# 2. Year of Establishment & Jurisdiction

- 4<sup>th</sup> February, 1984 Established as Arunachal University (State University).
- 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 Converted into Central University.
- Jurisdiction: Rajiv Gandhi University is located near Itanagar (29 Kms.), the state capital of Arunachal Pradesh. The 45 affiliated colleges and 16 Centres of Distance Education are spread across the geographical boundaries of Arunachal Pradesh.

#### 3. A brief note on the set up of the University

Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), formerly Arunachal University nestled atop Rono Hills on a picturesque table land of 302 acres is a premier institution of higher education in Arunachal Pradesh and has completed nearly four decades of its existence (since 1984). Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation stone of the University on 4<sup>th</sup> February, 1984 at Rono Hills, Doimukh. The University was converted into a Central University with effect from 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 as per the notification of the erstwhile Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of

India. Since then, Rajiv Gandhi University has carved a niche for itself in the educational scenario of the region in particular and country in general. Prof. C.L. Anand appointed in 1987 was the first Vice-Chancellor of the university whereas Shri A P Srivastava was the first Registrar of this University. Currently, Prof. Saket Kushwaha is serving as the Vice-chancellor of this university and Dr. N T Rikam is the Registrar of Rajiv Gandhi University.

The University received academic recognition under section 2(f) from the University Grants Commission on 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1985 and started functioning from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 1985. It received financial recognition under section 12B of the UGC on 25<sup>th</sup> March, 1994. The University started its academic journey in the year 1988 with 48 students, 18 faculty members, and three departments namely History, Political Science, and Education. B.Ed. programme was started in the current campus whereas post graduate programmes in History and Political Science initiated with Jawaharlal Nehru College (JNC), Pasighat.

#### 7. Academic Information

RGU, the easternmost located central university of the country has kept behind many central universities in the pursuit of academic achievement and secured second place in the rankings released by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, in 2020, by registering 83% in the grading of performance. The varsity lapped up the coveted title of 'Best Central University' in 2020 at the third Himalayan Educators Summit, 2020 and ranked third to receive the 'DivyaHimagiri Himalayan State Education Excellence Award 2020'. These awards mirror RGU's hard work and the urge to excel.

Rajiv Gandhi University has earned the unique distinction of being the first university in the country to prepare First Human Development Report (HDR) of Arunachal Pradesh. The department of economics received a grant of Rs. 10 crore as corpus fund in union budget, 2012 for research and establishment of Centre for Development Studies (CDS).

Department of Zoology & Botany of this University has been recognized as the "Centre with Potential for Excellence in Biodiversity (CPEB)" in the year, 2002, vide UGC DO Letter No. F14-2/99(IUC/UNIV. Excellence), dated 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2002. The Centre has successfully completed two successive phases of 5 years each.

The RGU added a priceless feather to its colourful cap by establishing the "Centre of Excellence on Sports Science Education and Research" under the scheme "National Centre of Sports Science and Research" (NCSSR) of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) to develop for the enhancement of the performance of Indian sportspersons in the international competitions. It is the first of its kind in the North-East India and only the 6<sup>th</sup> in the entire country. Under this, the University has started four (04) new departments for holistic development of youth. They are; (a) Sports Biomechanics, (b) Sports Physiology, (c) Sports Psychology, and (d) Strength Training & Conditioning. It envisions to infuse vigour and dynamism into the sporting culture of the university and the region as well.

RGU's Arunachal Institute of Tribal Studies (AITS) inked a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with State Research Directorate for extensive heritage documentation and to formulate a State Culture Policy (SCP) on 16th Oct., 2020, one of few such moves in the country.

The University adheres to the academic calendar, conducts the examinations, declares the results on time and organizes convocation every year on a fixed date as the part and culture of its best practices. In our pursuit to infuse and consolidate Constitutional Values and also those of Indian Freedom Struggle, during the convocation each year, university distributes Preamble of the Constitution of India and Fundamental Duties to all the passing out students along with their degree. In equity and diversity parameters, the University always has upheld a consistent and constructive role. Gender equality and promotion of indigenous students and learners with special abilities have been remaining a top priority for the university. The University is also in the process of expanding is campuses in three locations for the larger benefit of

students. Rajiv Gandhi University is creditably matching the new trends in the field of higher education and has assiduously maintained its scholastic distinction to enable the aspiring students keep abreast with their fellow students across the Nation and the Globe.

Skill Hubs Initiatives (SHI) under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) 3.0. Subsequent to that Skill Hub Centre at Rajiv Gandhi University was established vide notification No. RGU/REG-45/AC/21 dated 4th March, 2022. The Centre has offered two courses namely - CCTV Installation Technician and Technician - Paper Bag Manufacturing. The learners of first batch from both the courses have been successfully completed the programme.

As per the mandates of UGC and NEP-2020, Rajiv Gandhi University has also constituted Research and Development Cell conceding the fact that research is the backbone of academics. It simplifies concept building and transforms new ideas into innovations in pursuance of a new era of passion for researches. The Research and Development Cell aims to nurture research culture in the university by promoting research in newly emerging and challenging areas of Technology, Sciences, Social Sciences, Sports, Fine Arts and Humanities. It encourages the students and faculty to undertake the research in newly emerging frontier areas of traditional as well as newly emerging multidisciplinary fields. This enhances the general research capability of budding learners by way of participating in conferences, seminars, workshops, project competition, etc. The RDC will enable attainment of targets of Atma-Nirbhar Bharat (Self-reliant India) and is expected to play a pivotal role in the catalysing multidisciplinary/trans-disciplinary and translational research culture mandated in NEP 2020.

To facilitate learner centric and flexible education, Rajiv Gandhi University has implemented Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) from SWAYAM platform with credit transfer facility as mandatory component in different courses.

Additionally, all the courses including those at UG, PG and PhD currently on offer by University have an inbuilt mechanism of Open and/or Generic Elective Courses which mandate all our learners to mandatorily choose one of the papers/ subjects being offered by their other/ cognate departments during their course work excluding their parent departments. This has inculcated a symbolic as well as substantive impact on promotion of interdisciplinary education eco-system in the university. We have number of Departments, Institutes and Centres viz. Tribal Studies, Management, Social Work, Education, Bio-Diversity etc. which not just facilitate but encourage learners from multiple subject backgrounds to opt their courses.

Adhering to the spirit of multi-disciplinary and flexible higher education, Departments of Physics and Chemistry at Rajiv Gandhi University have jointly evolved a four-year Bachelor of Science Programme. The programme outlines and detailed structure crafted in consultation with key stakeholders including few of the architects of NEP-

2020, is ready to be implemented from upcoming academic session as a unique initiative of the institution.

#### 8. Academic Programme of Distance Education

Rajiv Gandhi University has been continuously offering Certificate Programmes, UG and PG courses through Institute of Distance Education which was established in 2005. The institute aims is to provide higher education opportunities to those who are unable to join regular academic and vocational education programmes in the affiliated colleges of the University and make higher education reach to the doorsteps in rural and geographically remote areas of Arunachal Pradesh in particular and North-Eastern part of India in general.

The education through distance mode is an alternative mode of imparting instruction to overcome the problems of access, infrastructure and socio-economic barriers. The institute offers Bachelor Degree and Certificate Programmes in the field of Art. Rajiv Gandhi University has been offering Distance Education Program at undergraduate level and started Bachelor's Degree in five subjects namely Economics, Education, English, History and Political Science from the session 2005-06. During the session 2006-07, two more subjects namely Hindi and Sociology have been added to its undergraduate program. During the session 2007-08, Tribal Studies has been added to its undergraduate program in addition to two certificate courses. 'Certificate Course in Fisheries Technology' and 'Certificate Course in English for Communication' have been introduced in the same session. In recent times, IDE has embarked on the road of using ICT for distance learning.

# 15. Details of Library (including Library Budget)

The University Library is functioning in a separate premise adjacent to the faculty buildings in the centre of the institution since 1998. The library has procured 78345 numbers of books as on today, out of which approx 5998 books are reference and general nature and approx 5000 are of gifted books. Apart from the printed books, the University Library also procured 15801 numbers of e-books which are perpetual access in nature from Tritech, WT, Bibliotex, Taylor & Francis, Brill, Vidya and Bhasa suppliers. The University Library subscribes 17 local, regional and national daily newspapers 13 numbers of magazines regularly to the library. The University Library also subscribes 7 International Journals and 130 National Print Journals and some of them are of free subscriptions. There is a separate cell at the Department of Mass communication and Journalism building to facilitate for internet browsing for the students, research scholars and faculty members. Owing to II wave of COVID-19 Lockdown the library extends the facility of browsing of e -resources and journals to its users. The library has facilities to browse and access more than 15000 e-journals full text online through Shodhsindhu Digital Library consortium, Developing Library Network (DELNET) the major Digital Library Resource in South Asia and DeLCoN under DBT and NDLI extended to the readers.

Besides, the University Library is also subscribing EBSCO Discovery Services (EDS) platform, EPWRF and other databases. For the quick search and availability of books, the University library has Web OPAC, (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility which can be accessed through http://opac.rqu.ac.in. In addition to these, there is separate section for display of Text-Books, current Periodicals, 618 numbers of dissertations and 692 numbers of theses, out of these, 522 Ph.D. theses have been uploaded under ETD Shodhqanqa Project. At present, after 2016, Rajiv Gandhi University has signed MoU with Inflibnet Centre for anti-plagiarism software (Urkund) under Shodh-shudhi for checking plagiarism of M.Phil, Ph.D. theses, dissertations, synopsis and research projects. The University Library has also subscribed I -Thenticate (Turnitin) checking plagiarism since session 2020-21. Apart from the above the Rajiv Gandhi University, Central Library has also started the IR (Institutional Repository) from this session which has inaugurated its portal (http://rquir.inflibnet.ac.in) on 20<sup>th</sup>. May 2021. This year the library has subscribed IEEE CSDL for its users. The expenditure for the session 2021-2022 for purchasing general books and reference books are Rs. 16250741, for journals the expenditure are Rs. 419617, for purchasing e- books from Bibliotex, World Technologies, Tritech Digital Media, taylor& Francis, Brill the expenditure are 9433540 and Rs 2878312 are the expenditure for databases like EBSCO Discovery Services, DELNET, NDLI (Free), EPW, IEEE CSDL, iThenticate.

The library has implemented Smart Card RFID system for check-in and check-out through the KIOSK system. There are 2500 numbers of users of the library who extended their facilities for their academic purpose. There are 25 numbers of rare books of Arunachal Pradesh available in the University library. The users of the library are under CCTV Camera Surveillance in order to detect any untoward activities by the users in the library. The usability statistics for the use of e-recourse under UGC-INFONET (eSS) is quite satisfactory.

RGU has Smart class room facility for all the departments. Currently, the University library has 74,500 number of books. Apart from the printed books, the University Library also has 12700 number of e-books in total which are perpetual access in nature. Rajiv Gandhi University, Central Library has also started the IR (Institutional Repository) (http://rquir.inflibnet.ac.in).

The Library Budget (in lakh) of last four years has been presented below:

#### 16. Details of Research Facilities

The University received financial support of Rs. 10 Crore from Department of Science and Technology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India under **PURSE** 2021 Programme. Rajiv Gandhi University has been selected by the NITI Aayog to set up 'Atal Community Incubation Centre (**ACIC**)' for augmenting entrepreneurial acumen and capacity-building among the unemployed youth. As an integral part of the 'Indian Himalayan Central Universities Consortium' of NITI Aayog, New Delhi under UGC STRIDE Scheme, the RGU is contributing in collaborative research pertaining on five different themes.

#### 17. Hostel Facilities

The University maintains 12 (Twelve) halls of residence for students (6 for Men, 5 for Women & 1 Common) with accommodation capacity of 1038 residents with facilities like Common Room, TV and Indoor Games. The residents of the halls maintain their own mess on co-operative basis. Each hall of residence is managed by a Warden. Admission to halls of residence is made as per reservation and merit fixed for the purpose by the University. It is to be noted however, that during summer vacation and winter break boarders shall have to vacate the halls of residence for the routine

maintenance of the halls. Accommodation in separate halls of residences for B.Ed, regular and Ph.D. scholars are also provided on merit.

#### 19. Health Facilities

A four bedded Health Center is operational with two experienced medical officers, three nurses, technicians and a pharmacist. The Health Centre of Rajiv Gandhi University is located at the centre point of the campus. It is a Primary Health Centre and caters to the health care requirements of the staffs, staff dependents, students and the visitors to the campus. The Centre welcomes people from the neighboring villages of the University who seek consultations and treatment. The services provided are free for every patient who visits the Health Centre. The health Centre is manned by two Medical Officers, one Staff Nurse, one Medical Laboratory Technician, two Multi-Tasking Staffs and one Gardener. It is a four bedded which includes three beds in the Observation Room and one bed in the Dressing Room. Types of Services provided are as follows:

- a. **Out Patient Department (OPD)**: Consultations and treatment take place from Monday to Saturday to patients who seek health care.
- b. **Antenatel Check-up Clinic**: Pregnant women are registered, evaluated, treated and advised for follow up till the delivery due date.
- c. Vaccination Clinic: Every 1st Tuesday of the month is the vaccination day where children are vaccinated against the vaccine preventable diseases as part of the National Immunisation Programme.
- d. Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP) & Directly Observed Treatment Short course (DOTS) Treatment: As part of the National initiative for treatment of Tuberculosis, the Health Centre is a designated treatment centre where T.B. medicines are dispensed to patients and followed up till completion of the full course of treatment.
- e. **Medical Laboratory**: Basic minimum clinical investigations are carried out and results provided to strengthen the diagnostic and treatment process.
- f. **Pharmacy**: A medical Pharmacy is providing essential medicines for those in urgent need for various ailments.

- g. **Informing Unit**: As a designated informer unit of the National Polio Surveillance Programme (NPSP) and Measles Surveillance Programme (MSP), the Health Centre notifies the suspected cases of polio and measles if detected to higher health authorities in the district level.
- h. **Referral Service**: Appropriate and prompt referral is advised to higher medical centre located in the city as and when a patient is in need. For this, to transport patients to hospitals an ambulance is stationed round the clock for facilitating. O.P.D.
- i. Registration for the consultation is to be done by all patients. The Registration counter closes at 4:30 p.m. 24 hours Ambulance facility for any emergency is available round the clock.
- j. **Policy Regarding Confidentiality**: Personal and medical histories of the patients are treated with utmost confidentiality.

## 21. Special Features (if any)

In addition to above salient features, the other highlights of Rajiv Gandhi University, include the following:

#### a. Bank & Post Office

A branch of Bank of Baroda with ATM facility operates in the Administrative Block to meet the banking needs of the University community. An EDBPO (Sub-Post office), with speed post facility also functions in the university campus. One SBI ATM booth is also installed in the campus.

#### b. Boxing Academy

University runs a Boxing Academy for the budding pugilists of the campus and adjoining area. The academy is committed to talent search and nurturing.

#### c. Canteen & Co-Operative Store

A central canteen, a tea stall, a cafeteria, a Co-operative store, a Book stall, a Pharmacy, few stationery-cum-grocery shops and a salon in a shopping complex cater to the general needs of the University community. Photocopying facility is also available in the campus.

#### d. Computer Centre

Established in 2004, the Computer Centre of the University has been successfully fulfilling its objectives. Pres- ently, Computer Centre is housed at University Library and the Academic Block. Initiatives have been taken for construction of the Central Computing Facility wherein Computer Centre will also be located. The Centre is a part

of the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NMEICT) Project: A mission taken up by MHRD, Govt. of India, New Delhi. The centre has a Help Desk, namely, "Computer Maintenance Facility", to facilitate troubleshooting of problems brought in by the members of the university community in connection with IT and computers. As part of the e-governance initiatives planning and designing of the University Management Solution (UMS) is in progress.

#### e. Day Care Centre

Established in 2006 under the UGC scheme for providing child care centres in the universities and colleges during the X Plan period, the Day Care Centre at Rajiv Gandhi University is managed by the Management Committee constituted by the university authority under nodal supervision of UGC & Project Cell of the university. The main objective of the centre or scheme is to provide day care facilities to the children of age group of three months to six years of the working parents, students and visiting guest of the university. The facility is also extended to the child of research scholars and local community working parents in the vicinity of the university.

#### f. EDUSAT Centre (National Network)

Year of Establishment: 2005, Sponsoring Agency: UGC-CEC, Location: Department of Geography. Regular classes taught through multicast by CEC for various subjects especially on Development Studies, Mass media, Career Counseling, Hindi, Health, Environment Studies, Economics, Information Communication Technology, Sociology, Public Relation, Education, Political Science & Geography were received at the EDUSAT and routed to Campus LAN. Some important lectures were recorded as archival material in the EDUSAT Server. The programme is also simultaneously telecast through DTH (DishTV Channel 772). Teaching end has been upgraded with better media capability and Train Net Software for two-way interaction with the resource person. Besides, EDUSAT (State Network) was also established in the University with sponsorship from ISRO, which with its Hub station carry out multicasting of recorded educational programmes of DECU, ISRO on regular basis.

#### g. Hindi Cell

The Hindi Cell is playing a vital role in implementation of Rajbhasa Hindi and implementation of Official language Hindi in the university. It organizes workshops, orientation programmes, besides literary and cultural competitions on important occasions. The cell also runs short-term and long-term courses like prabodh, praveen, pragya, hindi typing-short hand etc.

#### h. Innovative Centre

Innovative centre has been set up in the University with a humble motive to accelerate the overall development of university community towards transforming their lives economically, socially and physically by identifying their talents/ skills and further training them through awareness and skill development programmes. Economically viable areas such as cultivation of mushroom, vegetables, and weaving have been tried in the park.

#### i. Transport Facilities

The University extends adequate bus services from the Campus to Nirjuli, Naharlagun & Itanagar for students and staff at concessional rates. Frequent bus services are provided to NERIST point in Nirjuli on National Highway 52-A, from where public transport facilities can be easily availed.

#### j. V-SAT Facility

VSAT Facility, established in the year 2000 has been extending its services to the university with constant upgradation of its services since its inception. Internet access facility which is an essential service to the university is being monitored and maintained by the facility. Campus-wide Local Area Network (CLAN) of the university which is the core infrastructure in enabling sharing of resources and flow of information within and outside the University has been constantly expanding as the main facilitator of all the IT enabled services. Rajiv Gandhi University, being one of the member institutes of National Knowledge Network (NKN)-astate-of-the- art multi-gigabit pan-India network for providing a unified high speed network backbone for all knowledge related institutions in the country, has laid down the timeline for the commissioning of the NKN 1gbps link. VSAT Facility also provides internet connectivity through a 2mbps leased line link and 1mbps DAMA VSAT link from ERNET India, New Delhi. Both the links supplement each other in case of failure of one thereby rendering 24/7 internet access to the university community.1gbps connectivity under NKN has already been extended to the university by National Informatics Centre (NIC),Itanagar using the leased line circuit from BSNL.

#### k. Extra-Curricular and Co-Curricular Facilities

The University extends facilities for extra-curricular and co-curricular activities to the students. Apart from the auditorium with indoor badminton court, there are tennis, volleyball and basketball courts and a Students Activity Centre. There is a fitness centre for both men and women. All the halls of residence (hostels) are also equipped with badminton courts and facilities for indoor games like table tennis, carroms, etc. The University also participates in Inter-University games and sports competitions. There is also an active NSS unit in the University.

#### 1. Prohibition of Ragging

As per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court, ragging in the campus is strictly prohibited and those found indulging in it shall be liable for expulsion/rustication from the university. An anti-ragging committee is in place to monitor ragging incidents. Any case of ragging may be intimated to the committee.

#### m. Water Harvesting Facility

Six (06) artificial water harvesting systems, with bricks and RCC foundation, were installed in the university campus with a capacity of 1.5 lakh litres each during 2002 (at Academic Block and Central Library each) and 2018 (at Department of CSE, Eco-Park, IDE, and Department of Geography each). Out of six (06) systems, four (04) are operational currently. The water, so stored has been used for gardening and cleaning purposes and the rest are used to recharge the ground water level. Due to availability of the water for nonconventional uses, the green vegetation in the campus is on a path of

growth, and adding aesthetics to the campus life. Further, university has developed two (02) water reservoirs to recharge the ground water naturally, during the rainy season.

#### n. Plastic Free and Green Campus

Rajiv Gandhi University is a fully plastic free and green campus. The huge (81.37%) forest cover, zoo-geographic location, altitudinal variation, various vegetation, high rainfall, different climate regimes etc., contribute in making Arunachal Pradesh an extremely rich biodiversity region. University has hundreds of trees planted in last few years. Also, there is a complete ban on cutting of trees and bird hunting in the campus. Last year, Rajiv Gandhi University Campus has been declared as a fully plastic free zone. The use of solar power, conservation of conventional energy, plastic free campus-Swachhta Hi Sewa and green audit are indicative as well as substantive sustainable practices of RGU campus. Plants provide everything for our survival. All three basic needs for survival, Oxygen, Water and Food we get from plants. University recently completed green audit of the campus to take stock of the per capita carbon footprint. The green audit, conducted during December 2019 to February 2020, has recorded the occurrence of as much as 116 species of trees in the developed area of the Rajiv Gandhi University campus on top of the Rono Hills. All the plants growing inside the campus with Girth at Breast Height (GBH) over 20 cm were spotted identified and measured for GBH. For this purpose, entire development part of the campus was loosely divided into 26 sectors/areas. Rajiv Gandhi University Museum of Fish (RGUMF) maintained by Department of Zoology is actively contributing in conservation and promotion of new fish species.

#### o. Helipad

The University has an own Helipad facility for Helicopter services, catering the needs of University as well as the state.
