1. About the University and Collaborating Centres

The University

Rajiv Gandhi University (formerly Arunachal University) is the premier institution for higher education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh located at the picturesque tabloid of Rono Hills approximately 25 km away from the state capital Itanagar. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation stone of the University on 4th February 1984 at Rono Hills. Ever since its inception, the University has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfill the objectives as envisaged in the University Act. The University was recognized as a Central University in the year 2007 established under the Act of Parliament. Being the only Central University of the State at present there are Twenty-Six (26) Departments and Two (02) Institutes functioning under Nine (09) Academic Faculties. The Faculty members have been actively engaged in research activities. The University has been maintaining its academic excellence. The students from the University are contributing at significant positions not only in State and Central Government Services, but also in various Institutions, Industries and Organizations.

About the International Centre for Gandhian and Peace Studies (ICGPS)

The Department of History has completed 40 (forty) years of its existence in May 2020. Since its inception it has been successfully implementing its mission of providing quality and innovative education and carrying out research activities with thrust on innovation. Prior to the present location, the Department had been functioning since 1980 in Jawaharlal Nehru Government College at Pasighat, which was taken over by the erstwhile Arunachal University (now Rajiv Gandhi University) in 1988 from the Punjab University. Now the Department offers M. Phil. & Ph. D programmes on regular basis along with the Postgraduate programme. Apart from conventional areas it is giving special emphasis on the studies related to border trade, British-tribe relations, East and South East Asian Studies, North East India, Religious History, Women Studies, Buddhist Studies, Traditional Institutions and Oral Traditions. The Department also runs an International Centre for Gandhian and Peace Studies for the promotion of Gandhian values and ideas.

About the Centre for Youth Development and Leadership Studies (CYDLS)

Centre for Youth Development and Leadership Studies (CYDLS) has been established through the vide notification no. AC-108/2007(Vol-II)/397 dated 11 July, 2017 at the Rajiv Gandhi University (A Central University), Rono Hills, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh. It aims to address the issues and challenges, building capacities with a special emphasis on utilizing the energy of youth in the North East Region of India especially in the state of Arunachal Pradesh. Since its inception CYDLS is continuously working towards the betterment of youth through a host of extension activities, skill and capacity development programs, trainings, workshops, seminars, conferences, and instituting awards and scholarships to motivate the youth.

The vision of the CYDLS is to groom youth as potential leaders and contribute to sustainable development. The centre's mission is to create a platform for progressive engagement and empowerment of youth through professional training and guidance. Also, for nourishing leadership traits among youth through innovation, research, and skills development, the CYDLS has set following specific objectives as well:

- To promote psycho-social well-being of youth;
- To develop leadership qualities among the youth and orient them towards community building;
- To involve youth in community development by way of aligning them with developmental programmes; and
- To embark on training and research on youth development and leadership.

In order to operationalise the vision and mission of CYDLS, three specific Cells are working to achieve the objectives of centre:

- Counselling Resource Cell (CRC): CRC is working with the motto of offering "a hand to hold and a heart to understand" the helping youth, suffering from mental illness or symptoms of it both minor and/or severe. CRC shall provide immediate and long-term counseling services to the needy youth on weekly basis.
- Youth and Community Engagement Cell (YCEC): YCEC shall engage youth in community development through participatory approach. Under this cell youth involve themselves in the implementation of several government and non-governmental programs.
- Training and Leadership Research Cell (TLRC): TLRC is committed to augmentation of the capacity and leadership skills of youth by organizing need-based programs vis-à-vis workshops, training, symposium, capacity building programs, seminars, and research etc.

About the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth development (RGNIYD), NER Regional Centre, RGU Campus, Arunachal Pradesh

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu, is an Institution of National Importance by the Act of Parliament No. 35/2012 under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. The RGNIYD was set up in 1993 under the Societies Registration Act, XXVII of 1975. The RGNIYD functions as a vital resource centre with its multi-faceted functions of offering academic programmes at Post Graduate level encompassing various dimensions of youth development, engaging in seminal research in the vital areas of youth development and coordinating Training Programmes for state agencies and the officials of youth organisation, besides the Extension and Outreach initiatives across the country.

The Institute functions as a think-tank of the Ministry and premier organization of youth-related activities in the country. As the apex institute at the national level, it works in close cooperation with the NSS, NYKS and other youth organizations in the implementation of training programmes. The Institute is a nodal agency for training youth as a facilitator of youth development activities in rural, urban as also tribal areas.

The RGNIYD serves as a youth observatory and depositary in the country thereby embarking on youth surveillance on youth-related issues. It has a wide network with various organizations working for the welfare and development of young people and serves as a mentor.

RGNIYD has established its NER Regional Centre at Rajiv Gandhi University Campus, Arunachal Pradesh. Presently, the NER Regional Centre is being headed by Dr. Kottu Sekhar as a Coordinator.





RGU observes Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary

October 2, 2021

RONO HILLS, Oct 01: Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) Vice Chancellor (VC) Saket Kushwaha on Friday said that in order to understand Mahatma Gandhi, people have to look into themselves.

The VC was addressing a function organized to observe the 152nd birth anniversary of Father of the Nation, Kushwaha urged the participants to read historical documents and also books like 'Gulamgiri' in order to grasp the underlying ideas of social phenomena.

The VC reminded the gathering that October 2 is also the 117th birth anniversary of the former Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri who was an epitome of simple living and austerity.

He was also the architect of Green Revolution; the VC said and maintained that Gandhi is relevant for all times and all contexts.

The event was organised by the International Centre for Gandhian and Peace Studies, RGU, Centre for Youth development and Leadership Studies, RGU and Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, a communiqué informed here.

The programme for observance of Gandhi Jayanti on Saturday has been conceptualised under three-fold sub-themes – Remembering Mahatma Gandhi through colours and drawings by organizing painting competitions among youth, reimagining Gandhi through lectures and celebration of Gandhian ideas through spinning of charkhas.

The entire thrust of the programme is expected to generate a profound impact on the generations – present and future, who need to reinvent, reimagine and relive with the Gandhian ideas, precepts and doctrines in order to make our nation-state move from strength to strength, the communiqué added.

Coordinator of International Centre for Gandhian and Peace Studies Prof S N Singh in his introductory remarks, delineated the objective of the event and the need for revisiting and re-inventing the Father of the Nation.

Drawing on the statements and tributes paid to Gandhi by eminent personalities, Prof Singh quoted from Gandhi's autobiography.

Dr K P Singh, Chairman of Centre for Youth Development and Leadership Studies was the moderator of the programme. Dr Kottu Sekhar, Coordinator of the RGNIYD NER Centre listed out the subjects/topics with which Gandhi engaged himself.

Dr GVV Prasad, Director, Gandhi King Foundation, Hyderabad said that there is a need to emphasize on the Gandhian values of simplicity and humility. He revealed that Gandhi was not totally happy with the way the transfer of power was executed. His dreams to empower the poor have remained unfulfilled even till date.

RGU Pro Vice Chancellor, Registrar, Deans, Professors and students shared their views on Mahatma Gandhi, the communiqué added.
