in the department of Physical Education and Mass Communication.

In this regard, it is proposed to charge the designation of Guest Assistant Professor to Guest Faculty. Moreover, Guest faculty (who are engaged in Physical Education and Mass Communication) may be given different nomenclature/designation.

On the basis of recommendation of the Committee, the EC perused and approved the proposal as per the UGC guidelines/directive. The University shall implement the enhanced rate of honorarium of Guest Faculty from the next academic session - 2019-20. Further it was decided that;

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 Interview must be conducted for the post of Guest Faculty and proper procedure should be followed accordingly.

The same committee will also look into the positions of Guest Faculty, Department wise and develop format for API score, performance report for interview purpose. The Committee will also look into the justification and teaching work load, number of positions, etc shall be taken into account as the sole criterion for appointment of Guest Faculty.

iii) Experts should be included in the interview board after obtaining approval

from the Chairman through due process.

EC:24:12: On sharing of sanctioned posts of faculty equally in the department of Fine Arts & the department of Music

The EC noted that currently there are 3 (three) Under Graduate honours courses being run in the Department i.e. Bachelor of Fine Arts in Painting, Sculpture and Bachelor of Music in Hindustani Classical Music (Vocal). The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Painting and Sculpture are different from Bachelor of Music.

In this regard, if the natures of the courses are different, then the Sanctioned posts may be shared

The Executive Council perused and decided to share the faculty positions of the department of Fine Arts & the department of Music in the following manner:

Further, HoD shall explore appointment of resource person/guest faculty for extra course/paper specialization.

It was also decided that the Department of Fine Arts and Music will be divided into two separate independent departments and staff will be shared in the ratio 4:3. Meanwhile, the University would request UGC for more faculty members (7 each).

EC: 24:13: To consider the UGC approved teaching positions for the following existing and new Departments

The EC noted that in response to this office letter EG-268/UGC/2007, dated 13.02.2019, the UGC, New Delhi & Commission in its 539th meeting held on 26th February, 2019 has considered and approved creation of following teaching posts, vide F.No.1-1/2013(CU)Vol-XVII, dated 6th March, 2019.

The UGC approved and sanctioned posts are shown below:

The EC also noted that the above approval is subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions;

- 1. University may fill up the teaching position at the earliest and explore the possibility to allocate the vacant teaching position in the new areas where the requirement of teaching positions in a particular department is more needed.
- 2. The University should strictly adhere to the reservation policy for SC/ST/OBC/PH/EWS as per Govt. of India/UGC guidelines while filling up the teaching position.
- 3. The UGC regulation of 2018 relating to Minimum qualification for appointment of teacher and other Academic Staff in University and Colleges and measures for the maintenance of standard in Higher Education and as amended from time to time should be strictly followed.

The Executive Council perused and approved the proposal. It was decided to appoint department wise Coordinators for the new Departments sanctioned by UGC subject to fulfillment of following requirements:

1. BoS shall be constituted and its recommendation shall be placed to AC/EC for approval.

2. New Departments will have intake capacity of 12 seats each for department.

EC: 24:14: To discuss on the inter-se Seniority between the direct recruited and teachers promoted under CAS

The EC noted that the matter was earlier decided by the Competent Authority and the same was placed in the 20th Meeting of the Executive Council held on 25 April, 2018 vide item No. EC:20:06 for ratification of the decision that the counting of seniority of Professors shall be from the date of their promotions under CAS. The EC further decided that since, it is a policy related decision and regular VC was on leave, the final decision will be taken by the regular Chairman of the Executive Council i.e. the Vice-Chancellor.

The inter-se seniority of direct recruit shall be determined with reference to the date of joining and for the teachers promoted under CAS with reference to the date of eligibility as indicated in the recommendation of the selection Committee of the respective candidates. The rules and regulations of the respective Central/State Government shall apply, for all other matters of seniority.

Further the EC noted that in this regard the University has sought legal advice from its Standing Counsel also and now the same is being placed before the Executive Council for perusal and decision. The detailed file noting and legal advice were placed to the Council for perusal.

The Executive Council perused and decided that with regard to inter-se seniority, the decision of Legal Advisor/Standing Counsel will be followed. As such, the University shall issue a fresh notification.

The decision of Legal Advisor/Standing Counsel is that "The inter-se seniority of direct recruit shall be determined with reference to the date of joining and for the teachers promoted under CAS with reference to the date of eligibility as indicated in the recommendation of the Selection committee of the respective candidates. The rules and regulations of the respective Central/State Government shall apply for all other matters of seniority"

EC: 24:15: Items from the 15th Finance Committee:

The following items recommended by the 15^{th} meeting of the Finance Committee held on 11^{th} Dec., 2018 were placed to EC:

(1) The EC noted that the University authority has submitted 19 project proposals worth ₹ 11,914.00 lakhs to MHRD vide letter No. RGU/DEV-389/2018 (HEFA) dated 9th Nov 2018 for loan under HEFA as they were approved by the 13th meeting of FC held on 21 May, 2017 and 18th meeting of EC held on 22/05/2017.

The 15th FC in its meeting held on 11 Dec 2018 has approved the proposal as considered by the MHRD amounting to ₹ 6659.00 lakhs and placed to 24^{th} EC for

consideration.

The EC perused and approved the above proposals under HEFA loan.

(2) To approve additional financial implication for filling up new teaching posts sanctioned by UGC for various departments.

The EC noted that the FC in its 15th Meeting held on 11 December, 2018 vide resolution No. FC: 15:07, has noted that UGC vide its letter No F. No. 1-1/2013(CU) Vol-VIII dated 1 June, 2018 has sanctioned 17 (Seventeen) teaching positions (5 Associate professors and 12 Assistant Professor) for various departments of the University vide UGC letter F.No. 1-1/2013 (CU) Vol-VIII dated 1 June 2018. It also noted that for filling up the posts, the University requires an additional annual financial allocation for Rs. 2.07 Crores Approx.

The Finance committee perused and approved additional financial implication for filling up the new teaching posts as sanctioned by UGC and recommended to EC for approval.

The Executive Council perused and approved the same.

(3) To consider the Pay enhancement of contractual and contingency employees engaged by the University.

The EC noted that the 15th FC perused and approved 15% increase in the pay of contractual employees and 10% increase in addition to the existing monthly wage rate of the Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh as special allowance for contingency employees engaged by the University. The FC recommended the item to EC for approval vide resolution No. FC: 15:11: (a) (i).

Regarding FC:15:11(a)(i), the EC noted that the 16th FC took note of the comments received from MHRD and recommended for enhancement of pay of contractual employees at par with neighbouring universities and in r/o of contingency staff the committee recommended to pay as per the Government of Arunachal Pradesh rates.

The Executive council perused and approved 15% increase in the pay of contractual employees as recommended by the 15th FC and not approved 10% increase of contingency employees employed by the University in addition to the existing monthly wage rate of the Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh as per the directive of MHRD. However, the decision regarding enhancement of pay of contractual employees at par with neighbouring universities will be taken after examining the same by a committee.

- (4) To consider procurement of new Vehicles for Statutory Authorities of the University.

 The EC noted that 15th FC approved procurement of new SUVs for Vice Chancellor and Registrar of the University. At the same time, the comments/observations of MHRD were noted by the EC.
 - a) For Vice Chancellor Toyota Fortuner (4x4) at a cost of Rs. 35.00 lakh approx.
 - b) For Registrar Scorpio at cost of Rs.16.00 lakh approx.

The FC recommended the item to EC for approval vide resolution No. FC: 15:11: (a) (ii).

The Executive Council perused and approved the proposal in principle. The EC further decided to follow Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh guidelines in this regard and collect necessary documents regarding purchase of staff cars, etc. However, the University will adhere to HRD Ministry's objection/comments regarding the item. It was decided to write to MHRD with proper justification along with supporting documents.

(5) Creation of Corpus Fund for University out of the interest earned from time to time from University funds.

The EC noted that to meet up necessary and required expenditure, the University should create a Corpus Fund A/c for the University from the revenue earned by the University, from self-financing courses, etc. any surplus/revenue earned, interest earned through corpus fund shall be deposited to the corpus fund. The FC recommended the item to EC for approval vide resolution No. FC: 15:11: (a) (iii).

The committee suggested for constitution of a committee for preparation of bye laws for operation of corpus fund. The item shall be placed again in the next FC.

(6) To decide on the voluntary retirement scheme/one time settlement for Casual and Contingency Staff of Rajiv Gandhi University.

The EC noted that the 15th FC minutes vide item FC: 15:11:(iv) approved the voluntary retirement scheme/one time settlement for casual and contingency staff of Rajiv Gandhi University with 15 days wages for every completed year or part thereof exceeding six months with a maximum ceiling of 300 days as per Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh Office Memorandum vide No. SPWD-100/2005 dated 13 Aug 2007 as in the case of maximum days of E/L encashment of regular employees. The FC recommended the item to EC for approval vide resolution No. FC: 15:11: (a) (iv).

Further, the EC noted the objection/comments regarding the 15th FC resolution vide item No. FC: 15:11: (a) (iv) raised by MHRD would be adhered to.

However, the EC noted that the 18th EC resolution vide item EC:18:22, a three member committee was constituted to examine the matter and submit its report within 2 months.

The EC perused and decided that casual/contingency staff of the university, who have completed 60 years will be considered for voluntary retirement scheme/one time settlement and decision on the remaining staff, the item will be placed again to next FC for consideration.

EC: 24:16: To approve granting of higher Pay Level - 13 of 7 CPC pay matrix to Mr. Kurian Thomas, Deputy Registrar & re-designation of post.

The EC noted that Mr. Kurian Thomas, Deputy Registrar was appointed to the post of the Deputy Registrar's on 05/11/2013 (F/N). He has completed 5 (five) years of regular service to the post on 04/11/2018 (A/N). He has submitted representation requesting him to place in the higher Pay level-13 i.e. Rs. 1,23,100/- and post held by him may be redesignated as Joint Registrar.

On the request made by Mr. Kurian Thomas, Deputy Registrar, the University constituted a committee under the chairmanship of Prof. A. Mitra, Director, IQAC to look into the request of Mr. Kurian Thomas, Deputy Registrar. The committee convened its meeting on March 12, 2019. The committee scrutinized the ACR/APAR in respect of Mr. Kurian Thomas for the period of last 5 (five) years and also minutely perused the MHRD letter No.1.7/2015-U.II (2), dated 02.11.2017 and UGC letter No.11-1/2017 (CU), dated March' 2018 and recommended Mr. Kurian Thomas, Deputy Registrar to higher pay level-13 and subsequently re-designation of post held by him as Joint Registrar w.e.f. 05.11.2018. The recommendation of the committee, MHRD letter No.1.7/2015-U.II (2), dated 02.11.2017 and UGC letter No.11-1/2017 (CU), dated March' 2018 were placed before the Council.

The Executive Council perused and approved the proposal.

EC: 24:17: Granting of higher grade pay to Ms. Reena Nabam, Staff Nurse.

The EC noted that U.G.C. vide its letter No.F.59-2/2010 (CU), dated 25/7/2011 under XI Plan period had sanctioned 1 (one) post of Nurse with a Pay Band of Rs. 9300 – 34800/- &

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Grade Pay of Rs. 4200/-. Mrs. Reena Nabam was appointed against the said post in the Pay Band of Rs. 9300 – 34800/- & Grade Pay of Rs. 4200/-. Later, Mrs. Reena Nabam has represented office for re-designation of the post held by her to Staff Nurse and granting of Pay Band of Rs. 4600/- which is the actual Pay Band of the Staff Nurses as per the letter No.Z 28015/70/99-N, dated 9/9/1999 of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. University has taken up the matter with UGC for re-designation of post held by her to Staff Nurse and granting of higher Grade Pay of Rs. 4600/- (pre-revised) to Mrs. Reena Nabam. But UGC vide their letter No.F.3-4/2016 (JRC) RGU, dated 11/5/2016 allowed University for re-designation of her post as Staff Nurse and has not approved granting of higher Grade Pay stating that the matter is under consideration of the UGC/Ministry but till date no communication has been received from the UGC/MHRD. In other hand UGC had granted Grade Pay of Rs. 4600/- by abolishing the Grade Pay of Rs. 4200/- to the Staff Nurse of few other Central Universities as per MHRD letter No.19-16/2008-Desk (U), dated 12/7/2016.

It may be pertinent to mention that Ms. Reena's case was discussed in the 21st meeting of the EC held on 17th Sept., 2018 vide Resolution No. EC:21:06: (c), wherein it was resolved that her case may be disposed off administratively as per the directives of the MHRD, Dept. of Higher Education, GoI, New Delhi.

As per the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare there is no Grade Pay of Rs. 4200/- in the hierarchy of nursing staff. However, University constituted a Committee to look into the matter for granting of Grade Pay of Rs. 4600/- from the date of her appointment. The Committee after going through all the credential has submitted a report recommending to grant higher Grade Pay of Rs. 4600/- to Mrs. Reena Nabam, Staff Nurse from the date of her appointment.

The Executive Council perused and approved the proposal.

EC: 24:18: Reporting item, if any, with permission from the Chair.

The following reporting items were placed to the EC.

- (1) On the report prepared by Technical Committee (ICT) for the implementation of Online Admission System in RGU.

 The EC Noted and approved the same.
- (2) On the establishment of Placement Cell.

 The EC Noted and approved the same.
- (3) For approval of the Guidelines for Students Educational Excursion
 The EC Noted and approved the same.
- (4) It was proposed to constitute a committee to prepare University Calendar. The EC Noted and approved the same.

Items brought from 16th Finance Committee:

The EC noted para-wise comments/observations of MHRD on the resolutions of 15th FC vide item No. FC:15:11 (a) (i), (ii) and (iv) and accordingly the University was requested to suitably incorporate the comments in the minutes and revised minutes may be issued incorporating the instructions.

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- Regarding FC:15:11(a)(i), the EC noted that the 16th FC took note of the comments received from MHRD and recommended for enhancement of pay of contractual employees at par with neighbouring universities and in r/o of contingency staff the committee recommended to pay as per the Government of Arunachal Pradesh rates.

 The EC noted and approved the same.
- Regarding item No. 15:11(a) (ii), the EC members perused the comments received from Ms. Kiran Arora, Under Secretary vide letter F.No. 9-7/2014-IFD dated 20/03/2019 against FC agenda No. FC:16:01 and FC:16:05 and also the UGC letter No. F.20-6/2018 (CU) on the matter. It was decided that proper justification letter may be sent to MHRD along with supporting documents for consideration.
- Regarding FC15:11(a) (iv) the committee opined that the item may be reviewed and deferred in view of the observations made by MHRD and UGC.
- To consider and approve various proposals recommended by the Building Committee (Construction) in its 22nd meeting held on 01/03/2019.

 The EC noted para-wise comments of MHRD on the agenda items of 16th FC meeting related to various proposals recommended by the Building Committee held on 01.03.2019 and other items and decided that the university shall be complied with the MHRD directive and all major infrastructure projects shall be undertaken through project based funding through HEFA and in case of minor original works/repair works for campus development, etc shall be done subject to allocation/release of funds by UCC for the projects and all major infrastructure projects shall be undertaken based on funding through HEFA and in case of minor original works/repair works for campus development etc shall be done subject to allocation/release of funds by UGC for the projects.

The EC perused and approved various proposals recommended by the 22nd Building

Committee.

C: 24:19: Any other item with the permission of the Chair.

Under the item, the following points were discussed and resolved:

a) Outsourcing of Surveying firm for University Land
The District Administration has outsourced the survey work to ascertain the actual total land of Rajiv
Gandhi University to a third party and all the cost required for surveying of the campus has to be
borne by the University.


The EC noted and approved the same.

- b) Often a number of events/programmes are being hosted by the University which are organized centrally and at short notice. During such occasions, dignitaries are invited to grace the occasion from the State including Hon'ble Governor, Chief Minister and dignitaries from outside. To conduct such events, a large amount of money is being spent by the University. Hence, it is necessary that account on such expenditure be maintained, reported to FC/EC meeting to ensure accountability. The EC noted and approved the same.
- c) To confirm minutes of Official Language Implementation Committee (Raj Bhasha) meeting held on 26 March 2019.

The EC perused and approved the minutes.

d) It was brought to the notice of the administration that in the university campus two shops were illegally constructed, but so far no action was taken against the vendors.

The EC noted and decided to cease their contract and deed documents.



f) Financial Resources for running Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Area and its associated programmes. The EC noted that to run the project/research work, maintenance of equipment and contingency beyond 31/03/2019, the centre needs financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 15.00 lakh from UGC or from the internal resources of the university. The ongoing Advanced Postgraduate Diploma in

Biodiversity (APDB) course shall also be included in the budget.

The EC perused and approved the same.

g) On the matter related to refund of an amount of Rs.18,00,000/- over expenditure incurred by CPEB Project and interest earned to UGC by the Centre. The advisory committee meeting of biodiversity project decided to utilize the said amount for procurement of chemicals, glassware and consumables. It is proposed to refund the amount from overall interest of project account. It was decided that Dean, FLS will look after CPEB II till the third phase activities to look in to the following issues:

i) Heads of Departments related to Biodiversity/environment.

ii) Preparing the list of all equipments purchased under CPEB to bring under common facility and tariff if any. It may be finalized from internal and external use and modalities for use of equipments.

iii) Rationalizing the man power

iv) Books under CPEB to be organized and facilities to be made for e-resources.

v) PG Diploma course may be included under self finance mode

v) Publications of CPEB II may be finalized as per mandate.

The EC noted and approved the same.

h) Report on the amount spent on consumables by the Departments.

A committee is constituted under the Chairmanship of Director, IQAC in March 2019. The committee is suggested to submit the report at the earliest.

i) Regarding placement of a position.

The Vice Chancellor informed that he needs an Assistant Registrar (Confidential) for his Office. So, the senior-most PS may be placed to the post.

The EC perused and decided to do administratively as per need and rule.

The house unanimously was of the opinion that each and every item concerned with the University should come to EC for a fruitful discussion/consideration.

As there was no other item for discussion, the meeting came to an end with vote of thanks from the EX-officio-Secretary.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the Members. In his opening remarks, the Chairman informed the EC members that Rajiv Gandhi University was placed at 99th position in the NIRF Rankings 2019 of the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India. He further informed that for this achievement, the University received an Appreciation Message from the Hon'ble Governor of Arunachal Pradesh and Chief Rector of RGU, congratulating the University fraternity in achieving this success. In his message, Hon'ble Governor pointed out that – "This is a brilliant accomplishment and it reflects well on your leadership and good work of your faculty and the students of the University. As a premier institute of Higher Education in Arunachal Pradesh, you have set a good benchmark. Now, let us focus on our strengths and further improve the environment and come to single digit. I am sanguine that with honesty, transparency, vision and team spirit, we will be able to achieve this".

The following agenda items were then taken up for discussion and decisions taken.

EC:25:01 To approve the draft Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

The EC members noted that the University is in the final stage of entering into a revised Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the MHRD and UGC. The draft of the same has been already perused by MHRD and UGC and they have also extended their suggestions for modifications and incorporations therein. The draft was prepared by a committee chaired by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Rajiv Gandhi University Prof. Saket Kushwaha with (2) Registrar i/c Prof. Tomo Riba, (3) Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences Prof. S.K. Singh, (4) Dean, Faculty of Life Science Prof. R.K. Singh, (5) Director Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) Prof. Amitava Mitra, (6) Head, Department of Economics Prof. S.K. Nayak, (7) Joint Registrar (Academic & Conference) Dr. David Pertin, (8) Asst. Professor (Physical Education) Dr. Sambhu Prasad and (9) Section Officer (Academic) Mr. S. Paul as other members. The draft MoU along with Appendix and the first copy of the MoU signed earlier was placed to the EC.

The EC further noted that as per the requirement of the MoU, the MHRD and UGC desired that the draft MoU be placed, vetted and approved by the Executive Council for further course of action at the Ministry's level.

The EC perused and approved the Draft Tripartite MoU between MHRD, UGC and Rajiv Gandhi University.

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EC:25:02 To ratify the establishment of a Placement Cell and appointment of Professor in-charge.

The EC noted that the University has constituted a Placement Cell comprising of 16 members with Vice Chancellor as its Ex-Officio Chairman and Professor Tasi Kaye, Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management has been appointed as Professor in-charge of the Cell with Coordinator of Career Counselling Cell and Joint Registrar (Academic) as the Member Coordinator and Convenor of the said Cell respectively.

The EC noted that the Chief Rector of the University and the Hon'ble Governor of Arunachal Pradesh has keenly initiated the establishment of such Cells for overall improvement of Placement of University graduates.

The EC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

EC:25:03 To ratify the appointment of Dean of Academic Affairs

The EC noted that Prof. Sudhir Kumar Singh, Former Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences has been appointed as the Dean of Academic Affairs for a period of 3 years to oversee the matters pertaining to academic affairs in RGU.

The EC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

EC:25:04 To ratify the establishment of a Consultancy Board

The EC noted that the University has constituted a Consultancy Board comprising of 12 members with Vice Chancellor as its Ex-Officio Chairman and Joint Registrar (Academic & Conference) as the OSD cum Member Secretary of the said board.

The EC ratified the action taken by the University authority.

EC:25:05 Any other item with the permission of the Chair

Reporting Items:

A On European Union (EU) delegation visit to Rajiv Gandhi University

The Chairman informed the members that a delegation from the European Union (EU) visited Rajiv Gandhi University on 4 April 20-19. Their mission is to explore opportunities of collaboration in areas of research and innovation. The members of the delegation extended their support towards activating instruments to internalize future research and innovation initiatives. They also emphasized on the need for a mix of stakeholders in the research initiatives and suggested having a multi-disciplinary approach in conceptualizing the proposals, where the focus could be on new technologies and also on how they impact society.

B Fulbright Fellowship Programme

The Chairman apprised the members about the Fulbright Fellowship programme. He said the Department of Chemistry has already applied for Fulbright Fellowship and Anthropology is going to apply shortly. He expressed his hope that other related departments should also join and take advantage of the programme.

C Signing of MoU on Research Understanding between Indian Institute of Liver & Digestive Sciences (IILDS), a Unit of Liver Foundation, West Bengal and Rajiv Gandhi University

It was reported that a MoU has been signed on 18 April 2019 on Research Understanding between Indian Institute of Liver & Digestive Sciences (IILDS), A Unit of Liver Foundation, West Bengal and Rajiv Gandhi University on cooperation and implementation of the research project titled, "A Community based delivery of comprehensive HBV care in Arunachal Pradesh, India – Population Screening and Linkage to Care". The said project is being funded by John C. Martin Foundation Ltd. USA with

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LFWB/IILDS as the primary recipient of the grant and Rajiv Gandhi University, the sub recipient.

VC's Tour to Sylhet, Bangladesh

Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice Chancellor, Rajiv Gandhi University attended the First ever International Convention of Vice Chancellors which was held at Sylhet, Bangladesh on 6 April 2019.

Over 15 Vice Chancellors and Directors of various Universities/Institutions attended the Convention. The Chief Guest of the function was Dr. Dipu Moni, M.P., Minister, Ministry of Education, Govt. of the Peoples' Republic of Bangladesh, Prof. Abdul Mannan, Chairman, UGC of Bangladesh was also attended the programme as the dignitary. The main objective of the Convention was Academic collaboration between Universities in Bangladesh and Universities in India's North East.

E Summer Internship

The members felt that there is an urgent need for organizing short term exchange programmes (internship programmes in the University). Towards this, a committee shall be constituted to work out the modalities. The University proposes Summer Internship Programme in Rajiv Gandhi University from the next academic session. The Academic Calendar Committee should adjust timings for Summer Internship accordingly and accommodation/hospitality of student should be taken care of.

F Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR)

It is mandatory to submit APAR in the proposed revised format. Those teachers who are already submitted APARs should also submit APAR as per the revised format. The Chairman informed that a Committee shall be constituted for the purpose.

G On a letter received from the Commissioner to Hon'ble Governor of A.P. and Chief Rector, RGU

It was reported by the Chairman that the University received a letter from Commissioner to Governor regarding Works Study for Review of Establishment and Personnel at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar. It has therefore, become expedient to review the workload and working hand matching/ratio to have optimum functional efficiency as expected of Raj Bhavan. Accordingly, the University was requested to assign a Work Study Team from the concerned Department of the University headed by a competent Faculty to study the Work Study of Raj Bhavan.

As Rajiv Gandhi University has been entrusted to undertake the task, it was decided to carry out the assignment through Consultancy Mode with due importance.

H RGU Online Entrance Examination for the Academic Session 2019-20

It was apprised to the EC members that the University received approval for conducting Entrance Examinations from the designated Centres such as; Cotton College, Guwahati, J.N. College, Pasighat, Govt. College, Bomdila and IGGC, Tezu.

I To conduct Orientation workshop/Training programme for children of Campus Contingency/Contract workers

The Chairman put forwarded a proposal that the children of RGU contingency/contract labourers be given orientation workshop/training programme for skill development at the weekends with arrangement of food/refreshment to them. The EC members noted and approved the proposal.
