MINUTES OF THE 26TH MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL HELD ON 18TH JUNE, 2019

The 26th meeting of the Executive Council was held on 18.06.2019 in Vice-Chancellor's chamber at 2.30 p.m.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the members of the 26th EC meeting. The following agenda were then taken up for discussion and decisions taken.

EC 26:01: To ratify the decisions taken by the University Authority on the following issues as under:

(i) Mr. John Gainggamlung Gangmei, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Social Work of this University has been granted 6 (six) months Study leave w.e.f. 18.02.2019 to 16.08.2019 for his Ph. D research work at Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai, Mahararashtra.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority.

(ii) Mr. Mairembam Stelin Singh, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Zoology of this University has been granted 3 (three) years Study leave i.e. 01.08.2019 to 31.07.2022 for his Ph. D research work of Biochemistry in the School of Chemical and Life Science under regular category at Jamia Hamdard University, New Delhi.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority. However, the EC reviewed the decision and resolved to grant one year Study Leave to Mr. Mairembam Stelin Singh, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Zoology. It was also resolved to consider extension of the period of study leave upon receipt of progress report from the concerned institution.

(iii) Dr. Abhishek Kumar Yadav, Dept. of Hindi of this University has been granted EOL for a period of 1 (one) year i.e. 06.07.2019 to 05.07.2020 (F/N) to enable him to work on a research project at IIAS, Shimla. The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority.

(iv) Prof. S. Simon John, Director, Arunachal Institute of Tribal Studies (AITS) of this University is increby granted lien for a period of 1 (one) year i.e. from 07.06.2019 (F/N) onwards enabling him to join the post of Director, CIHCS, Dahung, Arunachal Pradesh.

The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority. The EC congratulated Dr. S. Simon John on his selection to the post of Director, Central Institute of Himalayan Cultural Studies (CIHCS), Dahung, West Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh (An autonomous Body of the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India) vide Order No. 3-222/2018/CIHCS/4621-28 dated 27.05.2019. The EC also resolved that looking into the scarcity of Senior Faculty in RGU, the EC resolved that lien shall not be extended after the expiry.

Those on lien and finishing in near future be given a gentle reminder to join their respective positions.

(v) Prof. (Mrs.) N. C. Singh, Dept. of Geography of this University has been granted 230 (two hundred thirty) days Child Care Leave w.e.f. 16.05.2019 to 31.12.2019. The Executive Council ratified the action taken by the university authority. Further, the EC discussed and resolved to grant 6 months CCL to be given at the first instance and decided to constitute a committee to look into the matter and extension shall not be given when already on leave.

EC 26:02: To discuss on the issues endorsed from the Establishment Branch of the University:

(1) To decide on the recommendation of the committee in respect of Mr. A.K. Trivedi, UDC.

The EC noted that Mr. A.K. Trivedi, UDC posted in the Examinations Branch while preparing mark sheet of Mr. Nabam Saha, a passed out student of Political Science Department has not added the marks obtained in back paper of I semester in the final examination mark sheet resulting low pass percentage. On submitting representation by the students to the University authority, office has checked and corrected the mark sheet and found that he scored 54.5% instead of 48.5%. Simultaneously, Mr. A.K. Trivedi, UDC (1st Tabulator) was issued 'show cause notice' and an enquiry committee was constituted to look into the matter.

Mr. A.K. Trivedi, UDC (1st Tabulator) in his reply to 'show cause' notice has mentioned that during his 24 years of service in this university this is his first mistake and which is happened due to oversight and has also assured office that he shall not repeat the same in future and requested the authority to pardon him for his first mistake.

Further, the enquiry committee after going through all relevant fact and study the matter has also submitted its report.

The Executive Council perused the report of the enquiry committee and expressed displeasure over the issue. The EC after deliberated the matter accepted the recommendation of the committee.

Further, the EC resolved that 1st tabulator could be either from teaching or from non-teaching as per the availability. But, the 2nd tabulator must strictly be a faculty of RGU. Scrutiny must also be done by teaching faculty of RGU. The EC also emphasized that the tabulators and scrutinizers shall maintain top confidentiality.

Thus, the recommendation of the committee at SI. No. 1 and 2 were accepted. For the recommendation at SI. No. 3 and for whole of the matter, the EC decided that the same may be referred to Legal Advisor for legal opinion.

At the same time, the EC also decided to introduce hi-tech software by consulting other universities/institutions through which, the mark entered by the tabulators could be detected automatically.

(2) To increase the strength of outsourced Security personnel.

The EC noted that University has increased in terms of number of students, departments, and other infrastructure, but the present number of outsourced security guards is not sufficient to meet the requirement of security guards. Hence, the EC decided to enlarge the number of security guards to 60 through outsourcing and the process of e-tendering.

Further, the EC decided that in order to ensure effective security system in the University campus, enough CCTV cameras should be installed at sensitive points and night patrolling of the security guards must be introduced.

It has also decided for introduction of car pass sticker for vehicles belonged to employees of RGU which shall bear serial number and signature of the issuing authority.

(3) To decide on the recommendation of the enquiry report in respect of Mrs. Nabam Aroti, the then Section Officer (Bill) of Finance Branch.

The EC noted that on 14th March, 2019 at 4.00 p.m Mrs. Oriental Taggu, the then Assistant Registrar (Bill & DDO) went to Mrs. Nabam Aroti, Section Officer to enquire about some task assigned to her. Mrs. Nabam Aroti, S.O. on being enquired by Mrs. Oriental Taggu became angry and started throwing the paper upon Mrs. Taggu and physically assaulted her in presence of all her subordinate staff.

The EC further noted that the enquiry committee after going through the report of the Senior Security Officer, Medical report and as per the provision laid down in CCS (CCA) Rules, 1965 has recommended for action to be taken in this regard. The recommendation of the Enquiry Committee was placed to EC as a Confidential Annexure.

The Executive Council perused the recommendations of the Enquiry Committee and based on Recommendation No.4 (I) decided that, Mrs. Nabam Aroti be denied one annual increment provided this reduction will not have the effect of postponing the future increments of pay. However, for the recommendation at SI. No. 4 (II) on suspension, the EC decided to take further legal opinion.

EC 26:03: To discuss on the Roster for EWS category and appointments to be made thereof.

The EC noted that Roster for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) category is to be prepared based on the grants received from UGC, New Delhi vide letter No.F.81-1/2019(CU), Dated 10th June, 2019. The University is committed to propose and place subsequent demands for teaching positions under EWS category. On receipt of such sanctions and grants subsequently, the University shall go for Advertisement and recruitment. Three new Departments namely, (i) Food Technology, (ii) Law and (iii) Statistics shall also be brought under its purview.

The EC discussed the agenda at length and resolved that reservation for EWS for different positions must be applicable in these sanctioned positions which have been released after the UGC regulation notification dated 18.01.2019. All the unfilled reserved positions (backlog) must be filled up as per the earlier reservations rules. The guidelines for EWS category be strictly adhered to and the same must be reflected in the forthcoming advertisement.

EC 26:04: To approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee for recruitment of the post of Registrar.

The EC noted that the Selection Committee meeting for selection of Registrar was held recently. The minutes of Selection Committee meeting and their recommendations are placed before the Council in sealed envelopes for consideration.

The EC perused the University Advertisement No. EG-12/85 (Vol-II) dated 5th June 2017, inviting application(s) for the post of Registrar, RGU.

The Selection Committee found 'None to be suitable' for the post. The EC perused all necessary documents and minutes of the Selection Committee and approved the recommendations. The EC further resolved that the position of Registrar shall be re-advertised together with other teaching and non-teaching positions at the earliest.

EC 26:05: To approve the recommendations of various promotions in Group A position held recently.

The EC noted that the DPC meeting for promotions of Group 'A' officers was held recently. The minutes of the DPC meeting held on 18.04.2019 and its recommendations are placed before the Council in sealed envelopes for consideration.

1) Promotion of incumbent for the post of Executive Engineer, Rajiv Gandhi University The recommendation of the DPC is as follows:

"As per recruitment rules of the University, Mr. B.K. Shah the Asst. Engineer, who has completed prescribed 8 (eight) years of service with Diploma and with good ACRs has been found satisfactory and committee recommended for promotion to the post of Executive Engineer considering his qualification of Diploma in Civil Engineering only with good performance in qualifying years of service".

As such, the case of promotion of Er. Basant Kumar Shah is recommended to Executive Council for approval for the promotion. The eligibility will be from the date of notification of the Executive Council's approval.

The EC perused and approved the recommendations of the DPC presented in the case of Er. B.K. Shah, Asst. Engineer (C).

2) Filling up of 1 (one) Resultant vacancy of Asst. Engineer (Civil) by promotion The recommendation of the DPC is as follows:

"The Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) members noted that the post of Assistant Engineer is still not vacant. Hence, it was resolved that the matter will be taken up in the next Departmental Promotion Committee. Meanwhile, it was decided that on the event of promotion of present incumbent and till the conduct of next Departmental Promotion Committee, the senior most Junior Engineer (Civil) will be considered to look after the charges of Assistant Engineer based on the order of merit as per the Recruitment Rules of the University and follow the rules of the Gol. There shall be no any financial benefit for looking after the charges of Assistant Engineer".

The EC noted that the University Authority has given the charge of Asst. Engineer to one of the JEs to look after till further order. Further the EC authorized the Vice-Chancellor to take administrative decision as per the

records available in file based on the resolution of the Selection Committee for the post of J.E. (C) held on 29.03.2012.

3) Promotion of Mr. Pradeep Kumar S.D, Senior Pvt. Secretary to the post of Assistant Registrar.

The recommendation of the DPC is as follows:

"The Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) noted that there is no vacant post of Assistant Registrar in the University. Also there are many Section Officers in the University, who are also eligible for promotion. Therefore it was resolved to consider similar cases of promotion in the next Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC). It was also resolved to constitute a committee to prepare proforma for Performance Appraisal in the line of other Central Government Institutions/Services so that promotion cases of the eligible candidates will be placed for consideration in the next Departmental Promotion Committee".

The EC perused and approved the recommendations of the DPC presented in the case of Mr. Pradeep Kumar S.D., Senior Pvt. Secretary.

The EC further resolved that a circular be issued to all the eligible incumbents (Technical and Non-Technical categories) to apply in prescribed format as served in CUs within 3 months.

EC 26:06: To approve floating of Advertisement for filling up of various Teaching and Non-Teaching positions in the Rajiv Gandhi University

The EC noted that the University is going to conduct interviews shortly. Hence, floating of Advertisement for filling up of various teaching and Non-Teaching positions in the Rajiv Gandhi University is to be approved by the Executive Council.

The Executive Council noted that as per the latest Roster prepared by the Teaching Section there exists 20 vacant positions of Professor, 28 nos. of Assoc. Professor and 36 nos. of Asst. Professor. The EC also made serious observation that in some departments vacancies of reserved categories have not been filled up which had been advertised for couple of times. Vacant Non-Teaching positions to be advertised are; i) Registrar ii) F.O, iii) CoE I & II, and iv) Internal Audit Officer (IAO). Hence, the Executive Council authorized the Vice-Chancellor to examine the existing reservation rules of Govt. of India. The EC also authorized Vice-Chancellor to explore possibility of a dynamic roster system followed in other CUs/Institutions.

Further, the EC resolved to float a comprehensive advertisement for both teaching and non-teaching positions through a process of direct recruitment as well as on deputation basis. The Executive Council authorized Vice-Chancellor to initiate the process.

EC 26:07: Approval of Panel of Experts for filling up of various faculty positions and Non-Teaching Positions in the Rajiv Gandhi University

The EC noted that University will shortly advertise various vacant teaching and non-teaching positions. The process of scrutiny of application shall follow thereafter. The interviews have to be conducted by drawing experts from a panel approved by the University Authority. The Panel of Experts was placed before the Council in sealed envelope for consideration.

The Executive Council perused and approved the Panel of Experts for filling up of various faculty positions and Non-Teaching Positions in the Rajiv Gandhi University and authorized VC to initiate the process.

EC 26:08: To discuss on the issue of Roster for various cadres in RGU.

The EC noted that the University is shortly adopting and implementing certain approved Roster system based on Govt. Recruitment directives, particularly of MHRD & UGC guidelines. The same is being placed before the EC for perusal and decision.

The Executive Council perused the Roster for various cadres and approved the same.

The EC further noted that in the meeting of Vice-Chancellors with Hon'ble Minister of HRD held on 13th June, 2019 at 3 p.m. at Constitution Club of India, Rafi Marg, New Delhi, the Chairman apprised Hon'ble EC Members about the agenda and issues discussed during the meeting and issues to implement Govt. decision to fill up all the vacancies within 100 days. In view of this, the EC resolved that a time line be fixed and target be achieved within the stipulated time line.

Further, the EC resolved that efforts must be made to conduct Selection Committee meetings for promotion under CAS, wherever required by the same Selection Committee(s) for direct recruitment.

Senior Professor (HAG)

On implementation of new UGC regulation, 2018 and earlier regulations like 2016 there is a clause of appointment of Senior Professor or Professor (HAG) in universities which will be 10% of total strength of Professors. However, in RGU the appointment of Senior Professor through direct recruitment or through promotion has not been implemented till now. The 21st meeting of EC vide EC:21:03 (j) ratified on the administrative approval of UGC Regulation 2018.

The EC discussed and resolved that the University shall implement the latest and relevant UGC Regulations notification issued by UGC.

EC 26:09: To ratify Ph.D degree awarded to 10 research scholars on having qualified for the award of Ph.D in the respective discipline during the period 25/3/2018 to 18/6/2019.

The EC noted that the university has declared the following research scholars to have qualified for the award of Ph.D degree in their respective disciplines:

EC 26:10: Reporting Items:

1. To peruse the resolutions of the 24th meeting of the Academic Council held on 17th June, 2019. The 24th meeting of the Academic Council was held on 17th June, 2019. Some of the resolutions adopted are vital and are to be brought to the knowledge of the Executive Council.

The EC perused the minutes of the 24th AC meeting held on 17th June'19 and approved the same.

2. To peruse the resolutions of the 23rd meeting of the Building Committee (Construction) held on 17th June, 2019.

The 23rd meeting of the Building Committee (Construction) was held on 17th June, 2019. Some of the resolutions adopted are vital and are to be brought to the knowledge of the Executive Council for deliberations.

The EC perused the resolutions of the 23^{rd} meeting of the Building Committee (Construction) held on 17^{th} June'19 and approved the same.

3. To peruse the resolutions of the meetings of the Board of Management of IDE.

The 31st & 32nd meetings of the Board of Management of Institute of Distance Education (IDE) were held on 6th Feb., 2019 and 10th June, 2019 respectively. The same was placed in the 24th meeting of the Academic Council held on 17th June, 2019. The resolutions adopted are brought to the knowledge of the Executive Council for deliberation.

The EC perused the minutes of the 31st and 32nd meetings of BoM of IDE held on 6th Feb 2019 and 10th June 2019 respectively and approved the same.

Further, the EC authorized the Vice-Chancellor to constitute an administrative committee to look into the resolution vide No. BOM:32:09 at page 6 of 9, i.e. matter related to DA of Ms. Moyir Riba, Asst. Professor, IDE.

EC 26:11: Any other item with the permission of the chair.

Under the item, the following points were discussed and resolved:

a) Visitor's Nominees on the Finance Committee of all the CUs

The EC noted that a letter was received from MHRD vide No. F. 54-1/2014-CU.III dated 8.01.2019 that MHRD and UGC Visitor's Nominees to the Finance Committee of all the CUs up till now was not below the rank of Deputy Secretary and Joint Secretaries. Now, as per the aforementioned letter received from the Ministry, the Visitor's Nominees to the Finance Committee of all the CUs should not below the level of **Under Secretaries** as provided herewith;

- a) Joint Secretary and Financial Adviser, MHRD or his/her nominee from Finance Bureau (dealing with CUs), MHRD not below the level of Under Secretary.
- b) Joint Secretary (CU), MHRD or his/her nominee not below the level of Under Secretary from Administrative Bureau.
- c) Joint Secretary (CU), UGC or any other officer not below the level of Under Secretary nominated by the Chairman, UGC.

The EC perused and approved the same.

b) On an agenda submitted by Prof. S.K. Patnaik, Department of Geography

An agenda was received from Prof S.K Patnaik, Department of Geography regarding appointment of Dean, Faculty of Environmental Science which is self-explanatory.

The EC perused and authorized VC to constitute a committee to look after the grievances. The EC also expressed displeasure about writing directly to the EC Chairman without maintaining the proper channel. The EC, further expressed its views that before writing any letter /grievance to the highest authority other avenues must be thoroughly explored and exhausted.

c) On matter related to Emeritus Professor

EC:27:05 To approve the experts for Selection Committees as per the Guidelines

The panel of experts for selection committees were placed to EC for perusal and approval.

The EC perused and approved the panel of experts for selection committees as per the UGC Regulations 2018/Guidelines. Further, the EC discussed and resolved to authorize the Vice Chancellor to add qualified experts to the committee as per the UGC regulations/guidelines.

However, it was further resolved that Registrar should write to UGC for clarification related to

criterion on eligibility for applying parallel or higher positions under reserved categories.

EC:27:06 Approval of list of experts—received from HODs and from other sources in the category of SC/ST/OBC/PWD & Women. Ref. UGC Letter (i) No. F.4-5/2019 (CCM/OBC) dated 31.08.2019 & F. No. 59-6/2012 (CU) dated 3.6.2016.

The EC discussed and resolved to authorize the Vice Chancellor to add qualified experts from the category of SC/ST/OBC/Minority & Women to the committee as per the UGC regulations/guidelines. Further, it was resolved to mark the social category of the experts in the minutes of the Selection Committees suitably.

EC:27:07 To approve the conduct of 17th Convocation of the University

The EC noted that University is conducting its Convocation on November 30 every year since 2013. Keeping up the event as one of the best practices of this University, the EC members were informed that as usual Rajiv Gandhi University will conduct its 17th Convocation on November 30, 2019 and requested the EC to approve the same.

The EC approved the proposal.

EC:27:08 To observe 37th Foundation Day on 4th February 2020

The University is observing University Foundation Day on 4th February every year. It is proposed to observe the 37th Foundation Day of the University on February 4, 2020.

The EC approved the proposal.

EC:27:09 Any Other Item

a) On promotion to Senior Professor
The EC reiterated that the promotion to Senior Professor will be as per UGC Regulations.



- vi) The FC approved the item and further observed that possibility of installing biodigester must be explored from DRDO, Tezpur. Further, it was felt that design/structure of construction should also be changed.
- vii) The FC approved the item and resolved to use steel in place of PVC material.
- viii) The FC approved the item in principle. However, Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management will look into details which would facilitate allocation of space for the office of Director, IQAC/DSW/Placement Cell in the building of Department of Management.
- The FC observed that in various projects, most of the concrete materials may be adopted through calling Expression of Interest (EoI) and 3D presentation of the projects among the users of the building projects (for all new projects) subject to stipulated condition and certification. While considering the situation and level of moisture in this region, rack must be made by concrete structure and adjust the rate within the estimated cost.
- x) The FC approved the item in principle. However, Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management will look into in detail so that space could be allocated for the office of Director, IQAC/DSW/Placement Cell in the Dept of Management building.
- xi) The FC approved the proposal in principle. However, it was resolved that the issue will be handled by Dean, Faculty of Commerce and Management.
- xii) The FC approved the proposal.
- xiii) The FC dropped the item.
- xiv) The FC observed that parking shed must be designed as per the parking norms. The FC approved the item in principle subject to recalculation of estimate by EE and resolved



to grant Rs. 12.00 lakh for construction of 5 nos. of parking sheds.

- The FC perused and approved the decision of XXIV BC.

- The FC perused and approved the proposal. The word 're-casted' used in the xviii) decision of the minutes of XXIV BC should be deleted.

- The FC perused and approved the proposal under the EWS scheme of Govt of India. XX) The word 're-casted' used in the decision of the minutes of XXIV BC should be deleted.
- xxi) The proposal was not approved. However, in place of it the FC suggested the Engineering wing to prepare and submit a fresh proposal through BCC for providing overhead water tank in old Type III, Type-IV/Duplex quarters at various sectors of RGU.

The suggestions made by the XXIV B.C at Sl. Nos 1 and 2 were noted and approved.

The FC resolved to drop the suggestion made at Sl.No.3.

Subject to the observation of FC made above and strict compliance of the comments/observation of UGC vide its letter No. F.20-6/2018 (CU) dated 15.01.2020 and the Under Secretary (CU-I), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of HRD, the Section Officer (IFD), Department of Higher Education, MHRD the minutes of XXIVBCC were

The EC perused and approved the same.

To approve the guidelines for seed money grant to fund research projects particularly for 4 the newly recruited Assistant Professors.

The FC noted that for creation of seed money for funding research projects particularly to the newly recruited Assistant Professors an agenda item was placed in the 17th meeting of the Finance Committee vide item No. FC: 17:10.

The 17thFC resolved that the provision would be made available to the newly recruited teachers by following the relevant guidelines. It was also resolved that the proposal is not perfect in its present form for being recommended. In this connection, the FC suggested that the University may formulate suitable guidelines in accordance with similar facility/procedure being followed in other Universities keeping in view the financial implications and place the same in the next FC. Accordingly, the guidelines for seed money prepared and placed to consideration/approval.

The FC perused and approved the guidelines for seed money. But, it was observed the teachers who did not availed any Major/Minor Research Projects from Government/Private Agencies will get a relaxation/consideration up to next 4 years from their appointment since 2015. This Special provision will be made for current year 2020 only. Further, the FC observed that an administrative letter must be circulated /uploaded informing all the newly recruited teachers of RGU to apply for research projects in various Public Sector Undertakings under social corporate responsibility.

The EC perused and approved the same.

a) To decide on the representations submitted by Shri. Nich Bapu and Shri. S.K. Sur for up gradation of their posts citing the case of Shri. M.L Sharma, Section Officer.

The FC resolved to refer back the matter to the University administration to review the earlier up gradation case by constituting another committee and decided to place the matter accordingly and the matter also may be reported back to FC/EC since the earlier case was approved in EC.

The EC perused and authorized VC to constitute a committee administratively to review the case and Registrar will be Member-Secretary of the committee.

b) An application received from the Coordinator, BIF Centre for Financial support from the University for Continuation of Bioinformatics Centre.

The Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt. of India has sanctioned a Bioinformatics centre to this University during the year 2007 with full funding from DBT. Now the Co-ordinator of the BIF centre reported that the DBT Govt. of India has decided to discontinue the financial support from April, 2020. In view of above, the Co-ordinator, BIF centre, RGU has submitted a proposal for taking over of BIF centre by University with an annual budget of Rs. 9.00 lakh.



The FC agreed in principle to extend financial support to the BIF Centre. The case must be presented for administrative decision and may be placed in the next FC as a reporting item.

The EC perused and approved the same.

	RGU, the lone central university in the frontier state of Arunachal Pradesh, with just 7% behind the topper Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI), Delhi, has been ranked second in the list of 49 other central varsities in the country released by the Ministry of Education, in a ranking based on an annual tripartite MOU signed between the varsity and the HRD Ministry (now Ministry of Education) and the University Grants Commission and its evaluation.
	The present score is based on an evaluation on key parameters fixed under the MoU in 2019-20, such as; number of students admitted annually in UG, PG, PhD. and M.Phil programmes as well the range of diversity among students, gender equity, faculty quality, student-teacher ratio, placement of students and those qualifying for NET & GATE, among other entrance tests, for ensuring gradual annual increase in user charges/fees charged for various courses and facilities and for strictly following the General Financial Rules, 2017 issued by department of expenditure, ministry of finance, and Government of India in all their financial transactions, including procurement of goods and services, and the obligatory adoption of the public financial management system for receipt of all

funds from UGC and Centre. Out of 14 set parameters in the MoU, the university has achieved above targets with regard to Student teacher ratio, academic outcomes, research publications, patents, utilization of funds, contribution to local societies, *Unnat Bharat Abhiyan*, *Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat*, Village adoptions, Governance, etc.

On learning about the achievement, the Governor of the State who is also the Chief Rector of RGU, Brig. (Dr.) B.D. Mishra (Retd.), the Chief Minister of the State Shri Pema Khandu and the Vice-Chancellor of the University Prof. Saket Kushwaha have congratulated the University fraternity for their relentless efforts for uplifting the quality of education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh and for their determination to improve the competitiveness of the University at national level.

The EC may note that, the university community attributes this achievement as an outcome of the persistent efforts of the "Team RGU" including its students, teachers, academic administrators and non-teaching fraternity. The meticulous calculations in fixing the target and continuous monitoring in scientifically achieving the goals using the slope analysis and also by embarking on quarterly gap analysis to mitigate the lapses had fetched RGU this overwhelming result. Holistic maintenance and presentation of data or statistics to the ministries by the various branches, departments, institutes, centres and cells of the university was the key in getting such high ranking. Undoubtedly, this target has been yielded due to the consistent efforts of all stake holders under the leadership of Vice-Chancellor Prof. Saket Kushwaha and the committed team of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the varsity.

2) University under Atal Community Innovation Centre (ACIC):

Rajiv Gandhi University is the only government funded university from the North-East India which stood out among 24 organizations of the entire country selected for receiving grant-in aid under Atal Innovation Mission of NITI Aayog for establishment of Atal Community Innovation Centre (ACIC).

3) RGU chosen to be a Centre of Sports Science & Research

Rajiv Gandhi University has been selected for establishment of Centre of Sports Science & Research under the scheme "National Centre of Sports Science and Research" (NCSSR) of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) recently, which is the first of its kind in the North-East India and only the 6th in the entire country.

4) Inking of several MoUs by Rajiv Gandhi University within the year 2020:
