Executive Summary

Rajiv Gandhi University has organized a Three-Day Trans- Disciplinary International Conclave on Universal Happiness in Post-Truth Era-Market, Media, Technology, and Global Well-Being: An Educational Perspective for Gen-Next from 27 April - 29 April, 2022. The conclave has been one of its kind as it was jointly organized by twelve (12) departments including Mass Communication, Social Work, Education, Psychology, Management, Commerce, Sociology, English, Physical Education, Electronics & Communication Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering and Fine Arts & Music in collaboration with eight (08) external collaborators/sponsoring partners including Hills College of Teacher Education, Lekhi, Arunachal Pradesh; Vivekananda Kendra College of Teacher Education, (VKCTE), Nirjuli; Gandhi King Foundation, Hyderabad; Bank of Baroda, RGU Branch; Don Bosco College, Itanagar; East News, North East India, RD Constructions, Arunachal Pradesh and NEEPCO, Doimukh. Cutting across subject domains and disciplinary boundaries, the mega conclave intended to sensitize different stakeholders of the society and educational system on 'happiness' and its pursuit in an increasingly complex world. Nearly 1000 (precisely 964) delegates attended the webinar in blended mode.

Pradesh; Prof. Dilip Debnath, Member & Eastern Region Coordinator NICC- IP, AICTE; have graced the conclave among others. More than one hundred forty research papers have been received for the conclave.

The intended target audience of conclave included every person cutting across subject domains as the universal concerns of happiness and global well-being included everyone in all sectors of the society in general and educators as well as development practitioners and media professionals in particular. The international conclave aimed to benefit students, research scholars, academicians, social scientists, social workers, media policy makers, journalists and other media professionals in their personal and professional pursuits. It emerged during the conclave that happiness requires a cooperated societal effort to realise for all irrespective of class, culture or other demarcations. Also, it was concluded that globally established patterns of measuring happiness have an inherent western bias. Each of the first two days of conclave witnessed cultural evenings during which more than two hundred students, scholars, artists and faculty members from organizing departments participated to showcase the indigenous culture and Indian Knowledge Traditions guided by 'unity in diversity' as prevailing sub-theme. On 30th April, 2022, the conclave concluded with a local adventure trip for participants. The tourist attractions of Cultural Buddhist Centre, Jawaharlal Nehru State Museum and Pare Dam location comprised the highlights in this regard. The participants from various zones and states visited the Jawaharlal Nehru State Museum where they got to know about the rare archives and artefacts of different ethnic communities of Arunachal Pradesh on display in the museum.

Part 1

Preface

1.1. About the Host Institution(s)

The Rajiv Gandhi University

The Rajiv Gandhi University (formerly Arunachal University) is the premier institution for higher education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh located at the picturesque tabloid of Rono Hills approximately 25 km away from the state capital Itanagar. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation stone of the University on 4th February 1984 at Rono Hills. Ever since its inception, the University has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfill the objectives as envisaged in the University Act. The University was recognized as a Central University in the year 2007 established under the Act of Parliament. Being the lone Central University of the State at present there are Thirty-Six (36) Departments and Three (03) Institutes functioning under Eleven (11) Academic Faculties. The faculty members have been actively engaged in research activities. The University has been maintaining its academic credibility and has been recognized by UGC as a center with potential for excellence. Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), the lone central varsity in Arunachal Pradesh, has secured the second position among all central varsities in the country. Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh has also been awarded the title of Best Central University of the Year 2020 during the 3rd Himalayan Educators Summit-2020 & 3rd Divya Himgiri Himalayan State Education Excellence Award-2020 to recognize the efforts of leading educational institutes of the Himalayan States that are substantially contributing to the Education sector.

Organizing Departments (12)

Department of Social Work, RGU

The Department of Social Work (DSW) at Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) was established in 2015 with the vision of providing quality Social Work Education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh. DSW at RGU is the first full-fledged Department of Social Work offering face-to-face Master of Arts in Social Work (MASW) Program in the state with a total of four regular faculty members and sixteen students in the first batch which has now been increased to thirty-five (35) including three seats for Economically Weaker Section (EWS). The Doctoral Program in Social Work (Ph.D.) was introduced in July 2018 to focus on strengthening the research component in the region with an emphasis on 'evidence-based practice and practice-based evidence'. Classroom lectures and social work practicum form the main crux of the Program (both MASW & Ph.D.). The students are also exposed to carefully crafted skill building and personality development programs and are provided with opportunities to participate in workshops, seminars and lectures from external experts on regular basis.



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Department of Education, RGU

The Department of Education was established in 1988 by recruiting one Professor, three Readers and four Lecturers. The Department launched the B.Ed. programme in the academic session 1988-89 as it was desired by the Government of Arunachal Pradesh for clearing the backlog of untrained teachers [3] working in secondary and senior secondary schools. The Department was also set up with the objective of producing the faculty for teaching at college and University level. M.A. (Education) three years course was needed at the college level to teach the students of B.A. (Hons) of Education. M.Ed. programme was started in 2014 as per the UGC XII plan allocation order of MHRD, Government of India.

Department of Mass Communication, RGU

The Department of Mass Communication (DMC) at Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) was established in 2004 the university entered into a MoU with the Centre for Cultural Research & Documentation (CCRD), a leading local research organization, to start a course in Mass Communication. The Department introduced Post Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication (PGDMC) in the academic year 2004-05. The Department currently offers M.A. in Mass Communication under CBCS system, Post Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication [PGDMC], M.Phil. & Ph.D. Programmes.

Department of Psychology, RGU

The Department of Psychology was established in the year 2017. The Department was set up to develop an awareness of the importance of studying human behavior and the societal relevance of psychology. The Department offers M.A. Psychology which is of four semesters and the curriculum is so designed as to provide strong theoretical, methodological and contemporary knowledge of various areas of Psychology to the students. The purpose is to equip the students with knowledge, skills and values to become effective and competent professional psychologists. During the course, the students are taken for field visit at mental health centres and counselling cells besides interactive classroom teaching and laboratory training. Time to time extended lectures from experts in relevant field is also conducted. This academic training enables the students to work in a broad range of settings such as medical, organization, counselling centres, NGOs, researchers and academicians. The department has also started offering PhD programme with 8 Research Scholars from the academic session of 2021.

Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, RGU

The Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering at Rajiv Gandhi University (A Central University), Rono Hills, Itanagar was established in the year 2015 with the aim of providing leadership in the field of Electronics & Communication Engineering and interdisciplinary research. The initiative has been taken to establish state of art research laboratories in the area of VLSI Design and Technology, MEMS and Sensors, Embedded System, Wireless Communication and Signal Processing. Department provides healthy environment to students and faculties to carry out inter department collaborative research in area like Bio medical Engineering and robotics. A team of competent and dedicated teachers are engaged in relentless pursuit of excellence in this field of engineering.

Department of Computer Science & Engineering, RGU

The Department of Computer Science was established in 2005, with a diploma course of one-year duration, and a three-year undergraduate course, Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA). The first and second batch of the BCA programme has completed and the third batch has started from the session 2008-2009, starting from July, 2008. In the year 2006 the Master of Technology in Computer Science and Engineering was started in the department. The department has started the Master of Computer Application course from the session 2013-14.

Department of Management, RGU

The Department of Management was set up in the year 2005 with the introduction of One- Year Post-Graduate Diploma Course in Hospitality Management and Tourism (PGDHMT) with an intake capacity of 21 students. In the year 2006, the Department also introduced **Two year full time MBA Programme** with an intake capacity of 30 students. The MBA Programme offers several specialization papers like Marketing, Finance and Human Resource Management. Presently, the department is run by six full-time faculty members i.e. five Assistant Professors and one Associate Professor. One Professor is on lien. Besides, the department also has its own two-storeyed building (area 1305.79 sq.m) and other essential facilities such as one computer lab and library for Departmental students, furniture, etc to run the offered courses smoothly.

Department of Commerce, RGU

The post graduate department of commerce was started in the year 1995 with only two faculties. As of today the department is equipped with well-furnished classrooms, internet and Wi-Fi facility. The department has 10 qualified and dedicated faculty members. The department also maintain departmental library for free access of books. The department currently offers two year (4 semesters)



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post-graduation programme (M.Com) under CBCS system, one year (2 semesters) Post Graduate Diploma in Banking and Insurance (PGDBI), M.Phil. and Ph.D. programme. Under the aegis of the department, one year Diploma in Computerized Accounting (DCA) has also been started with effect from 2015-16 under the Community College Scheme of the UGC at RGU.

Department of Physical Education, RGU

Department of Physical Education a constituent unit of Rajiv Gandhi University (A Central University) established in the year 2015 to promote physical education and develop an interest among people regarding the need and importance sports and exercise which is medium to improve the community health. The syllabi of the courses are so designed as to prepare professionally qualified leaders and teachers in physical education. The infrastructures developed are as per the NCTE standard and norms. 1.3. Overture: Media Technology, Post-Truth Era, and Universal Happiness

Powered by the advent of digital technology, the democratization of media technology has made media and communication tools more accessible to more people even in the remotest areas. This enables them to participate in the information and communication ecosystem of the society through media tools and platforms like social media, alternative media, mobile and online journalism, news portals, blogs etc. This information revolution has liberating qualities but the recent changes in the media landscape made us realize that it is a double-edged sword and the global communications culture is in chaotic transition. While the space for free speech has expanded dramatically, access to reliable and trusted sources of news has narrowed down even as traditional news media have shrunk in terms of media ethics.

According to the Selective Exposure Theory and its precursor Cognitive Dissonance Theory, people tend to select specific aspects of exposed information which they incorporate into their mindset. These selections are made based on their perspectives, beliefs, attitudes, and decisions rather than objective facts. This aspect of human nature is exploited by people with malicious and vested interest in the Posttruth Era. The term Post-truth is a periodizing concept that 'relates to or denotes circumstances in which objective facts are less influential in shaping public opinion than appeals to emotion and personal belief (Oxford Dictionary). Likewise, post-truth politics emerged as a kind of politics in which emotion and personal belief are more influential in shaping public opinion rather than objective facts. Thanks to its hyper use in communication context around the 2016 United States presidential election and the Brexit referendum, Oxford Dictionary named it as the Word of the Year in 2016. Many intellectuals feel that the Post-truth Era is associated with 21st century communication technologies and cultural practices including spread of untruthfulness, lies, deception, and deliberate falsehood. Exploiting such a situation, people who are working for self-interest and not for public good can easily hijack powerful media technology for narrow politics and commercial exploitation of the new communications landscape. Misuse of media tools corrupts the wider landscape of public information while weaponized narratives and false contents magnified by social media make media itself a direct threat not only to democracy but also indirectly to the collective universal happiness and well-being of the society.



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Universal happiness is in terms of 'a more inclusive, equitable and balanced approach to economic growth that promotes sustainable development, poverty eradication, happiness and the well-being of all peoples' (UN, 2012). In 2012, the United Nations identified the pursuit of happiness as 'a fundamental human goal' and promotes a more holistic approach to public policy and economic growth - one that recognizes happiness and wellbeing as important pieces of sustainable and equitable development. The World Happiness Report (WHR) of the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network is issued every year since 2012. WHRs give rankings of national happiness, based on respondent ratings of their own lives, which the report also correlates with. In these reports, the ranking of countries on happiness is done on the data from the Gallup World Poll which measures quality of life factors in 14 areas viz. (1) business & economic, (2) citizen engagement, (3) communications & technology, (4) diversity (social issues), (5) education & families, (6) emotions (well-being), (7) environment & energy, (8) food & shelter, (9) government and politics, (10) law & order (safety), (11) health, (12) religion & ethics, (13) transportation, and (14) work.

As of March 2021, Finland had been ranked the happiest country in the world four times in a row. Other leaders in happiness index includes five happiest countries in the world were Denmark, Switzerland, Iceland, and Norway. However, the ranking of happiness may be a matter for debate because the concept of happiness scores differs when viewed from individualist culture whose focus is on personal attainment of happiness and collectivist cultures where the focus is on group and community goals. This may explain the difference between the happiness scores of typical Western cultures and Eastern cultures (Bryony Shaw, 2016). Psychologist Brett Ford et. al. (2015) opine that the negative association between pursuing happiness and achieving happiness isn't cross-culturally universal. Since universal happiness is associated with social bonds and social responsibility, it is to be understood in social terms rather than individualistic definition. As such, aspiration for attaining universal happiness calls for efforts to create the conditions, right perspectives, resources, and support that successfully foster happiness - the highest attainable standard of social mental health and well-being.

1.4. About the Conclave

With established socio-economic systems, India, in ancient times, was wealthy, prosperous and self-reliant. And the collective happiness of the Indians was manifested in her rich treasure of colorful festivals and grand social celebrations. However, universal happiness on societal level were elusive under foreign and colonial rules. Post-independence India, as a nation, has been struggling to provide large sections of her citizens with bare minimum basics of social happiness - food, shelter, and clothing. Information and communication gaps in the vast country have been identified as main causes for such a situation. Newspapers, radio, television etc. played limited role in catering to the communication needs of invisible sections on the margin of the society. Fortunately, the advent of digital media technology and its democratization has made media and communication tools more accessible to more people thereby causing information revolution with liberating qualities. Today, anybody with a smart phone can click, process and share the image and texts instantly to the masses thereby turning the passive media users into active content creators and producers of mass communication adding much to the public information environment. However, media technology is a double-edged sword and communication transformation has downsides too.

The danger of manipulating the new media tools for anti-social purposes has increased many folds since responsible traditional media have lost important social function being replaced by social media, albeit sans moral or ethical guidelines. In the post truth era, media - both mass and social- allegedly contribute to spreading lies. The feel-good information, whether true or lie, are spread through media technology-enabled channels without gate-keeping. The innovations in media technology, reach and efficiency of internet and online applications like social media enable more people to create and instantly spread manipulative narratives in the post-truth era when people tend to find information that syncs with their perspectives and information that aligns with their views. This transformation from 'one to many' communication model to 'many to many' model led to a typical scenario of 'more people' means 'more problem'. In such a chaotic information and communication environment, social media like Facebook leaves users in online echo chambers or silos of like-minded people thereby promoting increased cyber bullying, trolling and fake news which have immense impact on individual's thought and behaviour. Such division of people into separate camps, at times even inciting them to express anger and hatred, do not motivate them to seek out verified information but they are happy in hearing or seeing what confirms their views. So, in one way they are trading off universal well-being for individual happiness.

If information is power, misinformation is more powerful in destruction. And misinformation and fake news will exist. In such a situation the future is not secure for the gen next. Besides, young people are growing into a world where people are losing their capability to question and to refuse. In this so-called post-truth era, while regulatory options are clueless about the mode of intervention in the massive information ecosystem, this phenomenon calls for a concerted effort from every discipline. There is a popular adage in Hindi -"Loha Loheko Katta hai" (meaning Like cures like). Taking cue from this adage, the solution to the ills created through misuse of media technology should have solution in media technology itself. Media technology should be used in a proper way to counter the post truth era narratives. Nonetheless, media technologies are not entirely responsible for false information, it is rather due to human flaw as consumers and producers of information. So, the solution lies in producing and consuming better-quality information. The generation next should be empowered to become consumers and producers of information with the inculcation of sense of aspiration for the well-being of all peoples, not only limited to own happiness as individuals. They should be able to see media as an enabler for democracy to foster a thriving, resilient, and compassionate society powered by quality information environment which has relevance for a long-term vision like universal happiness. For this, [6] improving ethical education in terms of critical thinking, social literacy, information literacy, and cyberliteracy besides media literacy will go a long way in improving the information environment.

This being the backdrop, it is quite appropriate to highlight the significance of democratization of media technology and its use in desirable manner for creating conditions for fostering universal collective social happiness instead of individualistic happiness in the challenging post truth era of chaotic information environment. The generation next deserves a safe and better information environment now which will go a long way in reversing the post truth era in the posterity and in sustaining a self-reliant India of universal happiness, a noble Indian legacy from the ancient times. In this regard, the proposed Three-Day Trans-Disciplinary International Conclave Happiness Conclave-2022 will have the following objectives along with the expected learning outcome for adding quality to education.



1.5. Programme Objectives and Expected Outcomes

His holiness Shankacharya while addressing the audience stressed upon spirituality said that it is a broad concept with room for many perspectives. In general, it includes a sense of connection to

something bigger than ourselves, and it typically involves a search for meaning in life. As such, it is a universal human experience—something that touches us all. People may describe a spiritual experience as sacred or transcendent or simply a deep sense of aliveness and interconnectedness. He also emphasized on the importance of Happiness in the present time. He said that the "pursuit of happiness" is the central point of Indian Spiritual system and Bharatiya Gyan Parampara which emphasised that different people feel happiness for different reasons (multiculturalism) characterised by the essence of Unity in Diversity. Whenever doing something causes happiness, people usually want to do more of it. No one ever complained about feeling too much happiness.

India has always been known as a knowledge society. Derived from the verbal root vid meaning to know, the Vedas as shruti, are considered the fountainhead of what came to be known as the Indic Knowledge Tradition. He emphasized that the contribution of Bharatiya Gyan Parampara is immense in almost all fields of intellectual inquiry. For example, physician Sushruta describes rhinoplasty surgery in 600 BCE in his book Sushruta Samhita. Similarly, the so-called Pythagorean theorem first occurs, according to the Fields Medalist mathematician Manjul Bhargava, about 800 BCE in Baudhhayana's Shulba Sutra. The Western world is finally recognizing the fact that the Indian mathematicians had mastered the basic mathematical algorithm of addition, subtraction, and division at least a thousand years earlier than the Europeans. His holiness also emphasized on Vedic Mathematics and its relevance for providing all the solutions. Pujyapad Jagadguru Shankaracharya Swami Shri Nischalananda Saraswati Maharajji, Govardhan Math, Puri talked about micro to macro knowledge and importance of tatva gyan, importance of human values and dignity for helping people live well, achieve personal growth, and make the world a better place. When there will be peace and happiness in the society, celebrating Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav will be the monumental occasion for all with regard to building new and *Atmanirbhar Bharat*.

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The visitors were taken to a dam site located in Pare. They were mesmerised by the view and expressed their views on nature and development of the state.



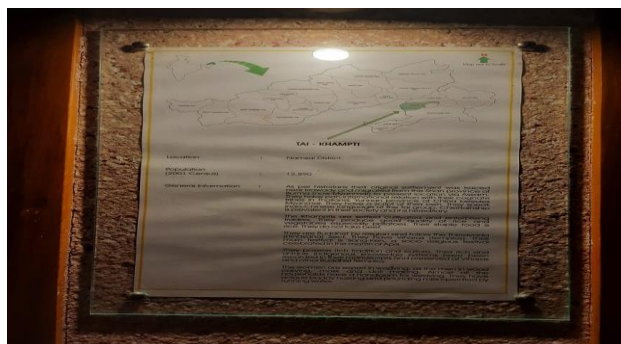

Part 3:

Major Takeaways

3.1. Academic Context

Happiness is angling to become the metric of the future. Nation states have begun to compete in global happiness rankings and plan policy according to statistics of well-being.

The idea that happiness can be measured and mapped, and that it varies geographically, is now established. Every three years since 2012, a World Happiness Report releases eagerly awaited global rankings of happiness. These are based on a global survey that asks people to evaluate how they feel about their life on a scale from zero to ten. The rankings are usually dominated by the Nordic countries, with Finland currently topping the list.

While people might generally feel that their happiness is something intangible which cannot be given a number, this new measurement approach is increasingly popular among governments who want to move beyond economic growth as a measure of a nation's value and progress. Meanwhile, a global movement for transforming current economic models to one based on well-being is gathering support.

In this backdrop, this conclave has brought together the academia and scholars of twelve different department cutting across subject domains together with eight worthy collaborators, in the process benefitting nearly 1000 (Precisely Nine Hundred and Sixty Four-964) in both online and offline mode.

The eternal pursuits of happiness and well-being were reflected during three days of technical sessions and one more day of adventure trip making way for larger academic discourses in days to come.



3.2. Research context

It emerged through the deliberations that the indicators of measuring happiness have an inherent western bias. The philosophic traditions of Bharatiya Gyan Parampara were found to be marginalised in indicators of measuring happiness. International Happiness Day is celebrated every year on 20th March to highlight the importance of happiness in the diurnal lives of people.

The United Nations started to celebrate the International Day of Happiness in 2013 but a resolution for the same was passed in July, 2012.

This resolution was first initiated by Bhutan which emphasised on the importance of national happiness over national income since the early 1970s, thereby adopting the Gross National Happiness (GNH) over Gross National Product (GNP).

Gross National Happiness: The phrase 'gross national happiness' was first coined by the 4th King of Bhutan, King Jigme Singye Wangchuck, in 1972.

The concept implies that sustainable development should take a holistic approach towards notions of progress and give equal importance to non-economic aspects of wellbeing. The Conclave highlighted that Values of Indian Society in particular and East in general viz. Family System, Social Capital, Spirituality and Empathy should take front seat as compared to western values of economy led development and other material parameters.

3.3. Policy Making and Practice Context

The Conclave has highlighted that policy makers and practitioners need to shift their priorities from GDP and GNP led development discourse to Happiness led social satisfaction related parameters.

Happiness Index is a development philosophy as well as an index which is used to measure the collective happiness in a nation. The concept was first used in Bhutan.

The term 'Happiness Index' was coined in 1979 during an interview at Bombay airport when the then king of Bhutan, Jigme Singye Wangchuck, said "We do not believe in Gross National Product. Gross National Happiness is more important."

Happiness index is measured using parameters like *Housing, Income, Work, Community, Civic Engagement, Education, Environment, Health, Life Satisfaction, Safety and Life-Work balance*.

The World Happiness Report's use of a single item indicator measure of subjective well-being is fundamentally different from more traditional Index approaches which use a range of indicators such as the United Nation's Human Development Index, the OECD Better Life Index of 2011, or the Social Progress Index of 2013. There has also been an on-going debate regarding single-item and multi-item scales as measures of life satisfaction.

The idea that subjective well-being can be captured by a survey has also been contested by economists, who have identified that people's assessments of their happiness can be affected by the way in which, for example, their country's education system grades exams, and that survey questions on subjective wellbeing are affected by response styles.

4.1. Food and Refreshments

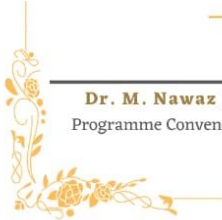
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
