PART 1: PREFACE

1.1 The University

Rajiv Gandhi University (formerly Arunachal University) is the premier institution for higher education in the state of Arunachal Pradesh located at the picturesque tabloid of Rono Hills approximately 25 km away from the state capital Itanagar. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, the then Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation stone of the University on 4th February 1984 at Rono Hills. Ever since its inception, the University has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfill the objectives as envisaged in the University Act. The University was recognized as a Central University in the year 2007 established under the Act of Parliament. Being the only Central University of the State at present there are Twenty Six (26) Departments and Two (02) Institutes functioning under Nine (09) Academic Faculties. The Faculty members have been actively engaged in research activities. The University has been maintaining its academic excellence and individuals from its alumni group are contributing at significant positions not only in State and Central Government Services, but also in various Institutions, Industries and Organizations. The University has continuously maintained its premier status among top hundred (100) educational institutions in NIRF ranking across India.

About the Department of Psychology

The Department of Psychology was established in the year 2017 with two Assistant Professors. Currently the Department is running with two Assistant Professors and 3 Guest Assistant Professors.

Vision: The Department was set up to develop an awareness of the importance of studying human behaviour and the societal relevance of psychology. The Department offers M.A. Psychology which is of four semesters and the curriculum is so designed as to provide strong theoretical, methodological and contemporary knowledge of various areas of Psychology to the students. The purpose is to equip the students with knowledge, skills and values to become effective and competent professional psychologists. During the course, the students are taken for field visit at mental health centres and counselling cells besides interactive classroom teaching and laboratory training. Time to time extended lectures from experts in relevant field is also conducted. This academic training enables the students to work in a

broad range of settings such as medical, organization, counselling centres, NGOs, researchers and academicians.

About Psychosocial Support Group, Arunachal Pradesh

The Psychosocial Framework of 2005–2007 of the International Federation defines psychosocial support as "a process of facilitating resilience within individuals, families and communities by respecting the independence, dignity and coping mechanisms of individuals and communities. Psychosocial support promotes the restoration of social cohesion and infrastructure."

The lockdown to contain the spread of Covid-19 infection made an impact on the population of Arunachal Pradesh as well, giving rise to various mental health problems amongst the people. Given the already non-existing condition of Psychological wellbeing and the awareness revolving around it, a group of Psychologists from Arunachal Pradesh came together and initiated the tele counseling services on 14th May, 2020 to cater to the needs of the people of the state. The prime objective of the group is to promote mental health awareness and wellbeing amongst the tribal community and address issues like mental health related stigma and illegal health practices. Currently it is engaged in providing voluntary services like tele-counseling and assistance in terms of Psycho-education, provision of Covid-19 related information and important mental health helpline numbers to the people of the state. Mental health professionals, Psychiatrist Dr. T. Kena and Clinical Psychologist Miss Yeni Nabam are also associated with the group, who take over any serious cases encountered in the tele-counseling process. The group at present, is functioning under the aegis of the All Arunachal Pradesh Psychological Association, which is currently in the process of being formally established.

It has till date been actively engaged in various awareness related activities with reputable local news channels namely:

- Gyoloo News on Mental Health Awareness.
- Arunachal Revolutionary News on the importance of Psychology as a subject and Mental Health, related stigma and overall wellbeing.
- Collaborated on a video project with Information and Public Relations Department, Capital Complex to shed some light on Stigma and discrimination associated to COVID-19.

Participated on a Live Panel discussion with Arunachal Mirror on Mental Health with specific regard to Suicide and De-addiction along with renowned neuro-psychiatrist cum de-addiction expert Dr. Pakha Tesia.

The group has also independently produced awareness videos on mental health topics in general and on Suicide prevention with renowned personalities: Mrs. Jarjum Ete (Social Activist and Politician), Dr. T. Kena (Psychiatrist) and social influencers like Lenzing Doming, Chum Darang, Karka Yomcha Ete, and Teli Menia and also organized a Live webinar on "Suicide Prevention during Covid-19 Pandemic" with notable resource persons from across the country.

The group has expanded and is at present providing free tele counseling services for 16+ hours every day.

1.2 Sponsoring Agency

1.3 Background

Youth is the backbone of any nation. According to the United Nations report released in 2014, there are 1.8 billion young people in the world between the ages of 10 and 24 wherein India tops the list with 356 million young people as the country of world's largest youth population. As per India's census 2011, Youth (15-24 years) in India constitutes one-fifth (19.1%) of India's total population. It is a universally acknowledged fact that the youth plays a great role in nation building which is why it becomes necessary to cater to their needs in order to witness able workforce, keeping in mind the psychological elements of the reality.

Career counselling is the process of understanding and assessing another individual's concerns, strengths, interests, and capabilities, in order to guide them towards the right career path. The process guides a candidate in understanding and pursuing the right career options as per their interests. Due to the geographical drawbacks and the lack of information with regard to academia, job scope and placements, there is limited resources and opportunities available in Arunachal Pradesh, to provide one with a proper channel of guidance regarding career options. More so, for the field of Psychology, which is a relatively new subject in the state as well as the country, the understanding of the subject is at its nascent stage. The sole central University of the state - Rajiv Gandhi University, has already two batches of post

graduates in the subject, but there still remains a dearth of adequate direction to guide these young, bright minds in the right direction, so as to ensure maximum utilisation of their potential. Against this backdrop, it is imperative that initiatives like the conduction of a webinar on the aforementioned domain, be carried out to facilitate the process of acquainting the young minds on the subject.

The Covid-19 pandemic is an epidemiological and psychological crisis. The uncertainty revolving around is not only limited to the virus but is heightened especially for the students when the education around the world is in a loop with the future of many students hanging in balance. With the lack of a cohesive framework to train the students for the job and education related tasks they face next, it is of utmost significance to, at the minimum, address any doubts regarding career prospects to aid in positioning their interests, aptitude with the reality in an affirmative manner. It will help in developing insight, allow an access to expert knowledge, bring clarity in choosing the right career path and ultimately boost confidence grooming them for a post-Covid world.

- ❖ To acquire a cognizance of the perception and the interest level of the field of Psychology amongst the students of Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ To acquaint the participants with the subject and highlight the benefits of selecting it as their course.

- ❖ To highlight potential job prospects in various fields of Psychology outside the state and encourage job emigration.

PART 2: SESSION WISE DELIBERATION

2.1 Inaugural Session:

The inaugural session on the first day was graced by honourable Vice chancellor of RGU Prof. Saket Kuswaha, Pro-VC Prof. Amitava Mitra and RegistarProf. Tomo Riba in-absentia through a recorded video message and Dr. Kakali Goswami, Head (In-charge) Psychology and Webinar Co-ordinator.

Honourable Vice Chancellor Prof. Saket Kushwaha, emphasised on maintaining dynamism instead of being stagnant at a particular point in life. He also expressed his ideals on inclusivity in lieu with one pertaining to Hon. PM Narendra Modi wherein he underlined the speciality in the uniqueness of each individual, in the same way as the former intends on the principle of inclusivity for all in the campus of RGU irrespective of students, teaching and non-teaching staffs. Lastly he concluded his note on a positive note reminding the participants to overcome each challenges turning them into beautiful possibilities in life.

Pro Vice Chancellor Prof Amitava Mitra stated that career counselling is the process of understanding and assessing another individual's strength, concerns, interest and capabilities needed to guide toward one's right path. Defining Psychology he highlighted various approaches of the subject stating that

psychology is the study of mind and behaviour and involves science as well as social sciences and has application in all walks of life, work, family, relationships, sports and industries and emphasized on

the importance of mental health practitioners as one of the career prospects in psychology.

Registrar Prof Tomo Riba expressed how with the increase in mental health crisis the society is facing

esp. during the covid-19 pandemic the role of psychologist becomes need of the hour as they play

crucial role in the promotion of healthy behaviour and improving quality of life for those who are

suffering from mental illness.

The welcome address was delivered by Kakali Goswami, Co-ordinator of the Webinar and Head (in-

charge) Psychology, RGU. She welcomed the dignitaries and expressed her warm, solicited greetings

to the participants for fruitful deliberation and interaction on the topic.

Miss Leeyir Ete, the Co-coordinator of the program and Master of Ceremony, proposed the Vote of

thanks expressing her gratitude on behalf of the entire organizing committee towards the esteemed

2.3 Technical Sessions:

Day 1 (18th August, 2020): 1st Technical Session:

The first technical session of the day was delivered by Ms. Aakanksha Bhatia, Career Counsellor and

visiting Faculty at Aditi Mahavidyalaya, New Delhi, on the topic 'Career Pathways in Psychology'. In

her deliberation she extensively highlighted all the possible career prospects, the required

qualifications one needs along with the best institutions providing the aforementioned courses in India

as well as abroad given the much needed clarity to the students on the various courses available in

Psychology.

Day 1 (18th August, 2020): 2nd Technical Session:

The second technical session was delivered by Ms. Vibha Deshpande, Counselling Psychologist and

Founder- Director at Tailwinds Organization Pune, Maharashtra presented on the topic 'Developing

career as a Counselling psychologist/Psychotherapist'. Apart from the content delivery on the given

topic, she even elaborated on the significance of telecounseling and its effectiveness in the ongoing

crisis situation caused by the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Day 2 (19th August, 2020): 1st Technical Session:

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The Day 2 of the Two Day National Webinar kickstarted with the 3rd Technical session on Career Perspective in Psychology: "A Journey Worth Travelling in Clinical Psychology, which was handled by Dr. Madhumita Bhattacharya, Clinical Psychologist, CIP Ranchi. She elaborated on the core concepts of Clinical Psychology and its scope and particular lessons learnt from therapy. Her indepthexplaination via personal experience helped the students in understanding the wide scope of the sub-field with better clarity of it amidst the many quacks practising.

Day 2 (19th August, 2020): 2nd Technical Session:

The 2nd Technical Session of the 2nd day was delivered by Ms. Shruti Chhabra, Organisation Psychologist & HR Consultant, Saina Human Capital Advisory Services, New Delhi on the topic 'Scope of Organisational Psychology in India'. She not only spoke of the institutes providing courses and the different roles of Organisation Psychologist. She even shared her key insights noted as an intern alongwith some specific skills and competencies desired by recruiters with the ethics to be propagated being true to oneself throughout. The importance of internships, tie-ups, placements, networking and the power of branding.

Day 2 (19th August, 2020): 3rd Technical Session:

The last technical session was delivered by Ms. Mridu Sharma, Sport Psychologist, KPMG, Netherlands on the topic 'Sport Psychology: Comprehensive Evidence Based Performance Consulting'. She deliberated on the significance of mental health and Sport Psychology as a sub-field as quoted many a times by various notable Sports persons which proved beneficial in performing and winning, in addition to enlightening students with the scope in India and abroad.

2.4 Valedictory Session:

The valedictory session was witnessed by 100 delegates, resource persons and esteemed dignitaries and was hosted by Miss Leeyir Ete, Co-convenor of the webinar, who acted as the master of the ceremony. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Kakali Goswami, Head (in charge) Department of Psychology, RGU. Miss Yuma Narah, Co-convenor of the programme provided a brief report of the webinar of the technical sessions that took place over the two-day span. A brief experience sharing session from participants hailing from various corners of the country was also held, where in they highlighted and commended the relevance and importance of discussing about the various subfields of Psychology. RGU Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof Amitava Mitra, in his address, emphasized on the need of the university students to have required skills and qualifications to meet the increasing need of the people of the state with limited availability of mental health professionals. RGU Registrar Prof Tomo Riba spoke on the detrimental affairs of mental health in the state which he said has multiplied in the current times due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Raising concerns over the silent sufferers of the state, he suggested more awareness, education and counselling. During the vote

of Thanks, Coordinator of the webinar, Toko Rika thanked the Rajiv Gandhi University and department of Psychology for their support and constant motivation. He said the Psychosocial Support Group, Arunachal Pradesh has taken the responsibility to take psychology forward and volunteer to provide social service in the context of mental health and propagate the importance of mental health.

Major Takeaways:

3.1. Academic context:

In the present time caused by the global pandemic, with social distancing measures being cautioned by all, it is of utmost importance to maintain continuity in all other aspects especially with regard to academics in order to rule out the same reaching a standstill. In addition to which, there exists a large number of unemployed youth, especially in a state like Arunachal Pradesh wherein job openings are at its bare minimum and where maximum people still are on a lookout for Government jobs along with an absence of Private enterprises to rule out the dependence on the former. In lieu of which, the Two Day National Webinar was conducted by the Department of Psychology wherein the majority of the participants comprised from the student community.

The technical sessions designed by the resource persons in collaboration with the department were created to facilitate the overall mental health and wellbeing of the entire student community, with regard to understanding of Psychology as a discipline with its various subdisciplines in both Indian as well as global context.

The sessions were also created to accommodate the psychosocial emotional needs of all but with specific focus on the students, given the uncertainty surrounded by Covid-19, impacting the normalcy of face-to-face classes, reduction in physical-social interactions, exam induced stress and confusion regarding the future. A set of questions were generated by the organizing team to analyse the interests and awareness on Psychology amongst the participants in the Registration Form. The resource persons were selected as per the data analysis of the interests and demands of the registered participants. The doubts and concerns associated were tackled by the key subject experts via the PowerPoint presentations as well as Q&A sessions.

- (i) A solution driven aspect with the significance of a more student focused approach was highlighted.
- (ii) Indepth understanding of the scope of Psychology was disseminated, along with some desired sub-fields namely, Counselling Psychology, Sport Psychology and Clinical Psychology.

- (iii) The resource persons acknowledged the practical ways to incorporate online courses and its significance in developing a good CV, with utilization of proper time management.
- (iv) Recognize, regulate and incorporate a multidisciplinary approach in the future for all round development of students with specific regard to Psychology.
- (v) Students' positive comments and feedback reflected the understanding they gained through the Two Days course.

3.2. Research context:

Any uncertainty automatically instills fear or even phobia amongst the people and the associated uncertainty that is increasingly testing psychological resilience of the masses. The pandemic has generated a major jolt in all aspects around the globe. However, one needs to adjust to the new normal and start moving on with life.

Various competitive exams are being conducted and the educational institutions are already out with their new academic calendar to avoid wastage of an academic year of students. Hence, today, more than ever, it becomes crucial for Career professionals to solicit their support, understanding and knowledge of the subject to help aid the students in making correct career choices especially for the +2 and Pre-University students due to the additional chaos and confusion revolving around.

The webinar covered various significant contemporary issues prevailing for Psychology as a subject, the understanding of the term mental health, the dearth of professionals available to promote the subject and its sub-fields despite the boom in demand, and the huge increase in demand and career market available across the globe. The findings offered a glimpse of what is brewing in hundreds of millions of students around the world and the negative consequences of it as the career choices have a direct co-relation with life satisfaction in the long-run.

- (i) Guide researchers to plan prospective longitudinal studies for assessing the impact of career choices.
- (ii) Secondary research data on relevance and demand of the subject were discussed and the participants were also briefed.

- (iii) The relevance of taking action now in analysing one's strengths and weaknesses apart from one's interests, goals and the career prospects available in order to mitigate the indirect implications of career decision also called attention.
- (iv) The impact of the subject, and its role in providing upper hand to its students in various career domains were also made aware of.

3.3. Policy making and practice context:

It is no surprise of the insights on the long-term damage of poor career choices, which have been accepted in the field of IO Psychology and HR professionals for decades. Hence, post the end of this unprecedented lockdown, we will need all able bodies to help the world recover in all factors namely health, education, livelihood and economy and be better prepared to cater to the needs of all, especially the torchbearers. The stakeholders involved amongst which the body that constitutes the most significant role to play is the government and the policy makers, to accommodate the new normal and ease the process of adapting to the new normal for the general population. The fear due to the contraction of COVID -19 is on the rise because of the death tolls and global spread. Hence, this webinar also attempted to find the requirements and interests of Psychology amongst the youth of north-east in the absence of research, which can potentially help policy makers in formulating comprehensive interventions as a future roadmap. This webinar highlighted the need of online career counselling as the need of the hour and its implementation at the earliest.

- (i) Need for more systematic and longitudinal assessment of career needs of the population, which can help the government in formulating holistic interventions in lieu with the job scope and the demand.
- (ii) Bridge the gap between demand and supply and create a protective layer for the youth to not ward off to substances as a reliever.
- (iii) Identify trigger points and anticipating issues, and how to address them.
- (iv) Dire need for more job creation for psychology related fields, especially in the rural areas of the country and introduction of the subject in +2 and Pre university level in wide scale across all the schools and colleges of India irrespective of Private, autonomous or government.
- (v) Mandatory appointment of Psychologists and Counsellors in every schools and organizations.
