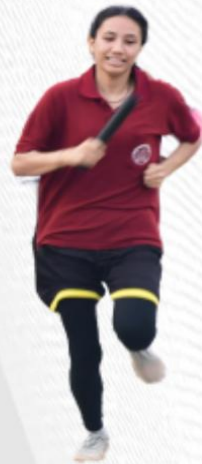

## **A Report**

### **RGU's Inter Departmental Annual Sports Meet-2023 concludes:**

#### **Department of Physical Education emerged over all champions**

Rajiv Gandhi University conducted a three day long Inter-Departmental Annual Sports Meet-2023, a multisport event from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2023, which was participated by the team of students representing various departments, wherein they competed against each other in seven sports disciplines, namely; basketball, volleyball, cricket (7 over a side), badminton, table tennis, athletics and tug of war. 784 students from 24 departments participated in this sports meet.

This event got kick started on 21<sup>st</sup> April with an inaugural ceremony by the Vice Chancellor of the university Prof. Saket Kushwaha, in presence of Dean, Faculty of Education and Sports Sciences Prof. T. Lungdim and Dean of Students' Welfare Prof. Gibji Nimasow. Prof. Kushwaha in his address talked about the spirit of sportsmanship and shared his life experiences as to how both winning and losing does convey the messages that one should always strive to compete irrespective of the results of success or failure. The inaugural ceremony was marked by a choreographic display of Yoga asanas by the students.

Attending the valedictory cum prize distribution ceremony as Chief Guest, the Joint Registrar of RGU Dr. David Pertin, praised the sportsmanship spirit of the participants as they braved the rains and heat alike and lauded them for availing the facilities available in the university which is trying to provide amenities in promoting learning through sports activities to nurture and guide the students in their career building and personality development by imbibing healthy and staying fit, as sports is an integral part of life for good physical fitness and strength. He further said that, sports makes life more interesting and teaches one to work hard and reach a new high and teaches the essence of discipline, respect, friendship, leadership, resilience, coordination and teamwork. Among others, the Head of the Department of Physical Education Dr. Sambhu Prasad, Assistant Director (Physical Education) Dr. Vivek Kumar Singh, Organising committee members and faculty members from the department of Physical Education & Sports Sciences Dr. K. Rojeet Singh, Sangey Tsering and Dr. Hemantajit Gogoi among others spoke during the closing ceremony of the competition.

The Department of Physical Education team emerged as the overall champions of the sports meet, while the Department of Sports Sciences team secured the second position and the third position was grabbed by the Department of Education team in the medals and points tally. The Department of Geography team was awarded the Best Disciplined Team Award. The trophies, medals and certificates were given away to the podium finishers by the Joint Registrar of RGU Dr. David Pertin, Head Department of Physical Education Dr. Sambhu Prasad, Head in-charge of the Department of Psychology Dr. Dharmeshwari Lourembam, faculty member from the Department of Botany Dr. Evelin Heikam, and other faculty members present on the occasion.

In 100 mtr sprint of women, 34 female students of different departments participated wherein a B.PEd. trainee Gonjum Bam clinched the gold medal with timing of 15.51 seconds, while another BPEd. trainee Tamchi Yapi bagged the silver and Gerap Miyu of the Department of Zoology grabbed the bronze medal.

The second day of the competition saw the finals of athletics events, including long jump, high jump, discus throw, javelin throw, shot put and 4x100 mtr. relay races. In which students of various departments won medals.

In 7 over a side cricket final match for women the Sports Science team defeated their counterparts from the Department of Physical Education. While in the men's cricket final match, the Department of Physical Education team defeated their counterparts from the Department of Sports Science.

In the finals of the Women's Tug of War competition, Sports Science team secured 1<sup>st</sup> position by defeating Department of Education team in a thriller, while in men's category the Department of Physical Education team emerged winners and the Department of Management team had to be contented with the second position in a straight two setter loss.

In badminton singles (men's category) Matung Camder Tok from the Department of Physical Education emerged winner defeating Neelam Teji from the Department of Zoology while Kulenso Pul from the department of Commerce bagged the third position. In the badminton doubles (men's category) Kenjom Tacha-Rupamchandra Sharma from the Department of Physical Education emerged winner defeating Tanil Tabang-Taje Pali from the Department of Geography while Inao Zauseng Singpho-Johnson Panmei from the department of Management bagged the third position.

In Table Tennis singles (women's category) Diana Moyong from the Department of Agricultural Sciences emerged winner defeating Ken Noram from the Department of Sports Sciences while Charu Moni from the department of Economics bagged the third position.

## Physical edn dept emerges overall champion of RGU's inter-departmental sports meet

**RONO HILLS, 24 Apr:** The physical education department of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) emerged the overall champions of the university's annual three-day inter-departmental sports meet, which was held here from 21-23 April.

The sports science team secured the second position, while the education department team stood third in the medals and points tally. The geography department team received the award for the 'best disciplined team'.
