Concept Note

The states of the Northeast region of India have often been clubbed together due to a shared history. This region has been mired in political turbulence in the past, and insider/outsider debates have been a part of the deliberations on the region. This has been reflected in the literature from the Northeast and can be observed in the works of writers such as Temsula Ao, Arupa Patangia Kalita, and more recently, Aruni Kashyap, Jahnavi Barua, and Yumlam Tana to name a few. Margaret Ch. Zama observes in this context, "that emerging literatures from the Northeast region, having undergone historical and political trauma of untold suffering and marginalization, registers various voices that need to be understood in the context of India's multicultural mosaic," (Sage, 2013).Similarly, a due reliance on folklore and tradition can be witnessed in the writings of authors such as Mamang Dai and Easterine Kire.

However, with increased accessibility to publishing in the region, a burgeoning of new literature can be observed. These new works have been characterised by the heterogeneity of themes and contents, and have gently facilitated a move away from much of the earlier musings on folklore, tradition, and political conflict to a certain extent. This shift has also been observed in the critical deliberations on the region exhorted by varied paradigms of critical analysis. With modernisation and increased urbanization of the region, migration has emerged as one of the major factors in altering the regional dynamics in terms of its linguistic composition and cultural affinities. This is well-reflected in the literature being written in the contemporary times, especially in the English language. Hence, it is noted that several new paradigms and practices have emanated and evolved in the recent past in Northeast, and these have been well documented and reflected in the literary and cultural outputs from the region.

This conference, while acknowledging the due significance of earlier literary discourse from the region, is an attempt to recognise the multiplicity of the emerging literatures, languages, and cultural practices of the place so that more comprehensive deliberations on the changing spatio-political, cultural, linguistic, and demographic aspects are brought to the fore.
