AGENDA ITEMS FROM EXAMINATION BRANCH

1. Discontinuat on of supplementary examination for UG and PG.

The AC noted hat Supplementary Examination was introduced in the vear 2015-16 academic session after a special equest by the students and tc enable end semester students (i.e. $5^{11}$ Semester for US and $3^{\text {ro }}$ Semester for PG) to clear their lacklogs before the end semester i.e. $6^{\text {th }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ of UG and PG respectively. Further the AC note: that this was introduced with the view that if a studeny fails the paper in $3^{\text {td }}$ semer: er of PG and $G^{-1 / \prime}$ Semester of UG the same student has to wait for almost a yeat to clear the back japer in the :espective semester examination even he or she has passed the 6 'h Semester.
Now, this supplementaly system is hamparing the smioth conduct of examination especially arrangement of Question Papers, moderation and evalation as it is done in the middle of the academir sessign. it disfurbs the routine academic classes of the college as many reports have come from the dolleges regarding the inconvenience caused by the supplementary examinations. The University Ordinange provides a pro:ision for the students to clear the backlog pape:s through re-chedk and appearing back naper examinatirn in the respective semester. In many universities the supplementary system ol examination. is no longer practised except for few professional coyrses like Homeopathic as prer its own national council.
Therefore, it is proposed to discontinue the supplementary examinations to avoid duplicities atid inconvenience claused'by il.
The AC discussed the imatter and decided o follow rulf:rand regilations envisaged in the RGU Examination Ordinance and NCTE, AICTE, BOI, MCI, HCI E: INC, as the case may be.
2. Double course/degree in ore academic session.

The $A C$ noted that many siudents who have back papers in the fina apply for admission in B.Ed. which is agains the university rules as nф degrees at a same time in an academic $y$ :ar. While preparing the date sheet many students approach the Office of CoE irilorming that !!e dates of two examinations (back paper of PG and B.Ed. is colliding). As per rule a student with ! lack paper is still coṇsidered as incomplete and hence technically he or she cannot iake admissicalin B.Ed withou. passing out of PG courses in back papers. Therefore, such students should no be aliowed to talke admission without completing the back papers.
The AC perused and approved the propo :the Council also felt pursuing two degrees in an açademic year is illegal and nence it was clecided that students should not be allowed to take. admission without completing back paper(:).

## 3. RGUMPET - Paper-I

The AC noted that RGUMPE: is basically a research oriented test o determine the students' knowledge of the subject anci research apt:tude. Therefore, fhis entrance test mainly focuses on research aptitude and subject concern. Tl Paper-I which s object ve type in nature has less significance that may not completely judge :he ability of students for research as there are many questions of general knowled玉e nature whi $h$ has no relevance for research work.
As per 2016 M.Phil. and Ph.D.reguiation, elitrance test is qua ifying in hature and more weightage is given to personal interview/interaction.
Therefore, it is proposed that Paper-I of RGUMPET may be discontinued. In place of this a descriptive type question witt: a section wherein a candidate máy wrige an essay on concern area consisting of 25 marks and interview may be conducted for all thpse who qualify.

The $A C$ perused and resolved to constitute a committee to look into the matter threadbare.
4. Teacher's Seat and M.Phii. exemption fo•Ph.D.

The AC noted that at present RGUMPET tle ere is no seat allocation dr option to select Teachers through open/qucta mode is nentioned. Those eligible faculties should have a seat allocation in respective department.
Further, for getting an exerretion from Entrance test Ni.Ph|l. Scholars should have passed and possess M.Phil. Marksheet/ce tificate or $l$. `ir final result deciared befgre applying for RGUMPET. Those scholars whose resuls are awaiter and not declared before|last date of submission of application for RGUMPET stoali not be eligil. 'e for exemption. Such scholar has to compete through open category.

The AC perused and deferred the proposal far seat allocationt to teachers in Ph.D.
further, it was resolved that:
a) M.Phil scholar whose results are being awaited shall be allowed for this year only for admission to Ph.D. as per the proisions and prevalent practices. From next year $31^{\text {st }}$ of March will be fixed as the last da e of submission of M. Phi dissertation. This may be circulated to all the l: epartments, ind
b) A committee will be constituted to look into the matter In detail.
5. Retention of Practical fee by Colleges:

The $A C$ noted that as per normal practice ill colleges subrnit the exam fee alongwith Practical fee. All colleges have requested to allow the college to retain all Practical fee as practical exam/test is conducted in cbllege and finds difficulties to meet up the expenditure related to practical exam. i.e. TA/DA, remuneration and other related issues.

The $A C$ perused and resolved to continue the existing piactice for now.
6. Issue of Degice Certificate in Colleges.

The $A C$ noted that the University issues desee certificate to all candidntes who have qualified the exam and admitted/conferred during bor ocation. Mi:y students come from distant places to collect the certificate after convocation fro $n$ RGU office
Therefore, to minimise't the trouble faced by students while coming from far distance to collect certificate, it isproposed to issue certificates to student $n$ their respective colleges. Any fee, if not paid, can be remitted in University Accourt through R:GS. A copy of which may be retained in colleges and cduld be submitted to RGU with all detail ir a consolidated menner. The $A C$ perused and did not approve the $i$ roposal.

Any other item, with the permission of th: Chair.
Agenda items proposed by Dean, Facuity or Social Science:
(i) Proposal to downsize the existing posts of Dean:

The AC noted that, Prof Tana Showren, Dean, Faculty o' jocial Science, is of the opinion that there may be downsiking of the existing 7 posts of Dean to actual proportion, i.e. 3 posts.
The $A C$ discussed the matter and did not : pprove the $p$ :oposal.
(ii) To maintain the establishment of rhronological order in listing the name of the Departments in all official correspondences:
The $A C$ noted that there is a suggestion for maintaining chronological order in listing the name of the Departmerfts in all dfficial cerrespondences as per the date of establishment of Departments. The AC discussed. the matter and approved the proposal to be introduced from the session 201920 only for corfvocation purpose.
(i) Proposal for Smart class: The deport. ent has endorsed the use of ICTs in higher education system on the lirie of $U \in C$ initiatives anci suggested tirit selting up of Smart Classes be there in RGU's departr: ents.
The AC perused and approved the setting up of muilimedia system and screen/board in the Department as provided to other departi:ients.
(ii) Eligibility for admission $\cap$ Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Sanitation (PGDES): The BPGS (Sociology) has proposed it to de "Graduate in Social Science projects with $50 \%$ marks from. a recognized University".
The $A C$ perused and approved that the programme will be run in self-financing mode.
(iii) For additional Posts if Teachers ':r running Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Sanitation (PGDES): The D( pt, is of the opinion that there should be appointment of three more teachers (Assistant Professors) to smoothy run the said course. The AC perused and approved the proposal.

The AC noted that recently the University) authority has approved the UGC new format for Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) prepared by the University IQAC, to be filled by the faculty members of the University. The same has been administratively issued and posted on University website also. The Notice and the copy of format issued in this regard were placed to AC for perusal.
The AC ratified the action taken by the University.
To discuss on the withdrawal of NCTE recognition to DECTE, Pasighat:
The AC noted that the Direc.iJr, CDE-REU has brought to the notice of the authority that, the NCTE has recently withdrawn tie recognition, granted to Daying Ering College of Teacher Education, Pasighat w.e.f. the academic session 2019 - 0 vide its letter No. ER271.1.23/(APEOO564)/B.Ed/?019/60510 ! lated 21.5 .2019 for not adhering to the observations and conditions of NCTE. The letter of Ni.TE addressed to the Registrar, RGU intimating the arne was placed to $A C$.
The AC discussed the matter and resolved that RGU as ap affiliating University will stand with the NCTE decision. The AC decided that affiliation granted to the college shall remain suspended till the matter is resolved. Necessary official proceedings shall be taken up with the College at the earliest in this regard.

The AC noted that the Director, CDC-RCU has brought to the notice of the university authority that, there has been a ser:cus case of $f$ rgery of a University Teacher's signature on a Selection Board meeting minutes. This has bee noticed during the screening of documents in file of Teachers Training College, $\therefore$ Ilo recently or their application for grant of Permanent Affiliation. The comrnittee in the re; ort for the same has remarked that, "In the course of vetting the documents, in file, the committee found that there was a forgery of signature of the Chairman of the Selection Board in the meeting minutes. The meeting was held on $18^{\text {in }}$ July 2012.' This has been taken very seriously, and the committee suggested that an enquiry should be initiated administratively".
