

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Part 1: PREFACE




1.1 Background

To commemorate the contributions of one the great sons of this country; Maulana Azad to the cause of education, the Ministry of Education (the then MHRD), Govt of India had decided to celebrate his birthday as National Education Day w.e.f. 2008. Thereafter, every year November is celebrated as the national Education Day. This time too it will be celebrated with the same fervor and intent.

1.2 Resource Persons



Prof Anil Sadgopal, Former member, Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE), MHRD, GOI, New Delhi, former Prof. and Head of Central Institute of Education (CIE, now Faculty of Education, University of Delhi, New Delhi). M.Sc. in Plant Physiology and Biochemistry from Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI), New Delhi (1962);

Ph.D. in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (1968) from the California Institute of Technology, USA; Fellow of Govt. of India's Tata Institute of Fundamental Research

(TIFR), Mumbai (1968-71). At the age of 31, resigned from TIFR to organise a rural education and development programme through KISHORE BHARATI in Hoshangabad District, Madhya Pradesh (1971-1992). In collaboration with the Friends Rural Centre Rasulia, initiated the Hoshangabad Science Teaching Programme (HSTP) in 1972 in 16 government upper primary (Class VI-VIII) schools which was expanded in 1978 to all the 280 odd government upper primary schools of the District. Helped found EKLAVYA in 1982 which later extended HSTP to about 750 government schools in the three states of Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat and Rajasthan wherein almost 50,000 children, with help and support from 2000 plus re-oriented teachers, learnt science through 'hands-on' experiment-based, inquiry-oriented and local milieu-related pedagogy – a phenomenon without precedence in the history of India's education.

Joined the people's science movement and the movement for civil liberties and democratic right in the early eighties; active in the struggle of the Bhopal gas victims against Union Carbide and for obtaining scientific medical treatment and rehabilitation from the Government for which he was jailed; appointed by the Supreme Court on its Committee to recommend measures for Bhopal gas victims' medical treatment and rehabilitation (1986-88);

National Convenor of Bharat Jan Vigyan Jatha (BJVJ), an all-India people's science network (1993-2002); conceived and led BJVJ's Lokshala Programme for demonstrating an alternative vision of Universalisation of Elementary Education through social intervention in the government school system (1995-2002).

Professor of Education in the University of Delhi (1994-2005) an also served as Head, Department of Education and Dean, Faculty of Education; Senior Fellow of the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library (2001-2006). Member of the National Commission on Teachers (1983-84), the National Policy on Education Review Committee or the Acharya Ramamurti Committee (1990) and Central Advisory Board of Education, CABE (2004-06); Member of three CABE committees respectively on (a) Free & Compulsory Education Bill; (b) Girls' Education and Common School System; and (c) Universalisation of Secondary Education (2004-05); Member, National Steering Committee for Review of National Curriculum Framework, NCERT (2004-05); Chairperson, NCERT's National Focus Group on'Work and Education' (2004-05). Member, Common School System Commission, Bihar State Government (2006-07).

Jamnalal Bajaj Award (1980) and Shantiniketan's Rathindra Puraskar (1984) for 'application of science and technology to rural areas'; and Homi Bhabha Award (TIFR) in Science Education, 2018 for 'lifelong contribution to a systematic rethinking of science education in India'. Author of two Hindi books: 'Sangharsh aur Nirman' (Rajkamal, 1993) on the radical trade union movement led by Shankar Guha Niyogi in Chhattisgarh and 'Shiksha mein Badlaav ka Sawal' (Granth Shilpi, 2000) on education policy and need for people's movement; dozens of articles/editorials and several essays in edited volumes on policy analysis and adverse impact of globalisation and communal politics on education.



Prof Mohd Akhtar Siddiqui completed his education from University of Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia, University of Leeds (UK) and HP University. He taught at the Faculty of Education Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi and other institutions for more than 40 years at undergraduate, PG and Ph.D. levels, and guided research work of 30 Ph. D. and Post-Doctoral scholars. As Chairperson of the NCTE, Govt. of India, the apex statutory authority for teacher education, during 2008-11, he took many policy initiatives to reform the teacher education system in the country. The NCFTE-2009 was

developed and brought out under his leadership. On his initiative, TET was introduced as an essential component of teacher qualification in 2010. He was Chairman of the High Powered Committee of the MHRD on Reforms in NCTE and Teacher Education in 2015-16 whose recommendations have been incorporated in the NEP 2020. He has published several research papers and books and has undertaken many research projects funded by international and national agencies.

Part 2: Session wise Details

2.1 Inaugural session

In the inaugural session **Prof. Kesang Degi**, Head, Department of Education welcomed the Resource persons **Prof. Akhtar Siddique** and **Prof. Anil Sadgopal**, audience, participants, faculty members & Head from other departments, Deans of various faculties, distinguished guests and invitees, and all others connected through ZOOM on the occasion and expressed her gratitude towards the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor **Prof. Saket Kushwaha** for the support and providing this opportunity to the department to conduct this Webinar. She highlighted the key contributions of Maula Azad.

Dr. Sumin Prakash, convener of the programme set the tone by presenting the brief biography of Abul Kalam Azad, the first Education Minister of Independent India.

Dr. N. T. Rikam, Registrar opined that though Arunachal Pradesh is not much behind the national level in terms of literacy rate, however it lacks quality, which needs to be essentially maintained.

Prof. A. Mitra, Pro Vice Chancellor mentioned the circumstances and challenges posed before Maulana Azad when he took over as the Minister of education after independence, and elaborated the challenges present at that time in terms of low literacy rate and only 02 crore fund left at that time as education budget of the country.

Dr. Anamika Yadav, convener of the programme conducted the session on the ZOOM platform, invited the speakers and managed the You Tube live session also.

2.2 Plenary sessions (Day wise)

Session - I

Prof. Akhtar Siddique started his talk by elaborating the personality, vision and mission of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad's life and education. He explained that how Azad had contributed towards the reconstruction of education system in post-independent India, and added that the Azad's balanced vision and conviction for value of human beings was most relevant for Indian society of that time, which was ravaged by the partition of the country. Azad advocated for the adult education, informal education, women education and was very much concerned about the improvement of heart and minds of the fellow countrymen; the demand of present time and the focal points of our new National Education Policy (draft) of 2020 even. Prof. Siddique further



added about Maulana Azad's vision of Education, its objectives, related programmes and policies and said that he was the firm believer of democracy and democratization of education for the benefits of mass education. He lamented that Azad had visualized the modern education for the country and formulated the objectives of the modern education which are yet to be achieved. And the most important objective was the man making education i.e. the character building of children and people. Prof. Siddique concluded by saying that Azad had not only appreciated the rights of an individual person and performance of duties but also believed that education will not be effective without empowering the teachers.

Session - II

Prof. Anil Sadgopal remembered Maulana Azad as a man and leader who had wide vision for humanity and humanism as these two were core philosophy of his life. He further added that Maulana Azad advocated for liberating the country through education. Prof. Sadgopal cited several documents and instances where Maulana Azad seemed to be in hurry to implement the agenda of education at time, despite odd social, political and economic situations postindependence. In the inaugural function of CIE at University of Delhi, Azad delivered that we should not wait for funds and buildings to start education, rather we should start first and these things will come along. Prof. Sadgopal expressed wonder that how much far sighted Maulana Azad was. He listed the Institutions established and the Commissions set by Maulana Azad as Education minister like; All India Council for Technical Institution (AICTE), IIT Khadagpur in 1951, University Grants Commission in 1958, Three Lalit-Kala Academies across the country, Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), Four other IITs at Kanpur, Delhi, Bombay and Chennai and was instrumental in setting up many more. He cited the incidence that how Azad had started an engineering institution from one canteen room in West Bengal which later on become the famous IIT Khadagpur. Azad envisioned that India should have standard of scientific, technical and art education were students from not only country, rather from across the world can come for education, therefore, he collaborated with world level institutions like California Institute for Technology and country like Germany to mentor establishing our IIT's. His core philosophy of humanism was reflected in the decisions of his ministry, wherein he had provisioned for several scholarship schemes for SCs, STs, OBCs as part of equalizing the educational opportunity for all. Prof. Sadgopal unraveled the virtues of Abul Kalam and pointed



that he was really "Azad", not bounded by sectarian boundaries, like; state, nation, language, and he always contributed for Hindu-Muslim unity; was the very foundation of his thought.

Prof. Sadgopal concluded his talk by opining that mere celebration of Education day is not enough, rather we should strive for fulfillment of central vision of Maulana Azad for education, as mentioned in the preamble of our constitution, which mandates for ensuring state sponsored free and compulsory quality education for all children up to 14 years of age. The day we realize this dream, we in real sense will be celebrating education day.

2.5 Valedictory Session

In the brief valedictory session **Prof. Saket Kushwaha**, Vice Chancellor, RGU, and Chairman of the Education Day Webinar in his concluding remarks highlighted the vision of Maulana Azad's vision for education in Post-Independent India and elucidated that such programme should not be observed on only single day, rather everyday should be education day for us, and we need to continue to achieve the goals of education on daily basis.

Dr. Sumin Prakash took the opportunity to extend formal vote of thanks. On behalf of the Department of education he expressed his gratitude towards **Prof. Akhtar Siddique**, and **Prof. Anil Sadgopal** who convened it to accept the invitation and agreed to speak on the occasion and interact with the participants. Dr. Prakash expressed his deep sense of gratitude towards academic fraternity, all the participants, colleagues from the department and University, RGUTA, RGUSU, all the students who attend or tuned to the programme through You Tube live and all those who directly or indirectly contributed in whatever capacity to make this webinar a real success.

This way the Education Day Webinar, 2020 concluded with the resolve that Maulana Azad vision for education need to much elaborated upon and his message should reach to the masses.

3.1 Immediate Implications in the context of knowledge

This webinar thrown light on the life and vision of Maulana Azad. 
