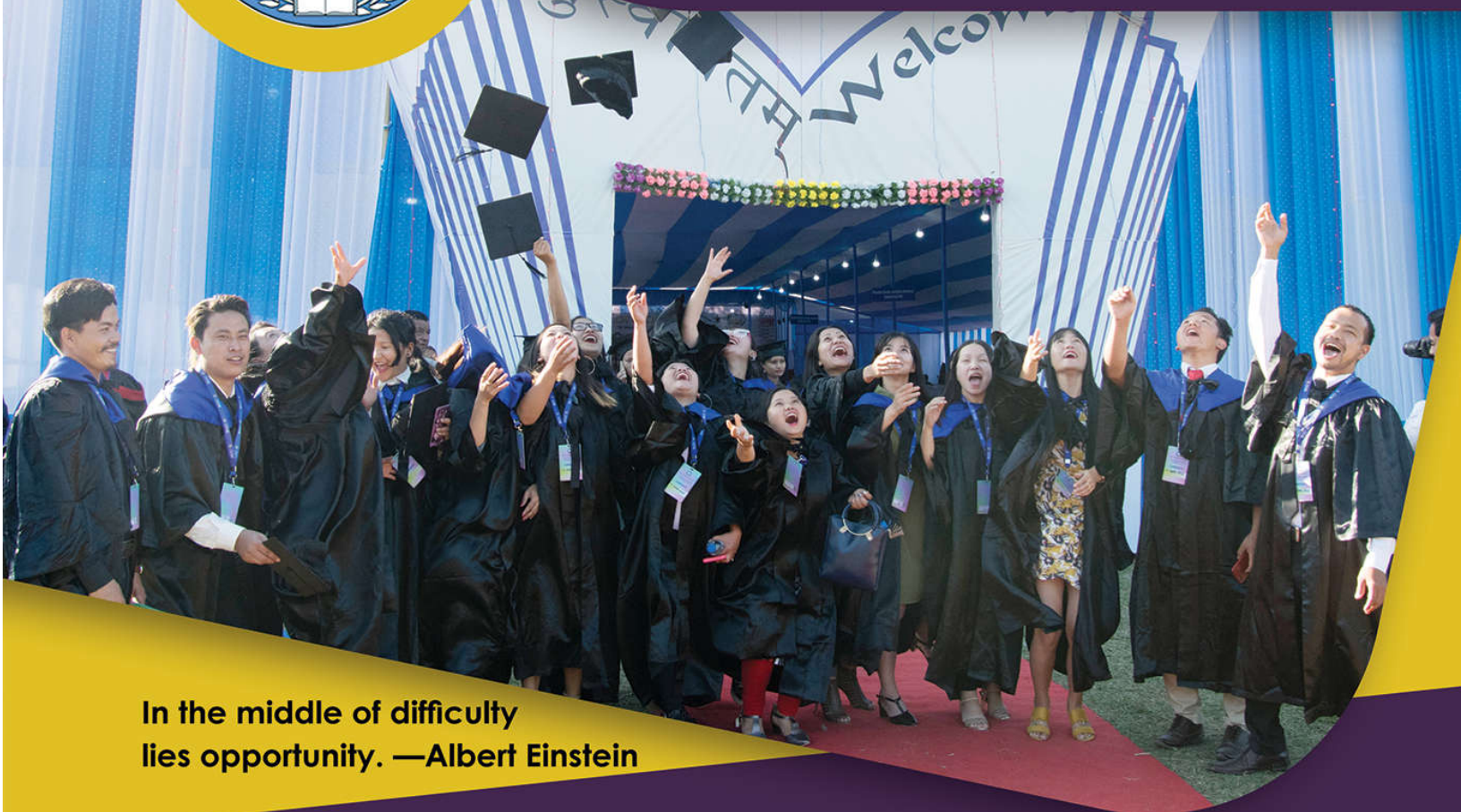

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1. ABOUT RAJIV GANDHI UNIVERSITY:

Rajiv Gandhi University (formerly Arunachal University) is the premier institution of higher learning in the state of Arunachal Pradesh and has completed thirty eight years of its existence. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India laid the foundation stone of the university on 4th February 1984 at Rono Hills, where the present campus is located. Ever since its inception, the university has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfill the objectives as envisaged in the University Act.

The University is located at Rono Hills on a picturesque table land of 302 acres over-looking the river Dikrong. It is 6.5 km away from the National Highway 52-A and 25 km away from Itanagar, the state capital. The campus is linked with the National Highway by a Dikrong bridge. The teaching and research programmes of the University are designed for its active and positive role in the socio-economic and cultural development of the state. The University has been extending educational facilities to the students from the neighbouring States, particularly Assam. The strength of students in different Departments of the University and in affiliated colleges has been increasing on a steady basis.

Rajiv Gandhi University with its motto "Vidhyaamritshnute" i.e. "Excellence and Immortality through nectar of Education" has been striving to maintain high standards in both teaching and research. Years of concerted efforts have shown the signs of quantitative progress. The percentage of the students clearing the NET/ SLET and other national tests like RNGF, INSPIRE, etc. is fairly high. 4. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

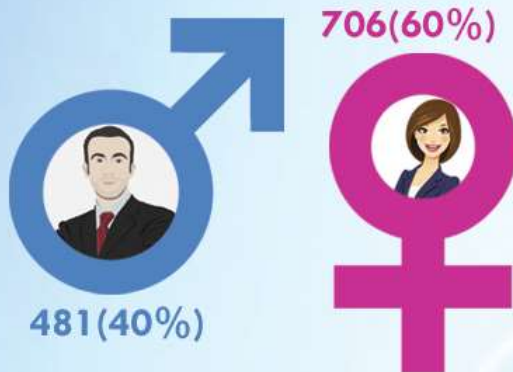
1. The candidate has to appear the Rajiv Gandhi University Common Entrance Test (RGUCET/ RGUCUET) for getting admission into the Post Graduate, Under Graduate Programmes and Professional Degree Courses.
2. Applicants for M. Tech courses with valid GATE score and above a prescribed cut-off score are exempted from the RGUCET.
3. The syllabus for each PG programme will be the course syllabus of the corresponding UG programme offered by RGU. For M. Tech the syllabus will be identical to the GATE syllabus of the preceding year.
4. RGUCET question paper contains 100 Multiple Choice Question & (MCQs):
 - i) 25 MCQs to examine language ability, reasoning, general awareness, mathematical aptitude/data interpretation and analytical skills of the candidate.
 - ii) 75 MCQs to examine the domain knowledge of the given course.
 - iii) For interdisciplinary courses like M.A. in Anthropology / Mass Communication / Sociology, MBA, and MSW, all 100 MCQs will examine language ability, reasoning, general awareness, Mathematical aptitude/data interpretation and analytical skills.
 - iv) 1 mark will be awarded for every correct answer.
 - v) Negative marking: 0.25 marks will be deducted for every wrong answer.
 - vi) Duration: The written examination will be of two hours duration.
5. Group Discussion/Viva Voce
For MBA, M.A. in Mass Communication and MSW courses only, the candidates who qualified in the written test will be called for group discussion and/ or viva voce. The group discussion and/or viva-voce component will be of 25 marks. The cumulative marks obtained from written test, group discussion and/ or viva voce will be basis for finalizing the list of the selected candidates.

Gender-Wise



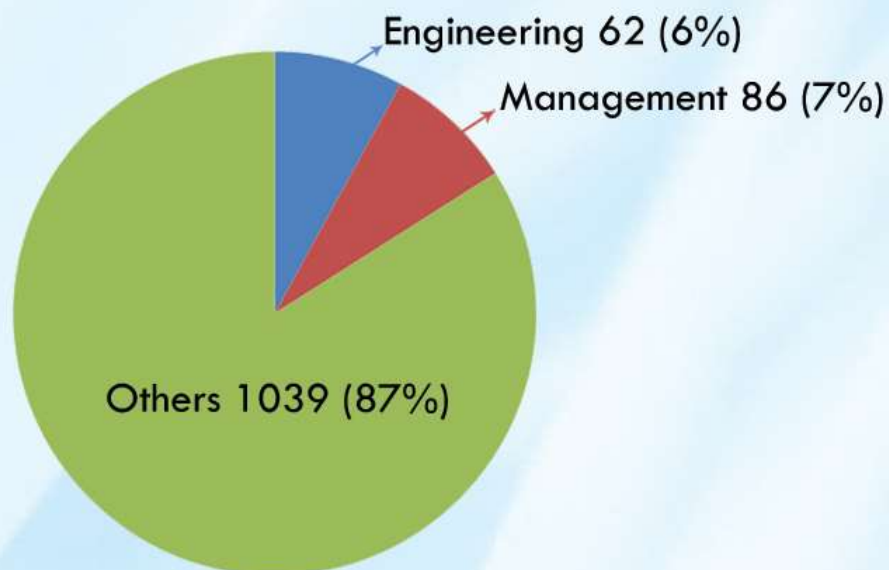

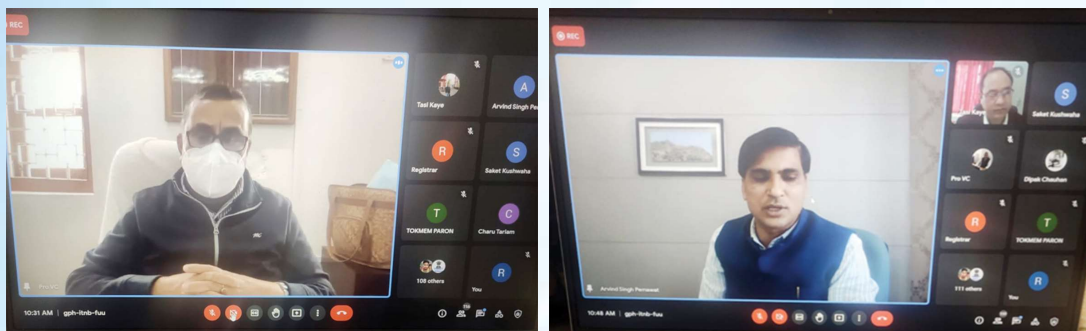

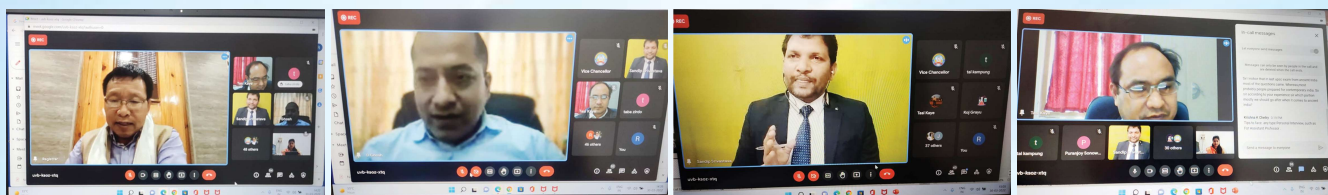

1. CHEMISTRY:

The Department of Chemistry was established in the year 2011 under the stewardship of Prof. Kamallesh Choudhury, a noted academician and educator from Assam. It marked a humble beginning to impart quality teaching and research in Chemistry in this remote state of India. The department offers two - year (4 semesters) M. Sc course. CBCS program has been introduced to provide students with the necessary theoretical background and introduction to laboratory methods. The scheme of instruction consists of lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, seminars and project work. In addition to this, the Department offers Ph.D. programme in the subject.

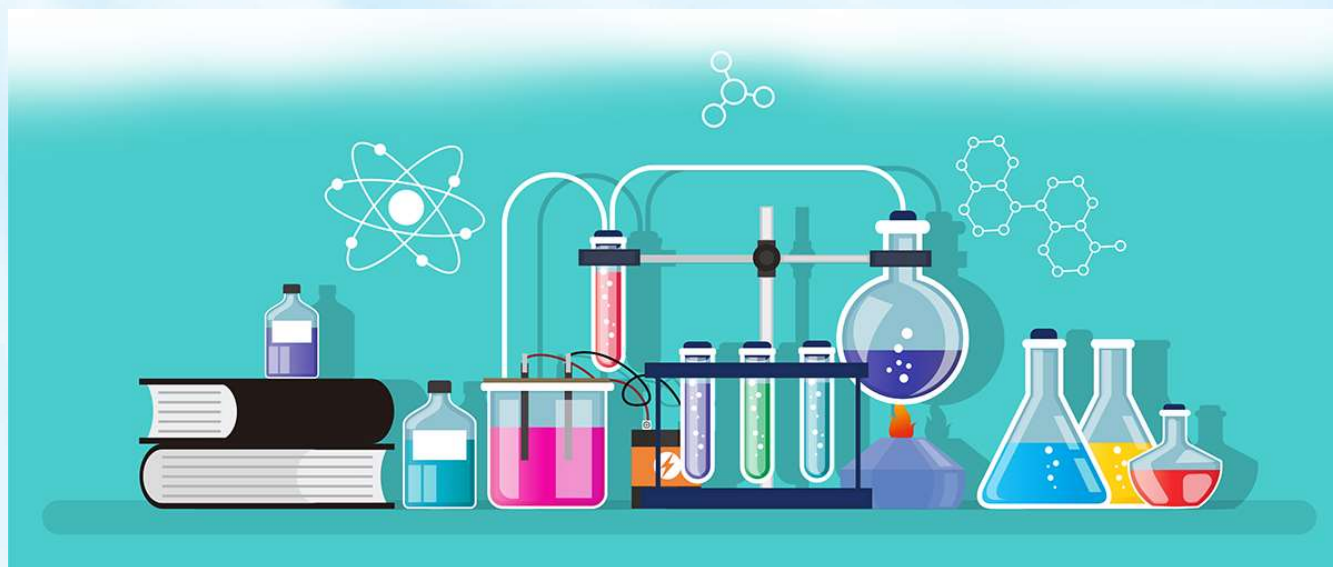

The department offers two - years (Four Semesters) M.A. / M.Sc. Programme in Mathematics & Computing and total intake capacity is 40 (Forty). In addition, it offers M. Phil. (Four Semesters) programme with intake capacity of five since 2015. Apart from these, the department of Mathematics has started Ph.D. programme from 2013 with seven scholars in different research domains of Pure and Applied Mathematics. Our faculty members specialize in various areas of Algebra, Analysis and Applied Mathematics. 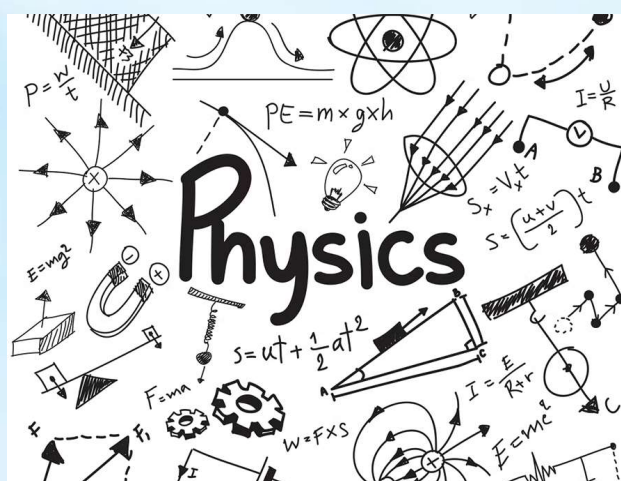

2. GEOLOGY:

The Department of Geology has started in the year 2017 under Prof. Nisha Mani Kar, Dean of the faculty of Environmental Sciences as its Coordinator and with the recruitment of two Assistant Professors and Enrolment of 18 (eighteen) students in B.Sc. (Hons.) course from the session 2017-18. Being located in the foothills of eastern part of the Himalaya, the Department has a brighter vision to engage the students in academic and research activities for better understanding of the various aspects of Geology in this part of North East India. Arunachal Pradesh is the largest state in NE India with availability of natural laboratory for geoscientists in the form of rock exposures to unravel the surface and subsurface geological processes. 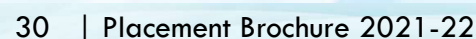

2. ZOOLOGY:

The Department started in 1997 under Faculty of Life Science RGU. The course curriculum in semester pattern were introduced from the academic session 2000-01. At present the faculty strength in the Department is nine with six numbers of Assistant Professor and three numbers of Professors. The student strength is twenty eight in each semester. The Department is also running M.Phil and Doctoral Programme as the regular academic activities and the students get admitted in the M.Phil and Ph. 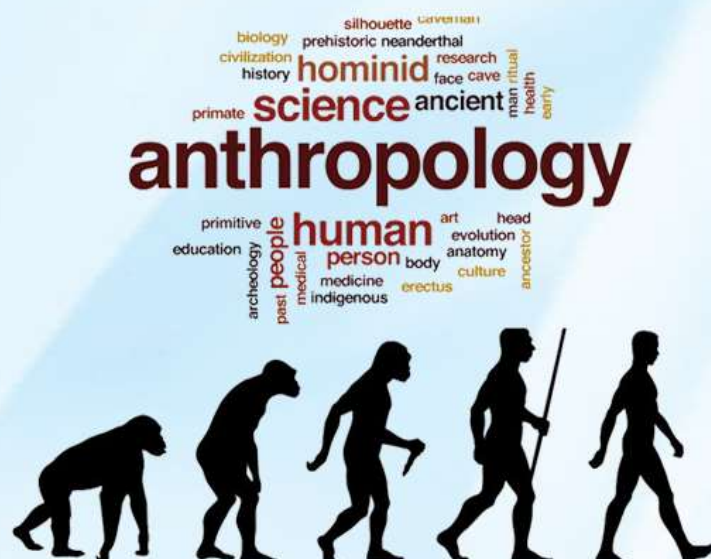

The UGC has approved the up-gradation of the center for tribal studies to a department with the mandate to run a regular M.Phil programme with Prof. Tamo Mibang as Head of the Department of Tribal Studies, initiated the activities of the Department. Thus, the Department came into existence on 18th August 1995. Though the Department could, within the time span of a decade, undertake many of the programmes enunciated in the perspective plan the uniqueness of Arunachalee society demands a focused action to preserve, promote, project and sustain the rich heritage indigenous knowledge system, especially in the area of ethno medicine, ethno music, performing arts, language, folklore, handicrafts, educating process, management of forest resources and ecosystem, etc. that are declining and decaying due to the onslaught of modernization and alien influence. In order to extend its programmes to preserve, promote rejuvenate and project the myriad tribal culture of the people of Arunachal Pradesh, a committee was constituted to prepare a vision for the Department. The department of Tribal Studies has been elevated and re-designated as: Arunachal Institute of Tribal Studies (AITS) in the year 2006.

3. ECONOMICS:

The Department of Economics was established in July 1991. The main objective of the Department is to impart socially relevant education at the Post Graduate level by judicious mix of theory and empiricism. The course of study and research offering in the Department has been designed to meet this objective. The faculty members of the Department have been deeply involved in the study of different developmental issues, especially in regard to the North Eastern Region. The specific issues that have attracted research attention are Human Development, Poverty, Institution Formation, Labor and Employment, Agriculture, Human Capital Formation, Environment and Eco-Tourism. The Department of Economics has the distinction of acting as a nodal Department for the preparation of the First Human Development Report (HDR) of Arunachal Pradesh. The HDR project was coordinated by Prof. N. C. Roy alongwith active participation of other faculty members of the Department. It was sponsored by the UNDP and Planning Commission, Government of India, New Delhi. The final report was released in October 2006. The Center for Development Studies (CDS) was set up in 2013 with a generous grant of the corpus fund of Rs 10 crore from Ministry of Finance. Government of India as a research adjunct at the Department of Economics, Rajiv Gandhi University to provide better research facilities to the faculty, research scholars as well as the students of the Department of Economics.

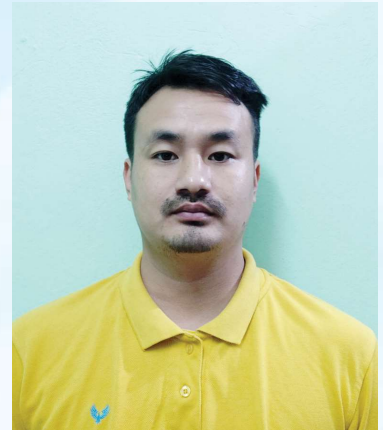

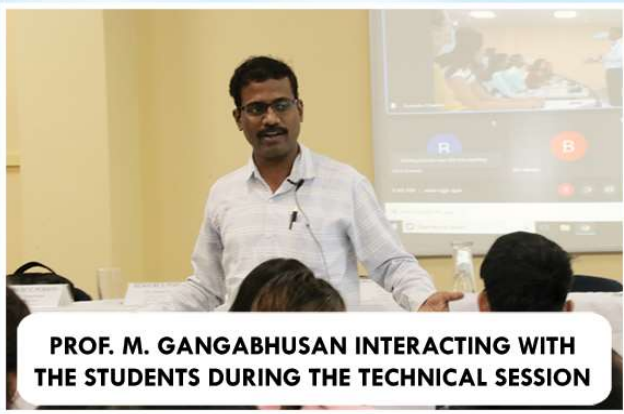

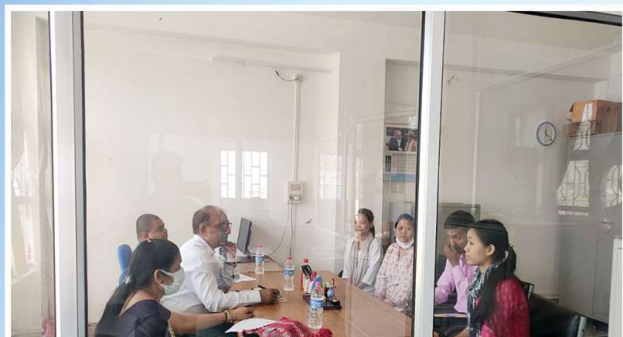

11. FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS:

1. **Bank:** A branch of Bank of Baroda with ATM facility operates in the administrative block to meet the banking needs of the students and rest of the University community. One SBI ATM booth is also installed in the campus.
2. **Post Office:** An EDBPO (Sub Post office), with speed post facility functions in the university campus for faster and regular postal services to cater to the needs of the students and the teaching and non-teaching staffs.
3. **Canteen & Co-Operative Store:** A central canteen, a tea stall, a cafeteria, a Co-operative store, a Book stall, a Pharmacy, few stationery cum grocery shops, a laundry and a salon in a shopping complex cater to the general needs of the university community. Xeroxing facility is also available in the campus.
4. **Computer Centre:** Established in 2004, the Computer Centre of the University has been successfully fulfilling its objectives. Computer Center has been set up in the campus in two locations at University Library and the Academic Block. The centre has a Help Desk, namely, "Computer Maintenance Facility", to facilitate troubleshooting of problems brought in by the members of the university community in connection with IT and computers.
5. **EDUSAT Centre:** It was established in the year 2005 which was sponsored by UGC CEC. Regular classes taught through multicast by CEC for various subjects especially on Development Studies, Mass media, Career counselling, Hindi, Health, Environment Studies, Economics, Information communication technology, Sociology, Public relation, Education, Political Science and Geography were received at the EDUSAT and routed to Campus LAN. Some important lectures were recorded as archival material in the EDUSAT Server. The program is also simultaneously telecast through DTH (Dish TV Channel 772). Teaching end has been upgraded with better media capability and TrainNet software for two way interaction with the resource person.
6. **Health Centre:** A four bedded Health Centre is operational with two experienced medical officers, three nurses, technicians and a pharmacist. Soon it shall be upgraded to a 14 bedded one with modern medical equipments and facilities. Ambulance facility for any emergency is available round the clock 24x7 services.
7. **Central Library:** The total number of books as on today is 63576 out of which around 3000 books are of reference nature and around 2000 gifted books. The University Library subscribes 14 local, regional and national dailies and 15 numbers of magazines. The University Library also subscribes 15 International Journals and 75 National Print Journals. The University Library is registered / enrolled as an institutional member of the Developing Library Network (DELNET), New Delhi, which is a major digital library resource in South Asia.
8. **Digital Library:** There is a separate cell to facilitate for Internet browsing for the students, research scholars and faculty members. Readers can browse and access more than 9000 E-Journals full text online under Sodh Sindhu Library Consortium and Developing Library Network (DELNET), the major Digital Library Resource in South Asia. OPAC online public access catalog facility can be accessed by IP 10.1.0.201. There is separate section for Text-Books, current Periodicals, dissertations (195 nos) and Thesis (244 nos) are on display, as well on database. The circulation through Kiosk from Smart Card RFID system is functional. ETD (Electronic Thesis & Dissertation and Digitized rare books on Arunachal and E-Books are also available.

9. Transport Facilities: The University extends adequate bus services from the Campus to Nirjuli, Naharlagun and Itanagar for students and staff at concessional rates. Frequent bus services are provided to NERIST point in Nirjuli on National Highway 52-A, from where public transport facility can be easily availed for onward journey within Arunachal Pradesh and for inter-state bus services.

10. Hostel Accommodation: The University maintains 12 halls of residence for students (6 for Men and 6 for Women) with accommodation capacity of around 1200 residents with facilities like common room, TV and Indoor Games. Accommodation in separate hall of residence for B.Ed / M.Ed, regular M.Phil and Ph.D scholars is provided on merit basis.

11. Career Counselling Cell: The Career Counseling Cell (CCC) started on 21st August 2012 with an objective to offer educational counselling services to the post-graduate students of Rajiv Gandhi University to help the students redefine their passion in their career, develop essential employability skills and strategies and to understand processes related to different competitive examinations related to job opportunities in the current market scenario. Career Counselling Cell has organized number of skills based training programmes under the expert professionals and resource persons invited from the state as well as national level.

12. International Scholars' Cell: This cell has been established to meet the interest of foreign students and scholars to carry out studies and research activities in Rajiv Gandhi University.

13. NET Coaching Centre: The Centre was first established as a Pre Examination Training Centre (PETC) in the year 1996 to impart coaching to the SC/ ST/ OBC (Creamy Layer) Female (General) and Minority community students for preparing themselves to appear UG / CSIR NET Examinations as well as University Examinations with the active participation of subject coordinators from different departments with an Honorary Director to run the affairs of the Centre.

14. University Industry Interface Cell: Established in the Year 2014, this Cell is first of its kind in the entire North East, India and is functional from the Department of Management. The Cell is playing its part in bringing industries closer to the University students. Entrepreneurship has been recognized throughout the world as one of the engines of growth and development. Although, there are exceptional success stories within the region, the aggregate entrepreneurial activity is subdued in comparison with the rest of the country.

15. The Centre for Entrepreneurship: Rajiv Gandhi University was set up in May, 2015. The objectives of the centre include entrepreneurship capacity building in the state of Arunachal Pradesh to develop an ecosystem for startups and SMEs and to run practical-oriented courses in the Centre especially for students.

16. RO Water Facility: The RO treated water is available for the students and other stakeholders of the

university with a properly installed facility which is located near the Guest House.

17. LAN Wi Fi Facility: Internet access facility which is an essential service to the university is being monitored and maintained properly. Campus-wide Local Area Network (LAN) of the university which is the core infrastructure in enabling sharing of resources and flow of information within and outside the University has been constantly expanding as the main facilitator of all the enabled services. VSAT Facility also provides internet connectivity through a 2mbps leased line link and 1 mbps DAMA VSAT link from ERNET India, New Delhi, 1 gbps connectivity under NKN has already been extended to the university by National Informatics Center (NIC), Itanagar using the leased line circuit from BSNL. Recently, high speed internet wi-fi connectivity has been in-stalled in the entire campus. Creating wireless hotspots, application repository and various other intranet services are now available.

18. Extra Curricular and Co Curricular Facilities: The University ex-tends facilities for extra-curricular and co-curricular activities to the students. Apart from the auditorium with indoor badminton court, there are provisions for tennis, caroms, etc. The University also participates in Inter - University Games and Sports competitions. There is also an active NSS unit in the University. Infra- structure Facility and Equipment are:

19. E-waste management: E-waste (electronic waste) comprises of obsolete computers, mobile, iPod, televisions, etc. which is ready for the disposal from the original user. These wastes become life threatening element and impact the environment. Hence, Rajiv Gandhi University provides awareness to the students about proper disposal and management of such e-waste in the campus. The students are taught about the process of easy recycling of day to day electronic waste. Thus, the University allows students to learn effective usage, dumping and recycling of the electronic waste on the natural environment. The university contributes towards sustainable development in the university campus through this e-waste management system.

20. Solid waste management: This innovative project has been introduced in the RGU by Prof. S. Kushwaha, Vice Chancellor. Currently, the solid waste management is under Women Technology Park. At present, paper recycling unit is functioning in the campus as the majority of waste is paper and the most viable mode of managing the waste is a paper recycling unit. The WTP is offering courses on handmade-paper making through the Institute of Distance Education and to create a market for eco-friendly stationery.

21. Organic waste management: Rajiv Gandhi University started awareness campaign to the students about the impact of household food waste and shared the ways to prevent food waste at hostel, home or in canteens / cafeterias. In this way the University brings students together to take a pledge to save food and value the food served on plate. The organic waste management has started to prevent and reduce food waste in the campus. The Waste Management Team teaches the students to share the information to family members, friends, colleagues and others when they go out from the university.

22. Rain Water Harvesting: RGU has started to harvest rainwater from the roofs of IDE and Geography

Department buildings. The students of Institute of Distance Education, Mathematics and Geography departments are being benefitted currently. The university administration has decided to install rainwater harvesting system in the selected buildings to meet the water requirement of the campus.

23. Grievances Cell: The University is monitoring and addressing the various grievances of different stakeholders including students through its robust public grievances cell. The university grievance cell is working under the Centralized Public Grievance Redress and Monitoring System, which is an online web-enabled system over NICNET developed by NIC in association with the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) with an objective of speedy redressal and effective monitoring of grievances by Ministries / Departments / Organizations of Government of India.

24. Sexual Harassment Cell: RGU is having full-fledged sexual harassment cell which gives orientation to the students from time to time about consequences of sexual harassment as well as empowering them to report if such things happen. The cell has a help line number in which one can register their complaint. The cell conducts awareness programme on the implication of a demand for sexual favors, eve-teasing or any other unwelcome conduct of sexual harassment nature.

25. Facilities for differently able: Differently-able persons need special arrangements in the environment for their mobility and independent functioning. Rajiv Gandhi University ensures that all existing structures as well as future construction projects in the campuses are made friendly for differently-abled. To suit the special needs of differently-able persons, RGU has created special facilities such as ramps, rails and special toilets and made other necessary changes to address the accessibility issues pertaining to disability.

26. Security Cell: Rajiv Gandhi University has a full-fledged security cell which works day and night for safety and security of all denizens of the campus. Security cell is headed by a senior security officer and runs with his team of security guards. The guards are placed at the entrance gate as well as for all the departments help in preventing untoward incidences in the university campus. The CCTV cameras are also monitored by the security cell, RGU.

27. Women Technology Park: Established in 2001 under the UGC Xth Plan, the Park provides training facilities to the unemployed young women residing in the peripheral area of the university campus in mushroom cultivation, weaving, cultivation of local and rare organic vegetables, etc. The Park supplies seasonal organic vegetables to the campus dwellers.

28. RGU Atal Community Innovation Center RGU ACIC: For different activities and research projects RGU has set up Atal Community Innovation Centre (ACIC) guided by Atal Innovation Mission (AIM) of NITI Aayog, New Delhi. The University has participated in collaborative research projects under the aegis of Indian Central Himalayan Universities Consortium - an initiative of NITI Aayog. The University has also initiated a social science research project on rural and border areas of Arunachal Pradesh under RGUACIC.

12. FACILITIES FOR RECRUITERS:

The Rajiv Gandhi University has created all the necessary amenities to conduct on-campus / digital placement. The university has created a centralized placement cell to look after the campus placement activities with its designated Professor in-charge and Placement Officer. The large size on-campus or digital campus recruitment can be conducted in RGU. The following facilities are available for the recruiters:

1. Guest House for comfortable accommodation for the esteemed recruiters.
2. The infrastructure facilities such as separate rooms for examination, group discussion and personal interview.
3. 24x7 Wi-Fi facility for the recruiters inside the campus.
4. Air conditioned conference hall for digital presentation.
5. Online computer test centers.
6. Video conferencing facility.
7. Three auditoriums for conduct of mass examination.
8. 3 star Hotel accommodation for the recruiters.
9. Experienced manpower available to conduct and to monitor the placement process.
10. Transport facilities for site seeing trips for the recruiters after successful recruitment drive.



13. ACCOMODATION FOR RECRUITERS:

1. Hotel Pybss: D-Sector, Near Civil Secretariat, Itanagar

Hotel Pybss is a 4-star smoke-free hotel having a restaurant, a business center, 24-hour free wi-fi and self parking facilities. The Pybss provides free newspapers, wedding services, ATM services, room service, housekeeping and many more.



2. Waii International Hotel: Near State Museum, Itanagar

Waii international is a 3-star hotel with full-service spa facility and provides free continental breakfast. Waii international is a smoke-free hotel having a restaurant and a nightclub. The hotel also has features like free Wi-Fi, free self parking, a health club, a bar and a cafe. The hotel also provides housekeeping service daily.



3. Cygnett Inn Trendz: Chan dranagar, Near DC office, Itanagar

Cygnett Inn is a 3-star smoke-free hotel with sound proofed rooms. It has a restaurant, 24-hour fitness center and a bar. It provides free WiFi, free parking, free news paper, free phone facility and 24 hours room service. The hotel has amenities like a coffee shop and a 24 - hour business center.



4. University Guest House, RGU, Rono Hills

The Rajiv Gandhi University has a well furnished university Guest House located near the Mini Auditorium. It has about 20 Guest rooms, 4 VIP suites and a dining hall for the guests. Round the clock services are provided by the trained staffs of the guest house.



14. PLACEMENT PROCEDURE:

1. Invitations are sent to companies through email along with response sheets enquiring about the recruitment details. A soft copy of placement brochure is also sent with the mail.
2. The company fills the response sheet and sends it by e-mail to the placement cell, RGU. The job announcement is sent by the company to placement cell afterwards.
3. Once the details about the vacancies are received, a convenient date is fixed for campus recruitment.
4. Once date is fixed, the announcement letter to campus recruitment is circulated to the students through mail, by broadcasting on RGU website & notice sent to the departments to display on the notice board.
5. Thereafter, the travel plans are obtained from the company. The accommodations and necessary logistic support are arranged for the recruitment drive.
6. Subsequently, the candidates are shortlisted for the placement drive.
7. Recruitment process starts with written test / group discussion / presentation / interview, etc.
8. The offers are made by the company to the successful candidates for appointment.
9. The students may accept the offer letter and sign it and send it to the company through placement cell, RGU.
10. Placement cell ensures that the selected student reaches to the organization on specified date.

22. MAJOR TOURIST ATTRACTION:

1. Indira Gandhi Park:

The park is 1km from Ganga Market and is a most commonly visited place in Itanagar. It is a local recreational garden with a provision for jogging. It has a meditation centre. Tourists with family find the park beautiful where they can enjoy scenic beauty and greenery all around.



2. Itaport:

The place is 2 kms from Ganga Market. An important place to visit in Itanagar, the name literary means 'Fort of Bricks' (brick being called 'Ita' in the Assamese language). The port has an irregular shape, built mainly with bricks dating back to the 14th-15th century. The total brickwork is of 16,200 cubic meters which were built by the kings of the Chutिया kingdom which ruled the region during that time. The fort has three different entrances from three different sides, i.e, the western, the eastern and the southern sides.



3. Ganga lake:

It is also known as the Gyangkar Sinyi, 6 km from Ganga Market, Itanagar which is a must visit place in Itanagar. Ganga Lake is a major tourist attraction and it is one of the most visited and popular location in Itanagar. Tourists from across the world visit this destination for recreational activities and it hosts a perfect place for dry picnic. Since the lake is still, one can notice its colour to be green.



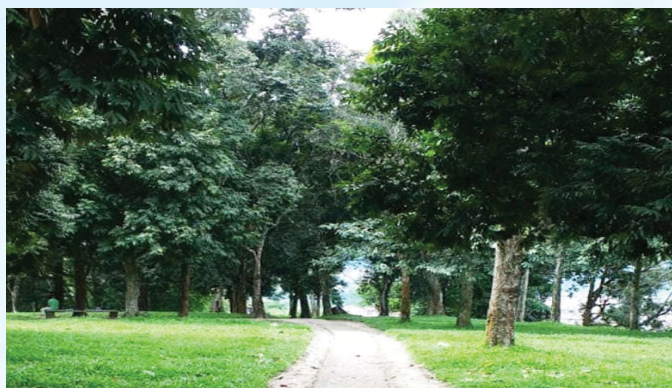
4. Gompa:

A Buddhist Temple located 3 kms away from Ganga Market is a site of tourist attraction at Itanagar. 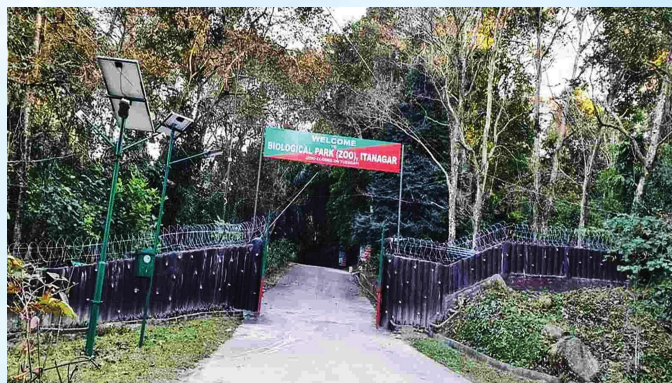
6. Jawaharlal Nehru State Museum:
